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# ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT HILO FALL 2002 TO FALL 2008

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## INTRODUCTION

This report presents information on historical and projected headcount enrollment at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. The projections are statistical extrapolations of current trends in enrollment. They are not target enrollment projections, and in general do not take into consideration planned or potential changes in University policies or procedures. They should be considered as an extension into the future of current enrollment trends, and may be used as a foundation for further work in planning and budgeting.

The enrollment projections are based upon unduplicated headcounts of students enrolled in credit courses. Included are classified students in the College of Agriculture, the College of Arts & Sciences and Ka Haka Ula 'O Ke'elikolani, as well as unclassified students. Special students (adult special, concurrent students, and early admits) are also included for all years, both historical and projected.

Historical data are included in the figures and tables to facilitate comparison and analysis. They were extracted from the Student Enrollment Reports, the Academic Crossover Studies and the Course Registration Reports. Information on Hawai'i public high school seniors by school district is given in an appendix. Historical and projected data on public high school seniors are from the Department of Education for the State of Hawai'i.

## METHODOLOGY

The Fall 2002 projection report offers three projection series - high, middle and low. The values in the separate series were produced by varying the input values used in the model from among the range of available values. Otherwise, the model uses the same general methodology for all three series.

The projections are broken down by classified undergraduate, classified graduate and unclassified enrollments. Classified undergraduate enrollment is further sub-divided by registration status: first-time freshmen, continuing / returning and transfer. Classified graduate enrollment is further sub-divided by degree objective. Unclassified student enrollment is broken down by undergraduate and graduate. Additional details are summarized below.

**First-time freshmen** are divided into four categories based upon sector and location of high school of origin. Each category is forecast separately: direct entrants from Hawai'i public high schools, direct entrants from Hawai'i private high schools, freshmen from the U.S. mainland, and other first-time freshmen. Direct entrants are students from Hawai'i high schools who enter UH Hilo in the fall semester immediately following graduation from high school. This group represents the traditional cohort of first-time freshmen.

The enrollment projections of **direct public entrants** are based upon the forecast of public high school seniors provided by the Hawai'i Department of Education (see Appendix A). Historical ratios of direct public entrants to public high school senior enrollment are calculated by school district. Enrollment for each year is projected by applying an average of this ratio (by district) to the annual DOE senior enrollment forecast (ending in June). For outlying years, where DOE data are not available, senior enrollment has been extrapolated from lower level enrollments using continuation rates. The DOE forecast upon which these projections are based was released in January 2000; at the time this report was completed, the updated 5-year forecast was not yet available.

Although there has been some decline in the number of first-time freshmen from Hawai'i private high schools entering UH Hilo in recent years, the number is relatively stable as well as small in absolute terms. **Direct private entrants** are therefore set to a constant for all three projection series.

First-Time freshmen from the **U.S. mainland** have grown significantly at UH Hilo in recent years, from 54 in Fall 1997 to 146 in Fall 2001, an increase of 170%. Furthermore, due to recruiting efforts by the campus, first-time freshmen from the U.S. mainland are expected to continue to increase in the future. For these reasons, they are forecast separately for the first time in this year's report. First-time freshmen are forecast for all three series using the internal trend measured from Fall 1991 to Fall 2001.

First-Time freshmen from foreign countries, as well as those with General Education Development (GED) high school equivalency records and those from Hawai'i high schools who are not recent high school graduates, are included under **other first-time freshmen**. The numbers are small in absolute terms and tend to be rather stable. They are therefore set to constants for all three projection series.

**Classified undergraduate continuing / returning** students are forecast using continuation rates. In general, a continuation rate is the ratio of continuing / returning enrollment at a given education level to the previous fall semester's total enrollment at the next lower level. For example, the sophomore continuation rate is the ratio of continuing / returning sophomores to the previous year's total freshmen enrollment count. In this report, freshmen are projected using the previous year's first-time freshmen, sophomores using the previous year's freshmen, juniors using the previous year's sophomores, and seniors using the previous year's juniors. Average continuation rates are applied to the actual or projected total enrollment by education level to forecast the following year's continuing / returning enrollment at the next higher level.

