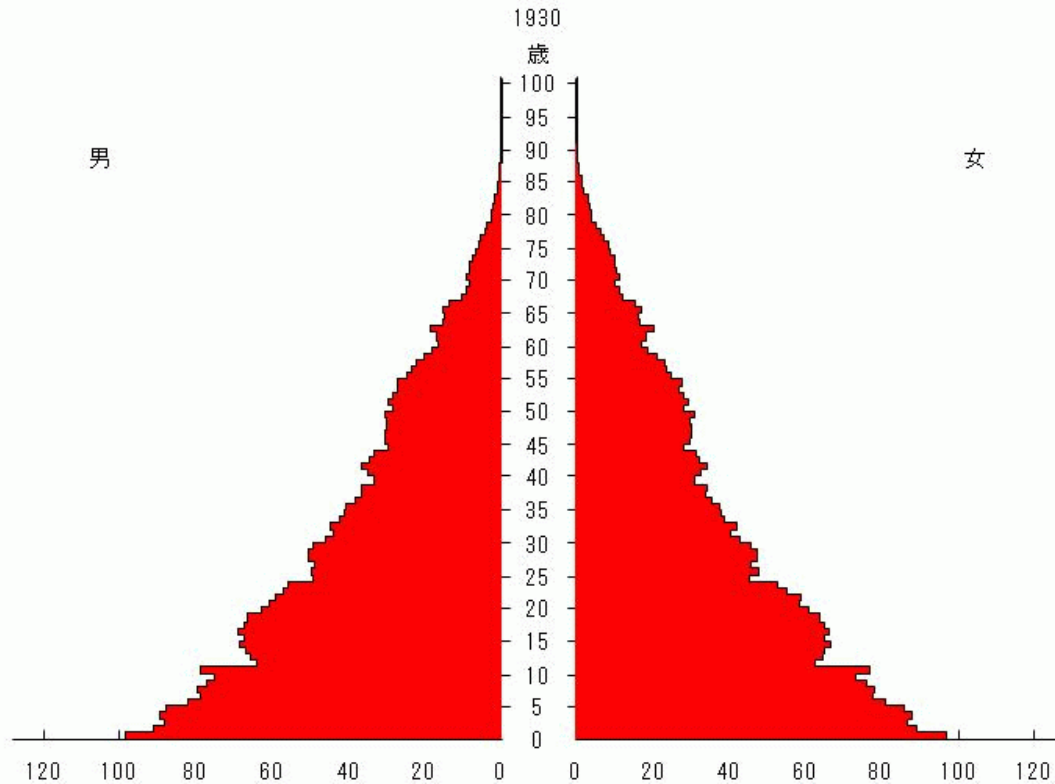

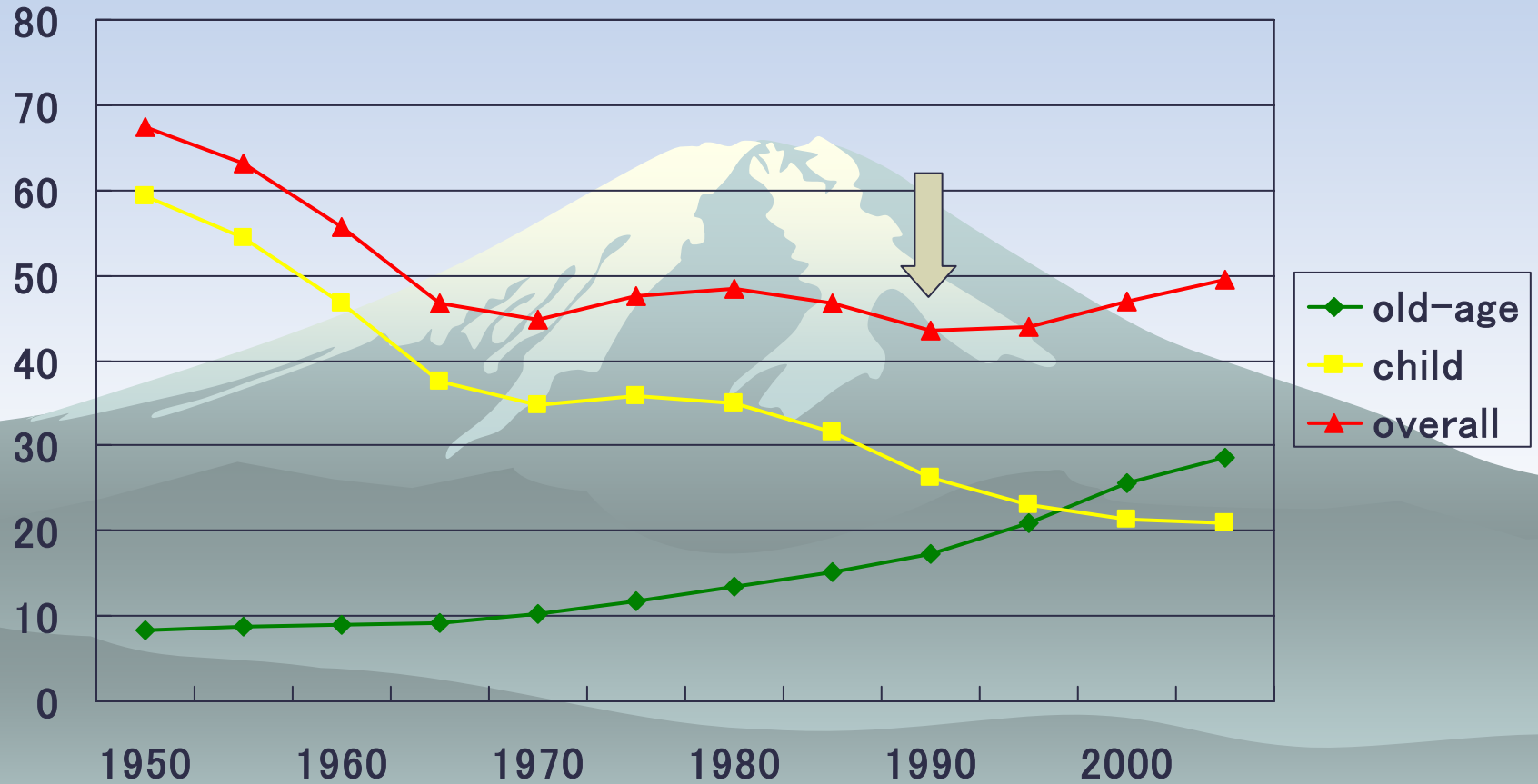

