ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I AT HILO FALL 2012 TO FALL 2017

INTRODUCTION

This report presents information on historical and projected headcount enrollment at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. The projections are statistical extrapolations of current trends in enrollment. They do not set enrollment targets and, in general, do not take into consideration planned or potential changes in University policies or procedures. They are based upon unduplicated headcounts of students enrolled in credit courses. Included are classified students in the College of Agriculture, the College of Business and Economics, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Pharmacy and Ka Haka Ula 'O Ke'elikolani. Unclassified students are included for all years, both historical and projected.

Historical data are included in the charts and tables to facilitate comparison and analysis. They were extracted from student enrollment, academic crossover, and course registration data files. Information on Hawai'i public high school seniors by school district was provided by the Department of Education for the State of Hawai'i. Information on Hawai'i public and private high school graduates was obtained from the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE).

METHODOLOGY

Enrollment data are broken down into three broad groups of students: classified undergraduate, classified graduate and unclassified. Classified undergraduate enrollment is sub-divided by registration status: first-time freshmen, transfer, returning and continuing. Classified graduate enrollment is sub-divided by degree objective. The projections given here may be considered mid-level forecasts. As measured over ten-years, the one-year forecast error has averaged 2.8%, while the six-year forecast error has averaged 9.1%. These error ranges, as applied to the forecast, are shown in Figure 4.

First-time freshmen enrollment is divided into five categories based upon geographic location of high school of origin. Each category is forecast separately: direct entrants from Hawai'i public high schools, direct entrants from Hawai'i private high schools, freshmen from the U.S. mainland, freshmen from foreign countries (including U.S. related areas) and other first-time freshmen. Direct entrants are students from Hawai'i public and private high schools who enter UH Hilo in the fall semester immediately following graduation from high school. This group represents the traditional core group of first-time freshmen.

The enrollment projections of **direct public entrants** are based upon the forecast of Hawai'i public high school seniors provided by the Hawai'i Department of Education (see Appendix A). This forecast was most recently updated in May 2012. Historical ratios of direct public entrants to public high school senior enrollment are calculated by school district. Enrollment for each year is projected by applying an average of this ratio (by district) to the annual DOE senior enrollment forecast.

The projection of **direct private entrants** relies upon the private high school graduate forecast for Hawai'i published by the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE), most recently updated in March 2008 (see Appendix B). Historical ratios of direct private entrants to Hawai'i private high school graduates are first calculated. An average ratio is then applied to the WICHE annual private high school graduate forecast to yield the projected number of first-time freshmen from Hawai'i private high schools.

Enrollment of first-time freshmen from the **U.S. mainland and foreign countries,** as well as **other first-time freshmen**, have been made using small annual numerical increases, based upon enrollment patterns. U.S. related areas include territorial possessions, commonwealths and republics within the Compact of Free Association. Other first-time freshmen include those who completed high school via the General Education Development (GED) examination, those who graduated from Hawai'i high schools prior to the 2010-11 school year and those with invalid data on high school.

Classified undergraduate transfer enrollment is displayed by education level only. However, the forecast model incorporates unofficial data that allows breakout by previous college. Transfers from other UH campuses have been forecast using a linear trend measured from Fall 1988 to Fall 2011. All other transfers have been set constant at the Fall 2011 level. Classified undergraduate returning enrollment has been forecast using a linear trend on the total measured from Fall 1982 to Fall 2010. Distribution across education levels for both groups has been made using the two-year average ratios.

Classified undergraduate continuing students are forecast using continuation rates. In general, a continuation rate is the ratio of continuing enrollment at a given education level to the previous fall semester's total enrollment at the next lower level. In this report, freshmen are projected using the previous year's first-time freshmen, sophomores using the previous year's total sophomores and juniors, and seniors using the previous year's total upper division (juniors plus seniors). Average continuation rates are applied to the actual or projected total enrollment by education level to forecast undergraduate continuing enrollment at the next higher level.

Classified graduate enrollment has increased rapidly in recent years, primarily due to the addition of new programs. The Doctor of Pharmacy program added 91 students in Fall 2007 and another 87 students each year from Fall 2008 to Fall 2010. The program capacity of 350 was reached in Fall 2010 and no further growth is anticipated. The addition of the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program beginning in Fall 2012 is expected to add 10 students per year through Fall 2014 to a maximum of 30 students. Moderate increases are forecast also for master, doctorate and certificate programs.