**Classified undergraduate transfer** enrollment has also grown substantially in recent years, from 368 in Fall 1997 to 507 in Fall 2001, an increase of 37.8%. This growth has been due to increasing numbers of students from the U.S. mainland and foreign countries. As with first-time freshmen, further increases are anticipated. In the projection model, classified undergraduate transfers are broken down by geographic origin, with each category forecast separately. Transfers from the U.S. mainland and foreign countries are forecast using internal trends; transfers from other UH campuses, Hawai'i private colleges

and U.S. possessions are set to constants. The breakdown by educational level for all three series is based upon the Fall 2001 distribution across education levels.

**Classified graduate** enrollment jumped from 56 in Fall 2000 to 93 in Fall 2001, an increase of 66.1%. However, there is as yet insufficient data to establish a trend. Until more data can be added to the time series, a conservative forecast seems appropriate. Therefore, classified graduates are set to constants for all three projection series.

**Unclassified** student enrollment has varied in recent years from a high of 356 in Fall 1999 to a low of 239 in Fall 2001. No reliable correlation has yet been found between the number of unclassified students and a more predictable measure. Therefore, the number is set to a constant for all three series. The unclassified count includes special students (early admits and concurrent students), which have been added to the general enrollment counts for all years. For Fall 1999 and later years, the unclassified counts also include Adult Specials (continuing education credit students).

In addition to the high, middle and low series enrollment projections given in Table 1, detailed tables are included which project headcount enrollment, student semester hours offered, and full-time equivalent course enrollment. **The data in all subsequent tables are based upon the middle series presented in Table 1.**

Table 2 presents seven years of historical data and detailed forecasts by education level and registration status. Table 3 provides headcount enrollment by college. Student Semester Hours (SSH) offered are given in Table 4, while full-time equivalent (FTE) course enrollments are shown in Table 5. Tables 3, 4 and 5 utilize Fall 2001 data plus the projected enrollments for 2002 to 2008 as input, then forecast the counts by college using the Fall 2001 distribution across subunits. Headcount enrollment for credit students by attendance status is shown in Table 6. This table divides enrollment between full-time and part-time based upon the two-year average proportions. Appendix A shows historical and DOE projected enrollments of Hawai'i public high school seniors by geographic district. Historical data is current through the 2001-02 academic year; the forecast was last revised in January of 2000.

## ANALYSIS AND HIGHLIGHTS

- The Hawai'i Department of Education is forecasting a decline in public high school seniors through 2002-03, followed by modest growth through 2007-08 (see Appendix A). On the Big Island, public high school seniors are expected to decline through 2004-05 before increasing. Similarly, private high school graduates are expected to decline mildly for the next few years before stabilizing. Despite these forecasts, UH Hilo should be able to sustain direct public and private entrants at or near Fall 2001 levels through Fall 2008.
- First-Time freshmen enrollment from the U.S. mainland has grown substantially since Fall 1997. The projections for this group of first-time freshmen are based

upon internal trends in the historical data from Fall 1991 to Fall 2001. For the middle projection series, using this method results in a slightly lower forecast for Fall 2002 than if the forecast had been set constant at the Fall 2001 level. However, the trend-based method allows for significant future growth through Fall 2008 (see Table 2).

- Continuing / Returning enrollment has been fairly stable in recent years. Since the continuation rates used in the forecast are derived from these stable numbers, the projection model is fairly insensitive to them. The number of continuing / returning students will rise or fall with the overall enrollment forecast.
- Classified undergraduate transfers have grown in recent years and, together with first-time freshmen, constitute the engine of enrollment growth for the campus. More specifically, the primary area of growth is in transfers from the U.S. mainland and foreign countries. The forecasts for these two groups are based upon internal trends measured from Fall 1991 to Fall 2001 for the low and middle series, and from Fall 1996 to Fall 2001 for the high series.

## **SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION**

Enrollment at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo grew by 1.4% in Fall 2001, to 2,913 (see Table 2 & Figure 1) . Enrollment has grown steadily since Fall 1997 at an annual rate of 2.5%. Enrollment is forecast to increase in Fall 2002 by 2.8% to just under 3,000.