Changing Population Pyramid



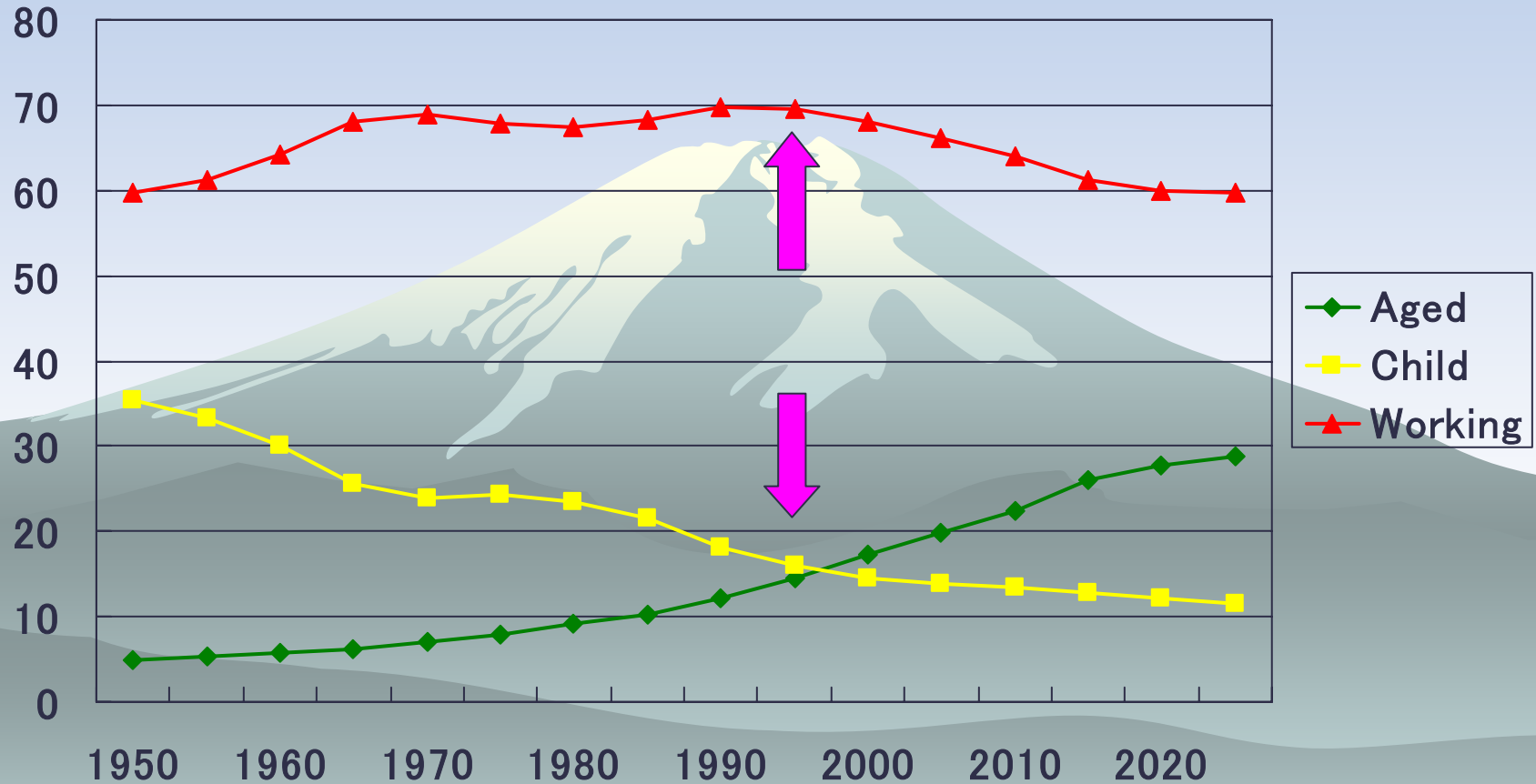
Transition of Dependency Ratio



