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#### APPLICATIONS PROCESSED UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I FALL 2003

This report contains information on the number of applications processed, application decisions made, and the number of accepted applicants enrolled (yield rate) for Fall semesters at each of the UH campuses.

Applications processed at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa and the University of Hawai'i at Hilo increased in Fall 2003. The 17,213 applications received at Manoa is the highest number of applications received in more than fifteen years. Hilo's 3,494 applications is slightly higher than the number received in Fall 2002.

Applications decreased in Fall 2003 at the University of Hawai'i–West O'ahu and all of the community college campuses, except Hawai'i Community College. West O'ahu saw a slight decrease in the number of applications received compared to recent years. The total number of applications received at the seven community college campuses decreased by about 2,500 compared to Fall 2002. However, the decrease in the number of fall applications at the community colleges was more a function of the change in business practices and policy mentioned below, than a real decrease. Acceptance and yield rates remain relatively stable.

Data sources used in this report have changed in recent years. Prior to Fall 2003, application data were reported using the Coordinated Admissions Program Information System (CAPIS) reports, as well as data supplied by individual campuses. In Spring 2002, CAPIS reports were discontinued and data were reported using the Student Information Management System (SIMS). As a result, data differences between Fall 2003 and prior years may be due in part to the change in reporting sources.


In addition, University of Hawai'i campuses began migrating to a new student information system (Banner) in 2002. As part of the migration, changes in policies and business practices have taken place.

One of the significant changes concerns applications at the community college campuses. Applicants who wish to attend a community college campus need only apply to one of the campuses. In addition, applicants who are accepted at the campus they applied to are allowed to attend any community college campus. Therefore, the decrease in the number of applications between Fall 2002 and Fall 2003 may be, in part, the result of the change in policy and business practices.

Another significant change is the collection of additional data and decisions. Some applications, particularly cancelled applications, may not have been tracked in legacy student information systems because of the limitations of those systems. With the migration to Banner, these limitations have been eliminated and more application data are being collected. Therefore, the total number of applications processed in Fall 2003 has increased greatly at some campuses. These increases may also affect the acceptance and yield rates.

Thus, with the changes in reporting sources and student information systems, comparing current application rates to historical ones should be done with caution.

Note: 'Percent Accepted' is a percentage of total students applied. 'Percent Entered' is a percentage of total students accepted.