The middle series forecast is for continued growth through 2008 at an annual rate of 2.2%. This rate of increase closely follows the long-term growth trend for the campus (see Figure 4). The high series allows for more rapid growth, by 7.3% in Fall 2002 to 3,125, and growth through Fall 2008 at an annual rate of 4.2%. The low series forecasts a slight decline in enrollment in Fall 2002, to 2,869, but still measures growth through Fall 2008 at an annual rate of 1.2%.

Enrollment growth at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo in recent years can be attributed to large increases in first-time freshmen and classified undergraduate transfers from the U.S mainland and foreign countries. These increases are ostensibly due to dedicated recruiting efforts. With the Hawai'i DOE forecast for local high school graduates flat at least through 2006, the campus will have to continue to look outside the state for further growth in entering students.

Historical and Projected Headcount Enrollment

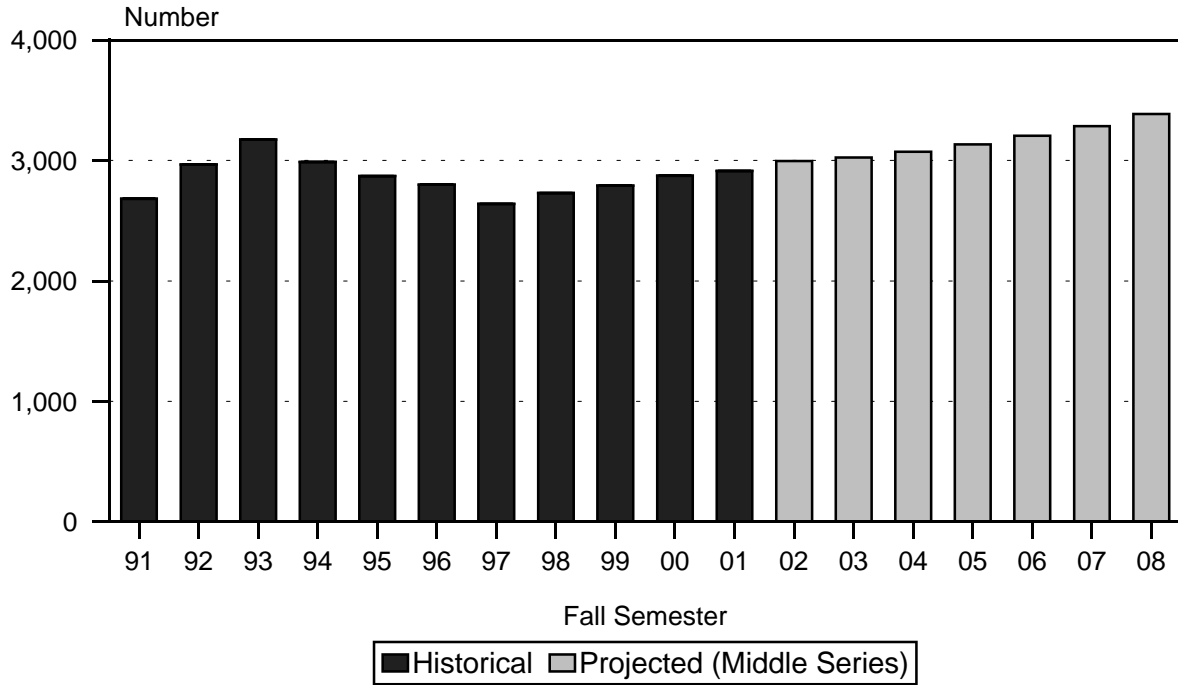
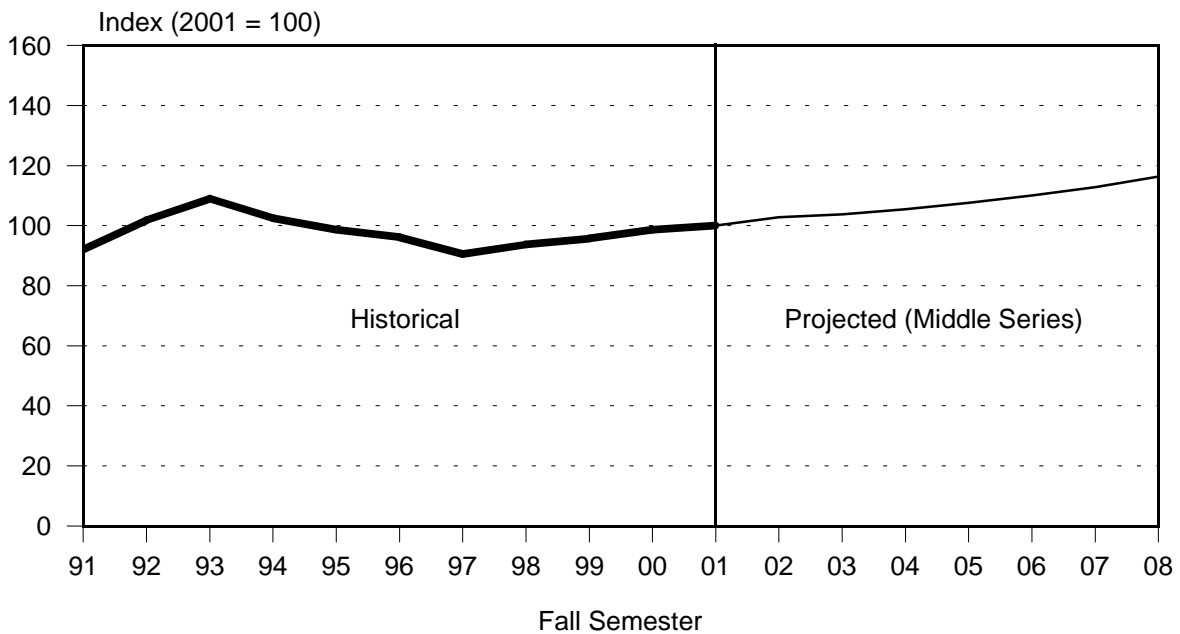