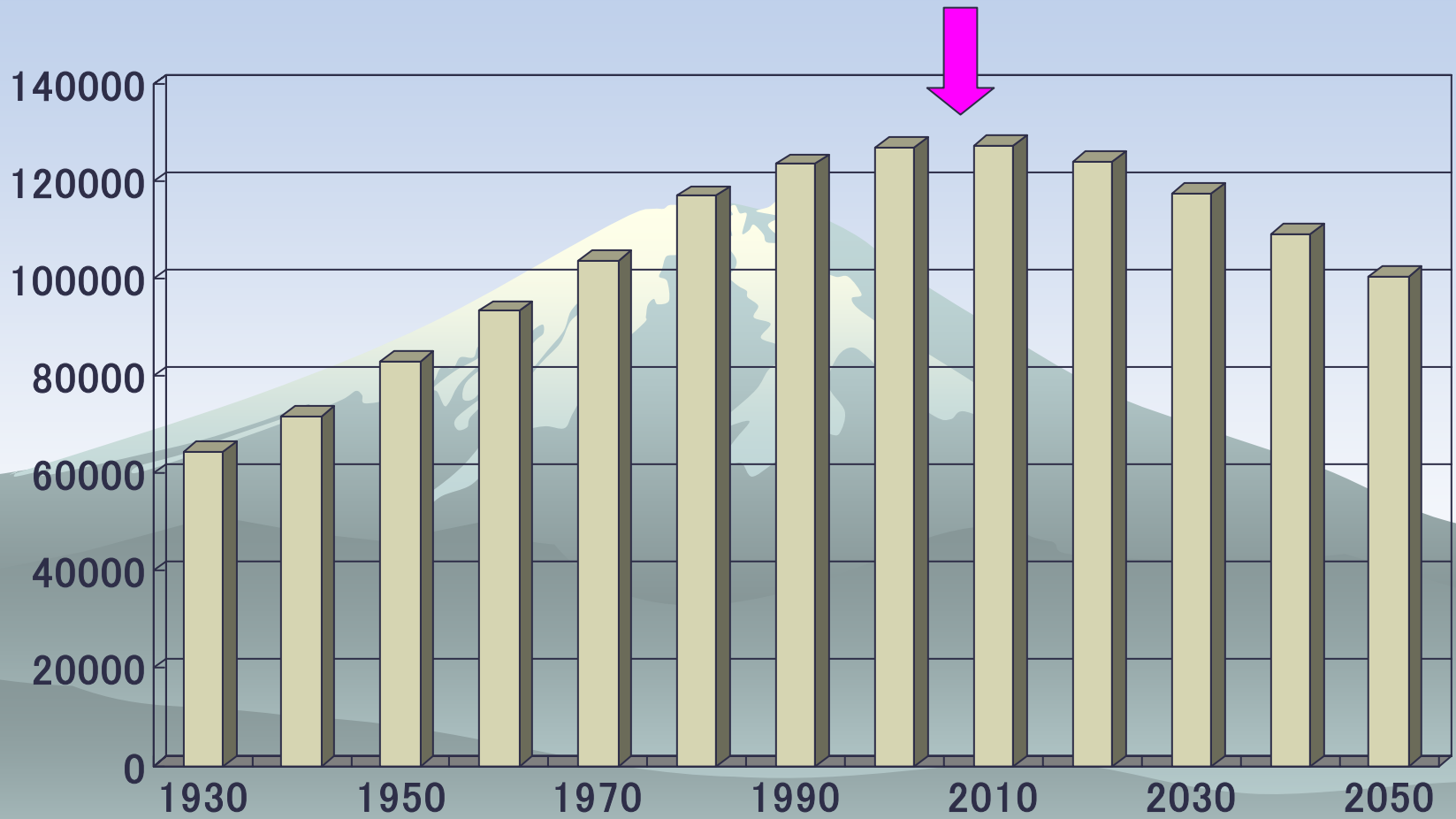
Big Turning Point

Changing Total Population

