CONTINUING EDUCATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICE ENROLLMENT UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I, SPRING 2003

This report presents information on enrollment in continuing education courses offered by the University of Hawai'i. Reporting units include Outreach College of Continuing Education and Summer Sessions at UH Mānoa, Continuing Education and Community Service at UH Hilo, the Offices of Continuing Education and Training at the UH Community Colleges, and the Employment Training Center. Information is presented for each campus, with breakdown by credit and non-credit course activity. Further detail by undergraduate / graduate level is provided for credit data. Breakdown by program type is provided for non-credit data where available. Historical data by campus are shown for the period from Spring 1993 to Spring 2003. Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment calculations are provided for credit data.

REPORTING METHODOLOGY

Enrollment reporting for continuing education differs markedly from that for regular credit programs. First, while the data reported include some credit activity, the vast majority of the courses offered are non-credit. Second, courses vary in duration, from as short as a single session to as long as several months. Third, courses are offered on an on-going basis, with students enrolling throughout the reporting period. The academic semesters (Fall, Spring and Summer) used for reporting regular credit programs do not correspond necessarily to the actual periods of study for continuing education courses. Rather, the reporting periods used for continuing education have been established to facilitate timeliness of reporting. Fourth, the data are collected every semester from the individual campuses using simple course listings. There is no comprehensive student registration system for non-credit courses as there is for regular credit courses. Consequently, the depth and variety of demographic and course data available for regular credit programs do not exist on the non-credit side. Furthermore, responsibility for the accuracy of the information, as well as for making determinations as to what to report, rest largely with the individual campuses. Fifth, for non-credit courses there are generally no strict admission criteria - anyone with an interest may enroll. Sixth, hours earned in a non-credit course or sequence of courses generally do not lead to a college degree. Finally, students who enroll in more than one course at a particular campus within the same reporting period are counted for each course entered. Therefore, the non-credit numbers reported here are registration counts, not unduplicated headcounts.

NOTES ABOUT THE DATA

In addition to these differences, certain other characteristics of the data merit comment.

 In compiling historical data for Table 3, recounts and other adjustments have been made periodically where prior omissions or miscalculations have been found or to reflect changes in reporting practices. Therefore, the counts shown here may differ from those of reports issued previously.

- Unduplicated headcounts have been provided for continuing education credit programs at UH Mānoa since Spring 1993, Honolulu Community College since Spring 1995 and UH Hilo since Spring 1998. Prior to those dates registration (duplicated) counts were reported. Although unduplicated headcounts will be lower than registration counts, they are preferred and are listed in the tables whenever available. Registration counts for credit courses for the current semester are listed in the footnotes to the tables by UH unit (UH Mānoa, UH Hilo and the UH Community Colleges).
- Reporting of student credit hour data makes calculation of full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment possible for those campuses reporting credit data (Table 2). Prior to Spring 1995, student credit hour data were available for UH Mānoa only. Breakout by undergraduate / graduate has been available at UH Mānoa since Spring 1993 and at Hilo since Spring 1999.
- Beginning in Spring 1999, regular credit reporting at UH Mānoa, UH Hilo and Honolulu CC was modified to include continuing education credit students. The counts subsequently reported in the regular credit student enrollment reports are unduplicated headcounts as of the census date. The credit counts reported in this report are end-of-semester unduplicated headcounts, and may include additional students who enrolled in continuing education credit courses after the census date.
- In Spring 1996, Community Service program registration counts were added to the
 continuing education counts for UH Mānoa. The inclusion of these counts resulted
 in a large increase in the total non-credit registration count at UH Mānoa. Although
 Community Service programs have been in operation for a number of years, data
 for prior spring semesters are not available.
- UH Mānoa Public Events include a wide variety of program activities, from lectures and classes to films and concerts. While counts reported for lectures and classes are included in the tables, the counts for films and concerts, as well as performance events, are generally excluded (see footnotes to Table 4). This same criteria may be applied to the data reported for other campuses, as appropriate.
- In Spring 2001, historical data for Kapi'olani CC were adjusted to correct for systematic reporting irregularities. The numbers shown in Table 3 have been revised and may differ from those in reports issued previously.
- In Fall 2002, the reporting periods for continuing education were changed. The spring reporting period was shortened from the old period: November 1 to May 15, to the new period: January 1 to April 30. The counts shown for Spring 2003 are therefore somewhat lower than in prior years. This adjustment brings the reporting periods more in-line with those for regular credit semesters, and increases the fall semester count (fall semester counts generally receive the most attention). Note that counts for prior spring semesters have not been adjusted.

SUMMARY AND HIGHLIGHTS

Enrollment in continuing education programs for the University of Hawai'i system measured 33,590 for Spring 2003 (Table 1 & Figure 1). Registrations in non-credit courses totaled 31,663, while headcount enrollment in credit programs totaled 1,927 (credit registrations totaled 3,598). Non-credit program enrollment accounted for 94.3% of total continuing education enrollment, while credit programs accounted for 5.7%. The Spring 2003 total represents a substantial decrease from Spring 2002, but much of that decrease may be attributed to the change in reporting periods mentioned previously. The reader is advised to compare the Spring semester continuing education numbers together with those reported for Summer and Fall, and to consider the Academic Year as a whole, especially when comparing data over time.

UH Mānoa had the largest continuing education enrollment of any single campus at 15,434 (Table 4 & Figure 3). Continuing education at UH Mānoa includes credit courses administered by Outreach College, as well as non-credit courses, community service programs and public events. Credit enrollment measured 1,420 (9.2% of the total), while non-credit enrollment measured 14,014 (90.8%). Non-Credit courses accounted for 5,573 registrations (39.7% of the non-credit total), while Community Service programs accounted for 7,619 registrations (54.4%) and Public Events added another 822 registrations (5.9%).


At UH Hilo, courses are broken down by credit and non-credit (Table 5 & Figure 4). The credit headcount measured 143 students (the registration count was 259). Non-Credit enrollment measured 2,141, with courses offered in three broad program areas: Conference Center, Continuing Education and Senior programs. Conferences accounted for 978 registrations (45.7% of the non-credit total), while Continuing Education had 432 registrations (20.2%) and Senior programs had 731 registrations (34.1%).

Continuing education enrollment at the UH Community Colleges measured 15,872, with non-credit enrollment accounting for 97.7% of the total (Table 6 & Figure 4). On the non-credit side, apprenticeship courses had the highest total enrollment, accounting for 16.1% of the total continuing education enrollment (Figure 5). Credit enrollment at Honolulu CC totaled 364 for Spring 2003; the registration count was 640.

Since Spring 1993, continuing education enrollment has measured between 33,590 and 57,400 (Table 3 and Figure 1). Credit enrollment appears to have declined substantially, but much of this apparent decline is due to more exacting reporting standards, specifically the replacement of registration counts with unduplicated headcounts. Non-credit enrollment is subject to wide fluctuations in enrollment, depending upon the types of programs offered. Community Service counts at UH Mānoa have varied greatly since they were introduced in Spring 1996.

The reader is advised to exercise caution in drawing conclusions based upon the historical series. Differences in the quality of the data as well as changes in the reporting procedures allow for only a general comparison over time. Attempts to improve the reporting methods and quality of the data are ongoing.

By Credit / Non-Credit, Historical



Spring 2003



By Campus, Spring 2003