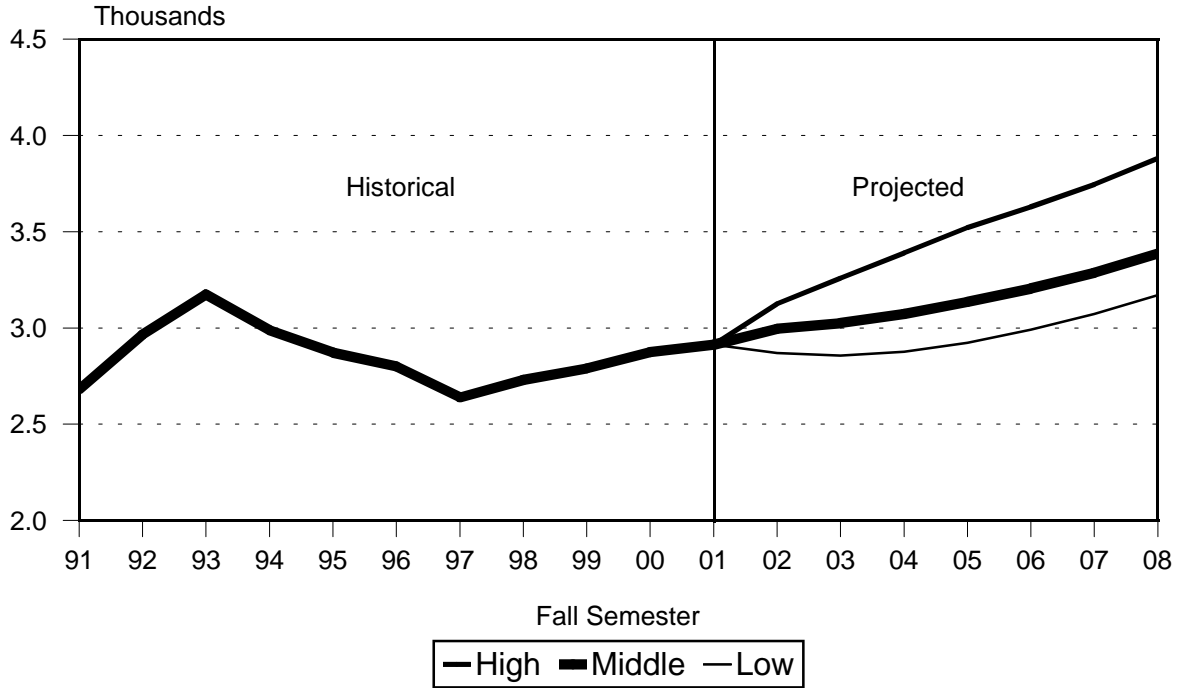

Enrollment Index



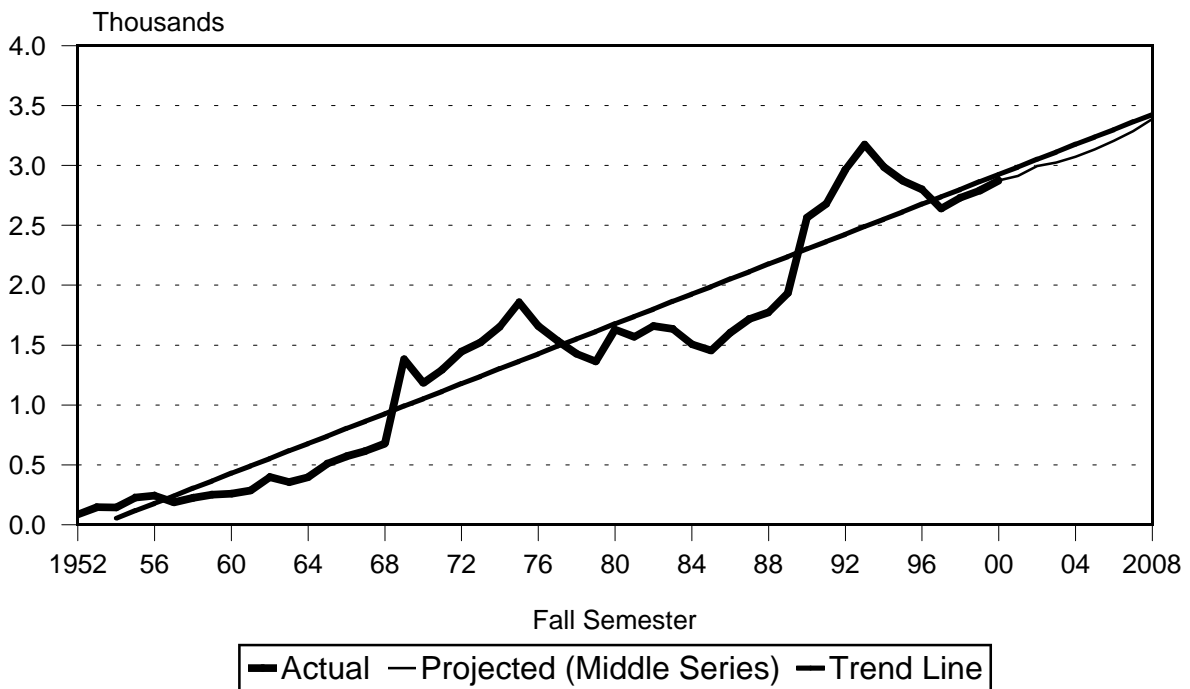