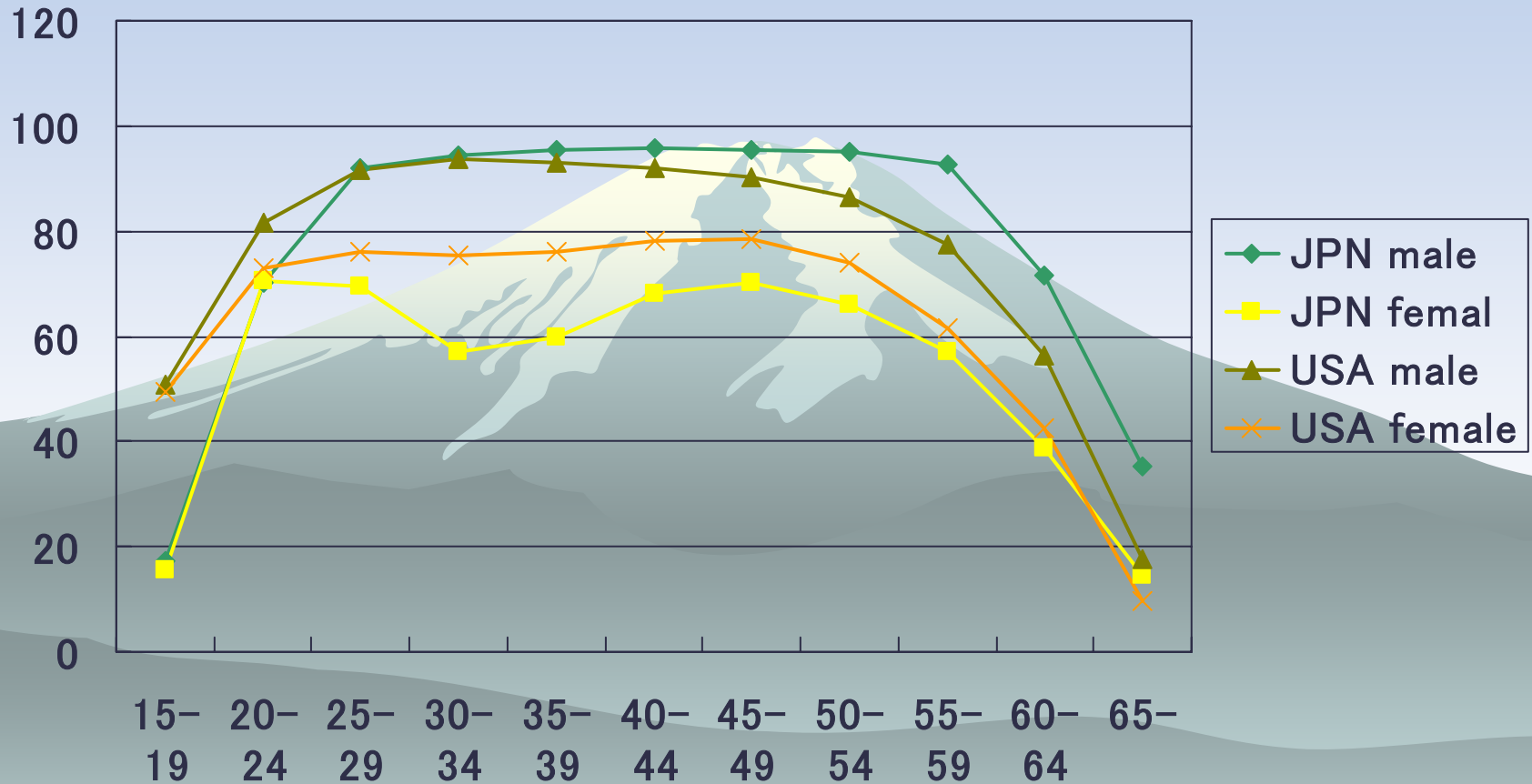

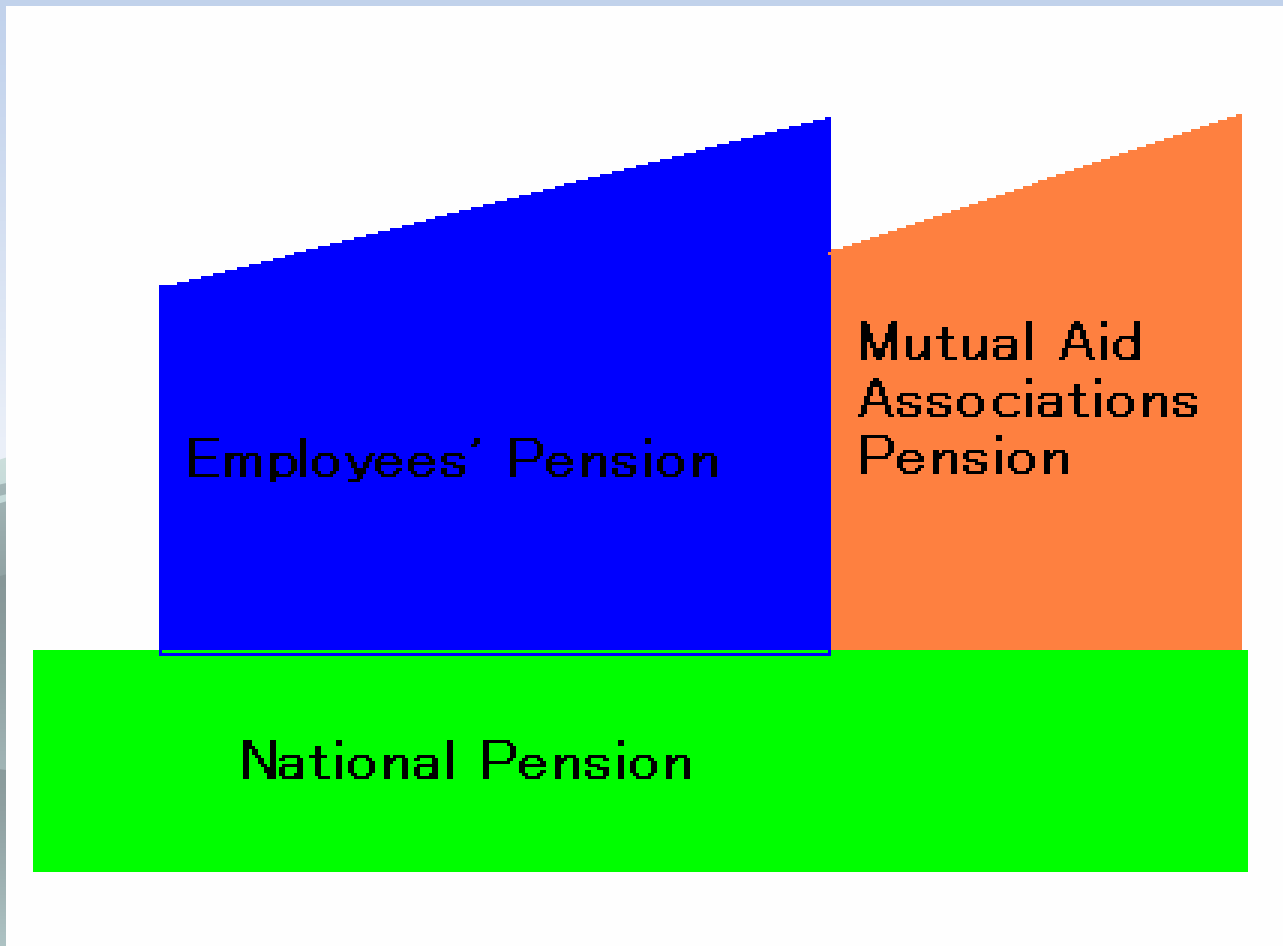