Unclassified student enrollments have held fairly steady in recent years and have been set to constants. A line item has been added to the unclassified total to show those students whose home-campus is not UH Hilo.

Table 1 presents six years of historical data and detailed forecasts by education level and registration status. Table 2 provides headcount enrollment by college / division. Student Semester Hours (SSH) offered are given in Table 3, while full-time equivalent (FTE) course enrollment served is shown in Table 4. Tables 2, 3 and 4 utilize the projected enrollments for 2012 to 2017 as input, then forecast the counts by college / division using the Fall 2011 distribution ratios across subunits. Headcount enrollment by attendance status is shown in Table 5. This table divides enrollment between full-time and part-time based upon the five-year average proportions. Appendix A shows historical and DOE projected enrollments of Hawai'i public high school seniors by geographic district. Appendix B gives WICHE forecasts of Hawai'i public and private high school graduates through academic year 2021-22.

ANALYSIS AND DISCUSSION

- Headcount enrollment at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo grew 1.5% in Fall 2011 to reach 4,139 students. Enrollment has increased seven consecutive fall semesters, growing 26% over this period.
- Enrollment is forecast to increase 1.5% in Fall 2012, to 4,200 students, and then to increase moderately through Fall 2017 at an average annual rate of 1.2%, reaching 4,451 students in Fall 2017 (Figures 1 & 2).
- After two years of decline, first-time freshmen enrollment increased in Fall 2011.
 However, overall the number in Fall 2011 was the same as in Fall 2006. Given the
 Department of Education's forecast for Big Island high school seniors (Appendix A), little
 growth in direct public entrants is anticipated. However, in the light of recent trends,
 moderate growth in first-time students from U.S. mainland, foreign and pacific island
 high schools has been forecast (Table 1 & Figure 5).

- Classified undergraduate transfer enrollment increased in Fall 2011, and has increased 30% since Fall 2008. The long-term trend is mildly upward, and the forecast calls for moderate growth through Fall 2017 (Figure 6). Part of the rationale for this growth is that recent high levels of enrollment growth at Hawai'i Community College provide a source for undergraduate transfers into UH Hilo. Transfer between the UH Community Colleges and the UH four-year campuses tends to strongly favor geographic proximity, making UH Hilo the favored destination for Hawai'i Community College transfers.
- Classified undergraduate returning enrollment dropped in Fall 2011 (Figure 7).
 Returning enrollment tends to be quite volatile, as recent enrollment illustrates.
 However, returning enrollment has been projected using a long-term trend, going back to the 1980s, that allows for very modest increases through the projected period. Part of the rationale for this increase is the on-going need for returning adults to seek additional education.
- As the largest component of the classified undergraduate headcount, the forecast of
 continuing enrollment is the most important determinant of the classified undergraduate
 enrollment forecast. The forecast is highly sensitive to the continuation rates chosen,
 which in turn are sensitive to student retention rates. The projection calls for classified
 undergraduate continuing enrollment to increase moderately at an average annual rate
 of 1.1% through Fall 2017 (Figure 8).
- Classified graduate enrollment has increased rapidly in recent years, primarily due to the addition of new programs. The Doctor of Pharmacy reached capacity in Fall 2010 and has been set constant at 353 students. Masters, Doctorate and Certificate programs are forecast to increase moderately, while the newly approved Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program will add 10 student per year beginning in Fall 2012 (Figure 9).
- The University of Hawai'i at Hilo recently broke ground on new student housing. This
 addition will expand housing options for undergraduate students and moves the campus
 forward on its strategic plan to position itself as the residential campus in the UH
 system. Scheduled completion of the project is anticipated in Fall 2014.
- In February 2012, a new MA degree in Teaching was approved by the UH Board of Regents. This degree is intended to replace the teacher education program (Certificate in Education), with current certificate students allowed to complete their degrees. The current projections do not provide an adjustment for this change, but continue to include the Certificate of Education among the certificates listed in Table 1.

Figure 1 Historical and Projected Headcount Enrollment



Headcount Enrollment Index



Historical Enrollment with Trend Line



Projected Enrollment with Error Boundaries



First-Time Freshmen



Classified Undergraduate Transfers



Classified Undergraduate Returning



Classified Undergraduate Continuing



Classified Graduate Enrollment




Figure 10 Unclassified Enrollment