High, Middle and Low Projection Series



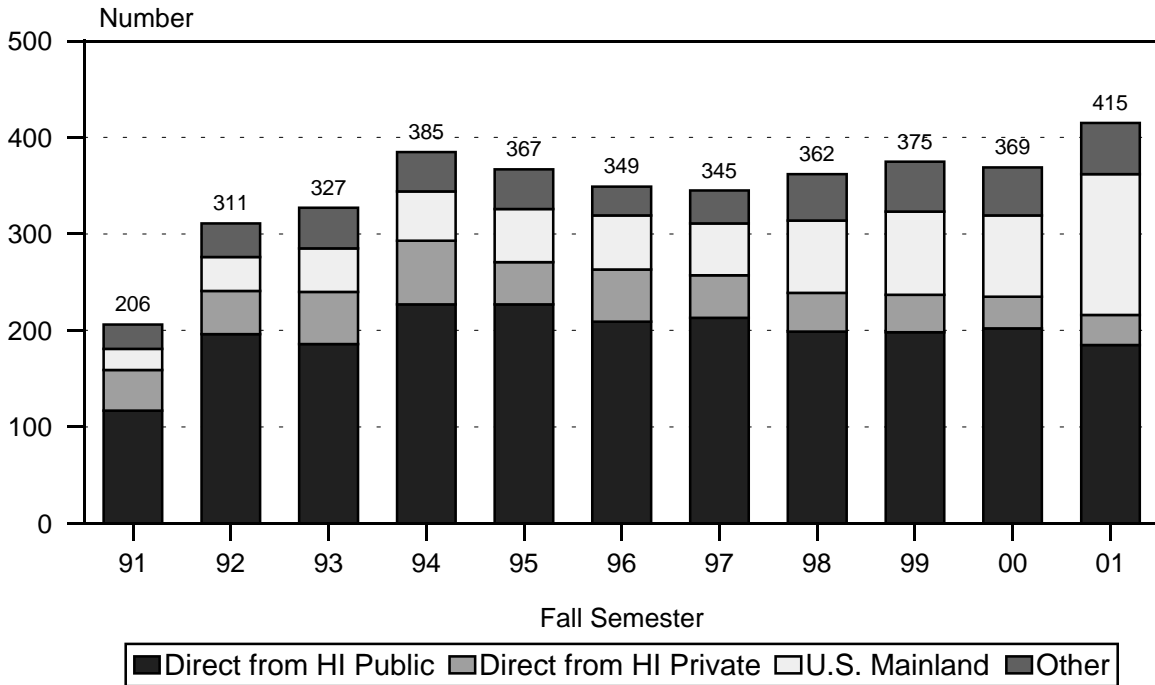