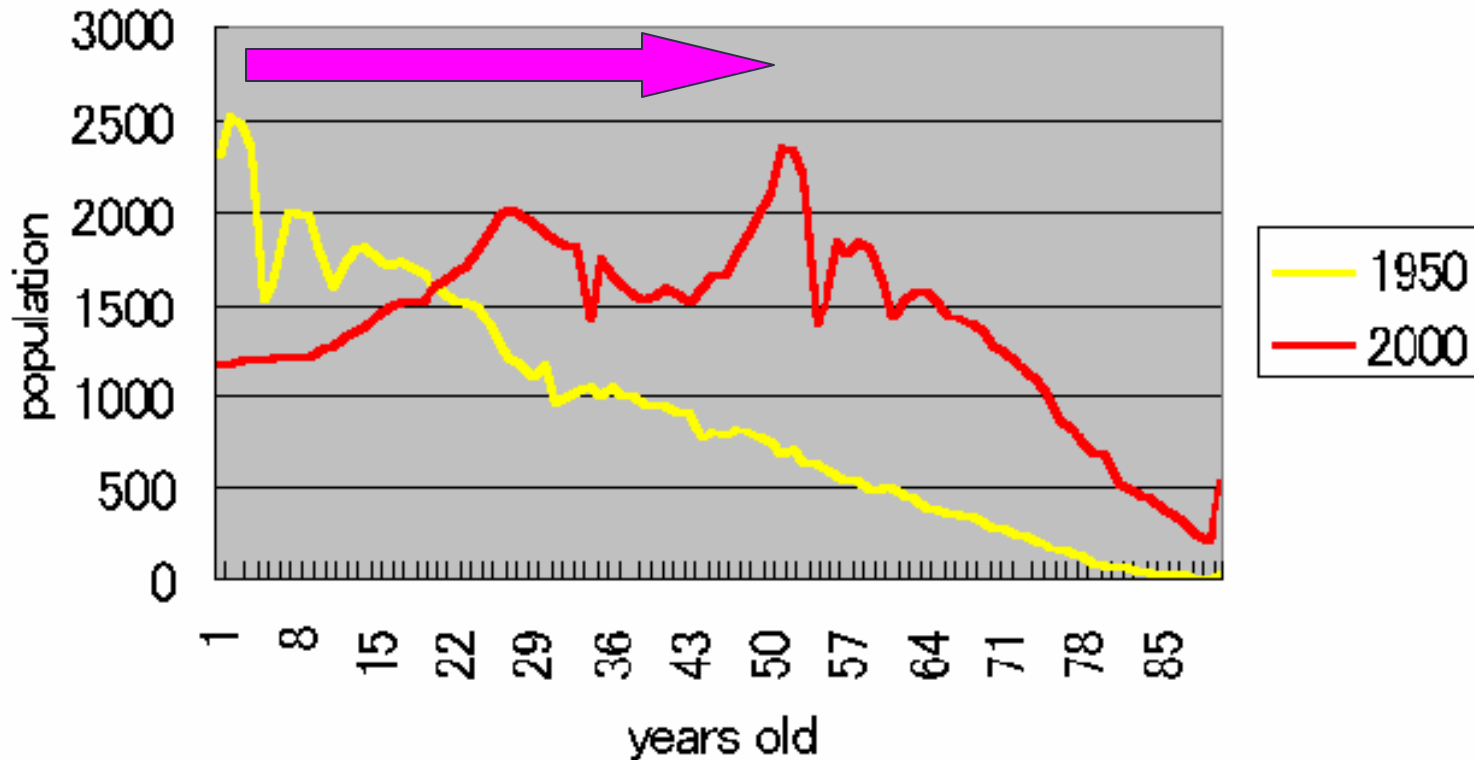

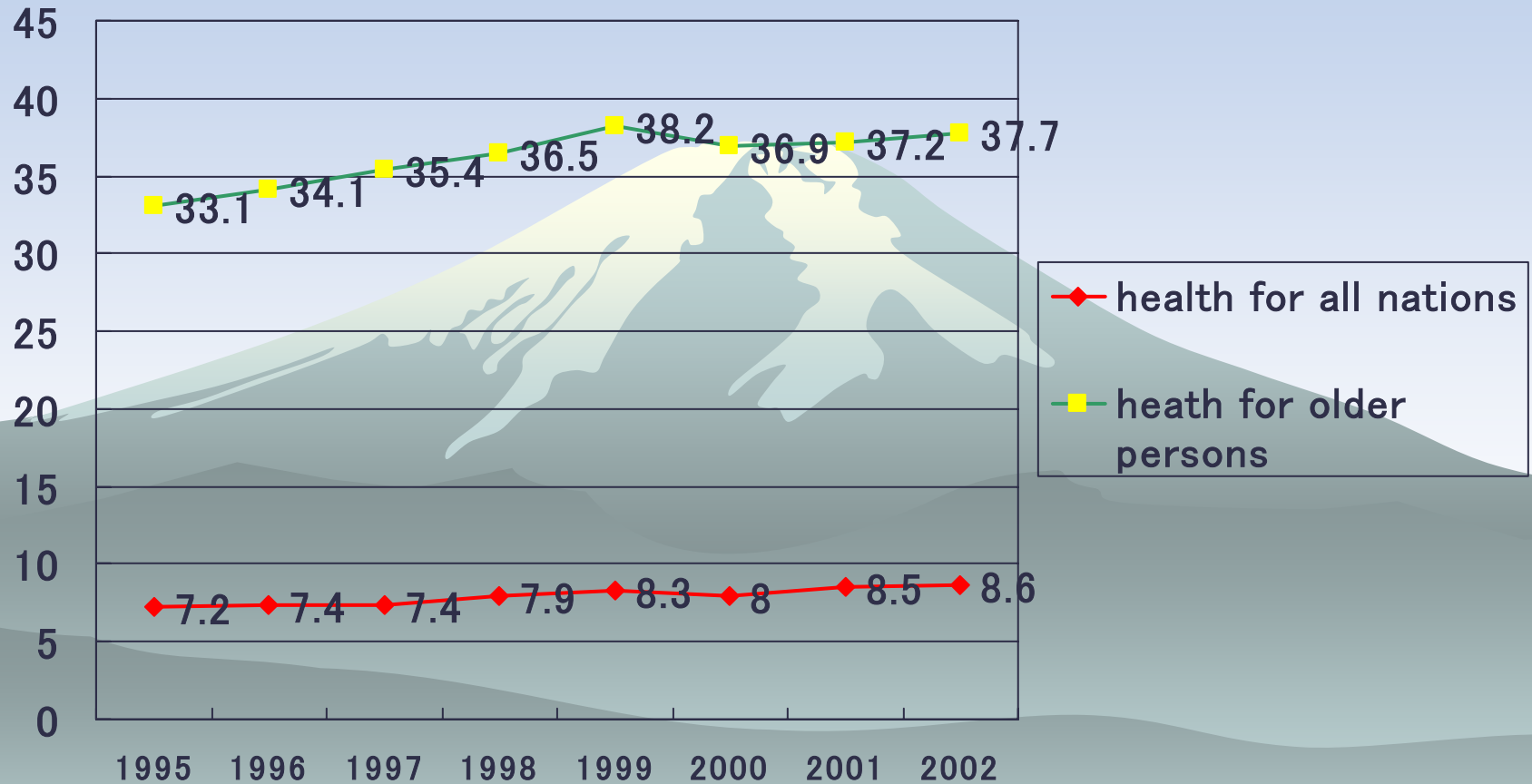
Aging of Baby-boomers

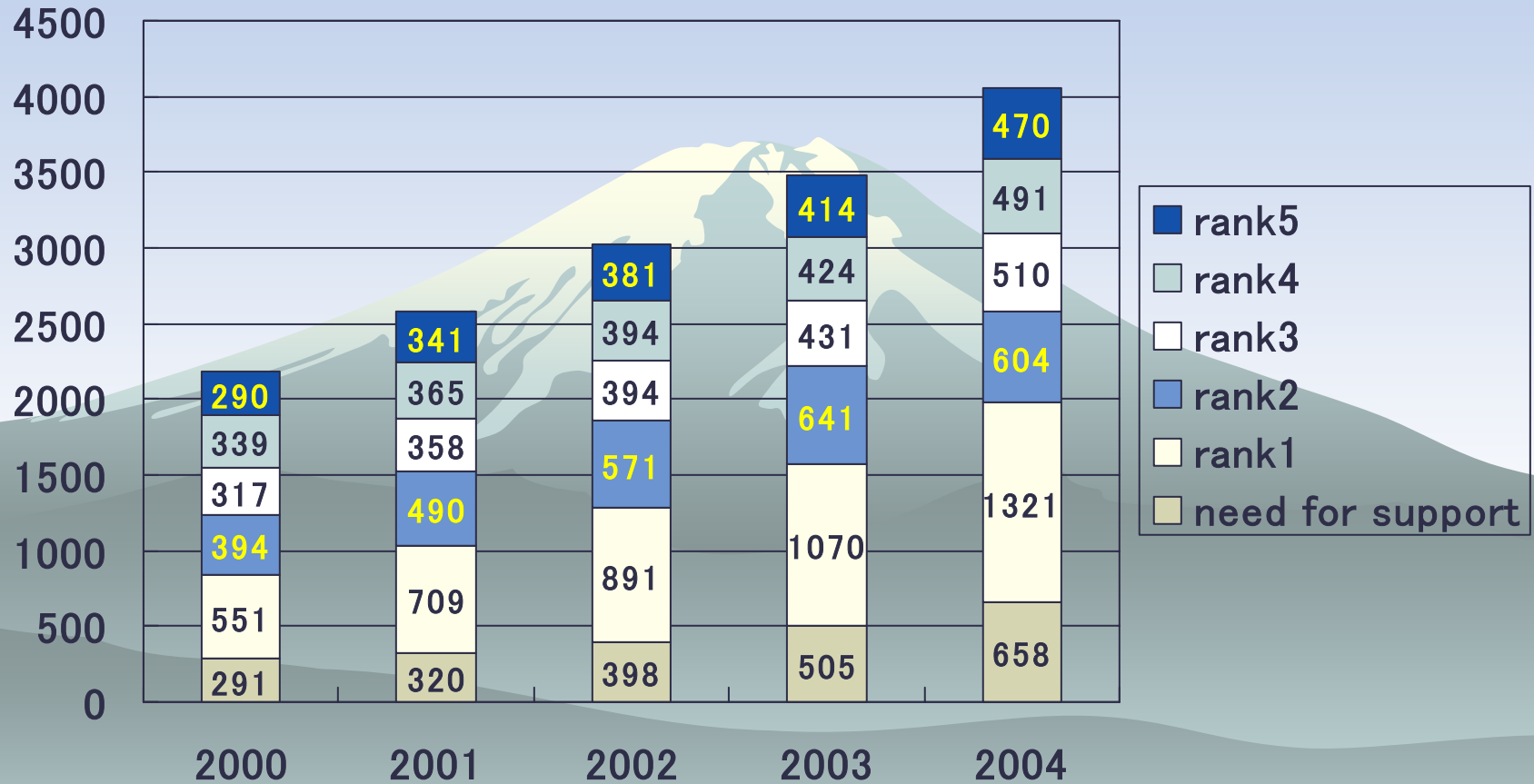

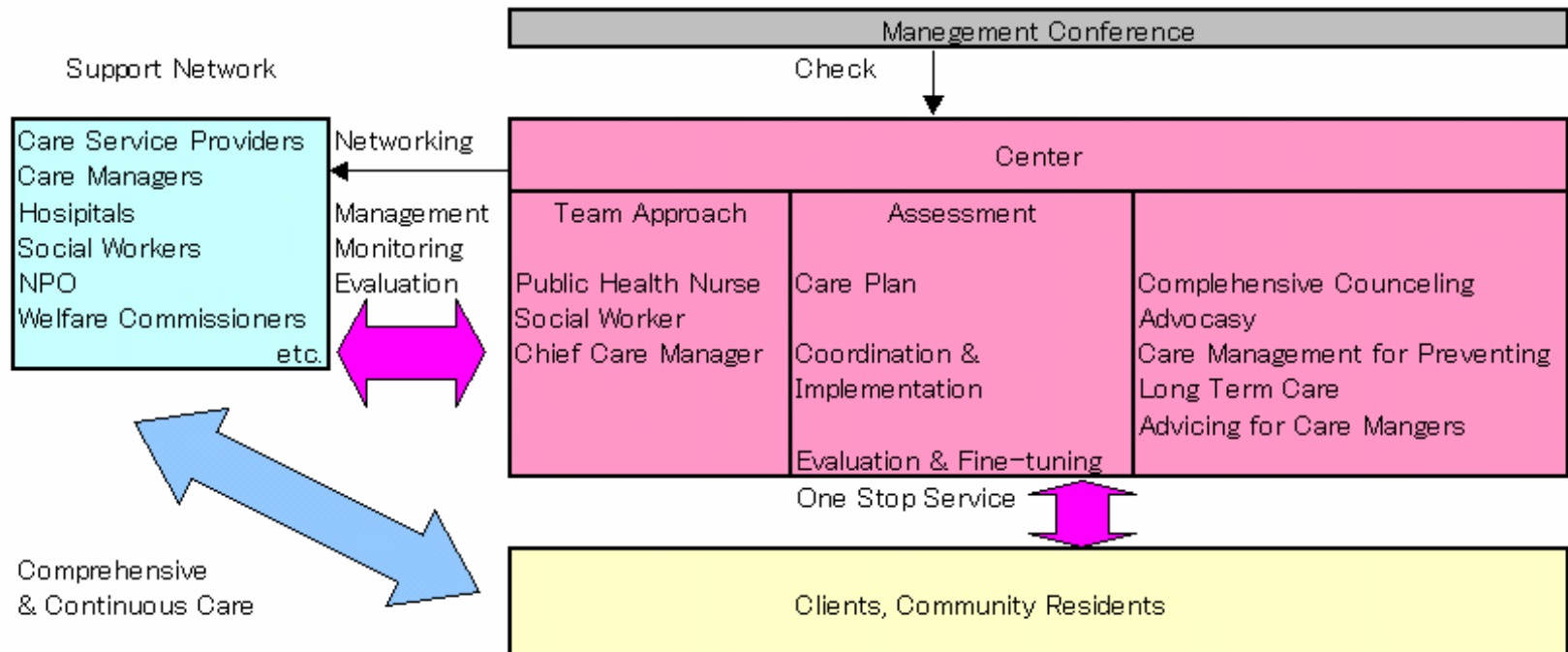
Approval of Caring Rank

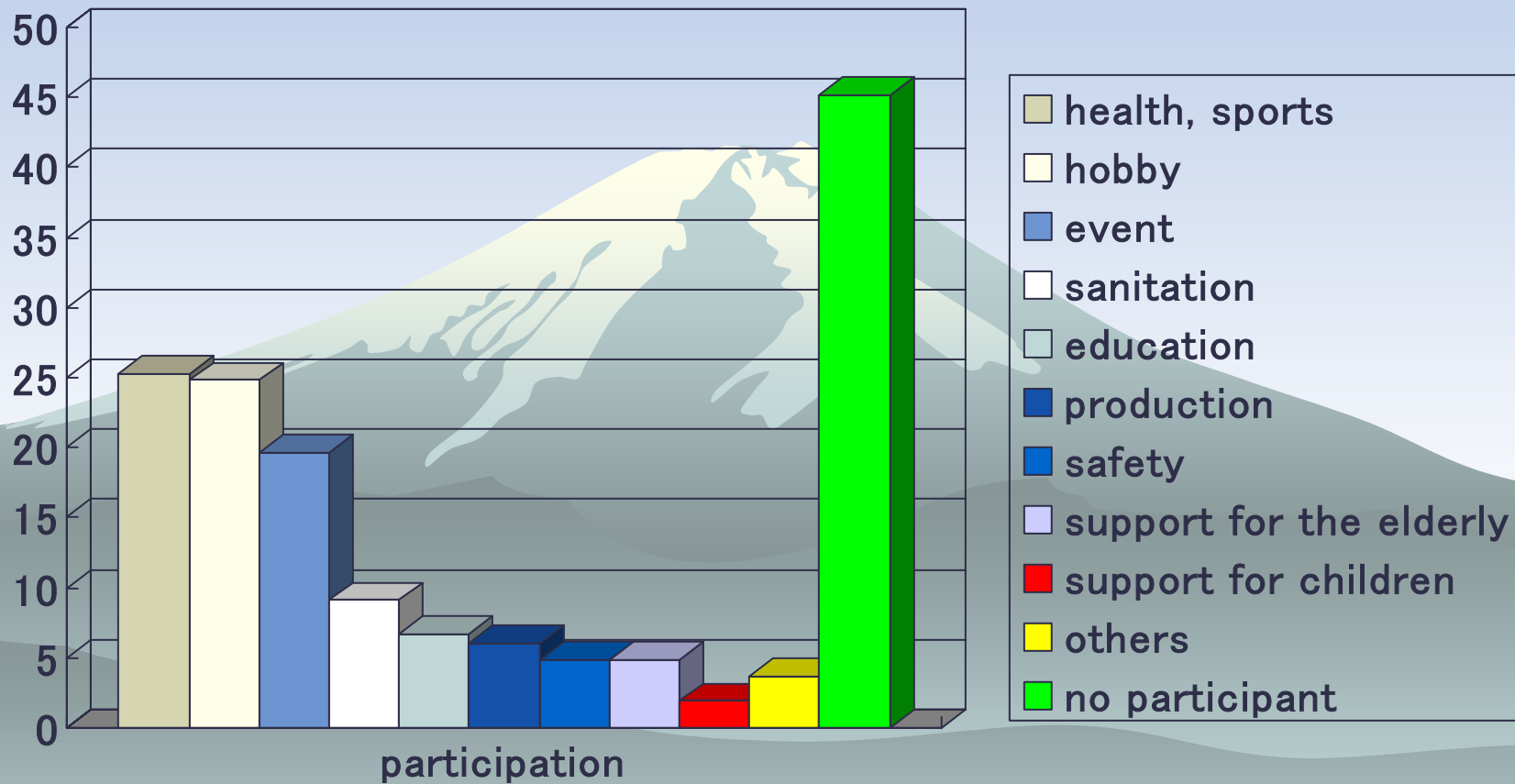

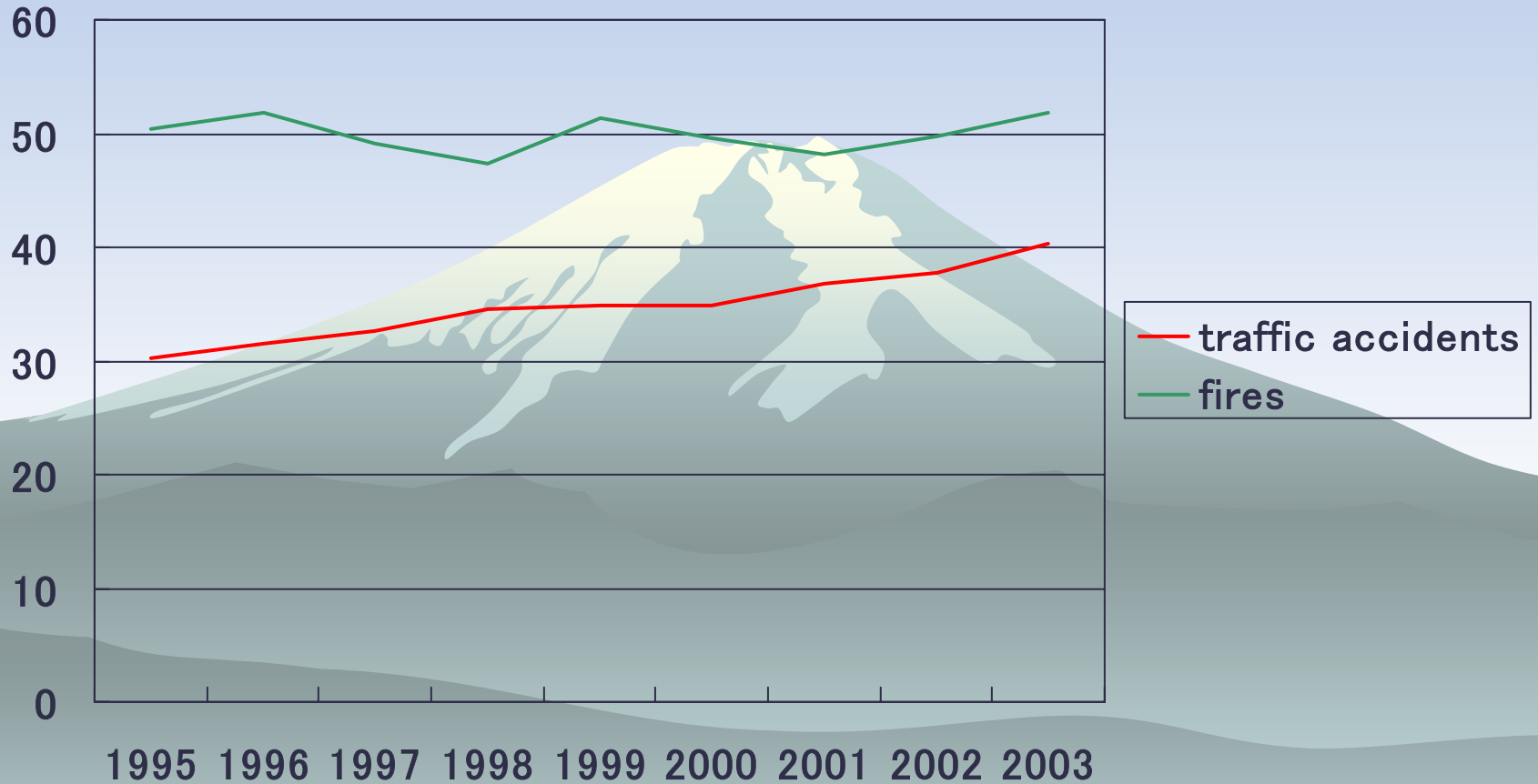

Social Participation of Older Persons

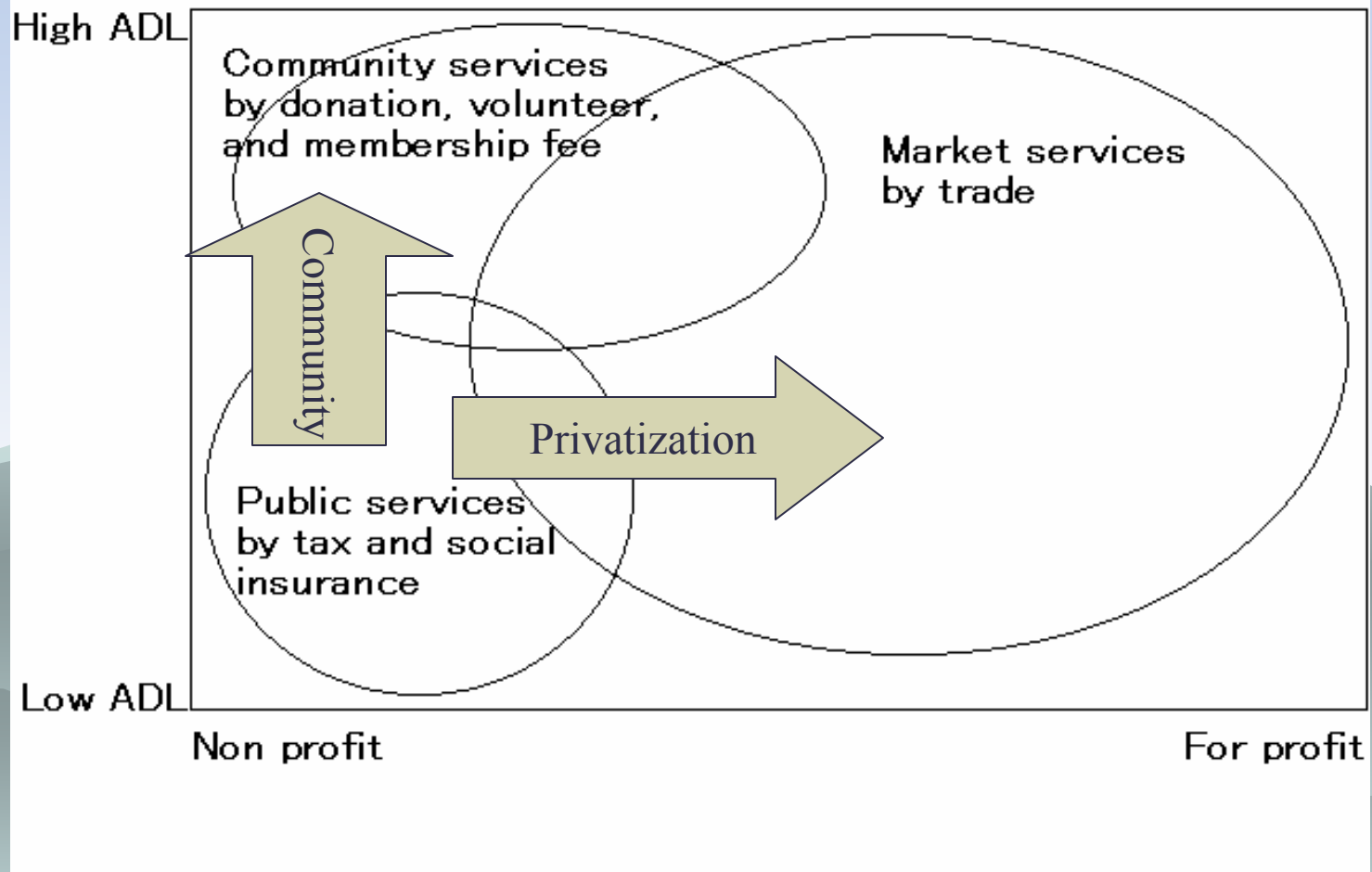


Living Environment