**Figure 4**

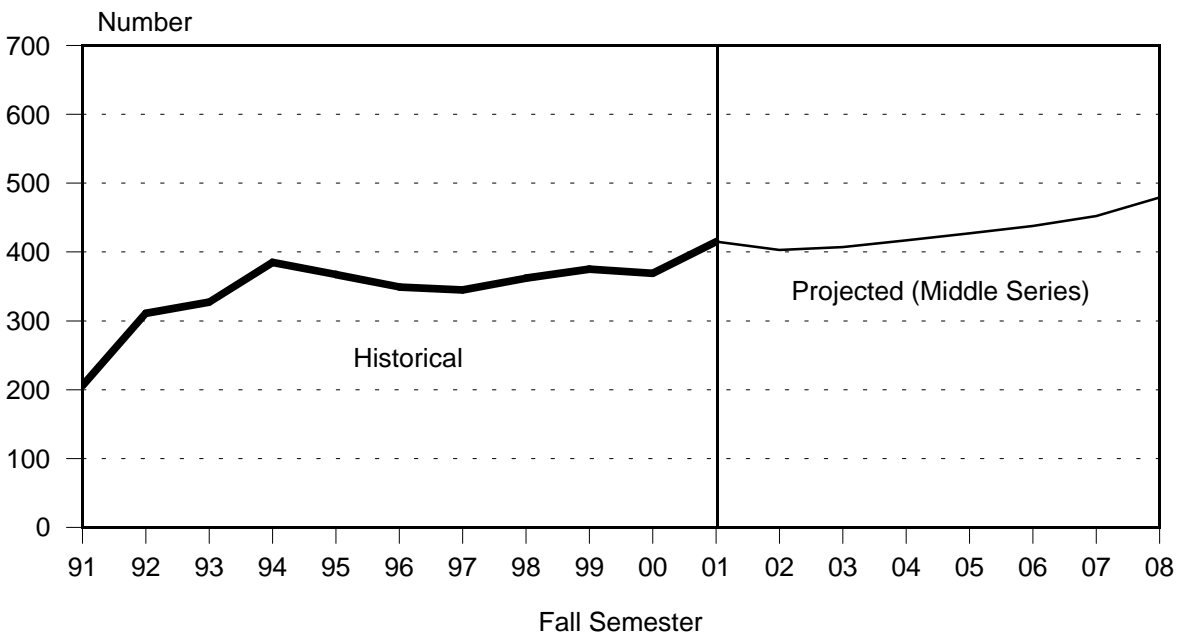

**First-Time Freshmen**

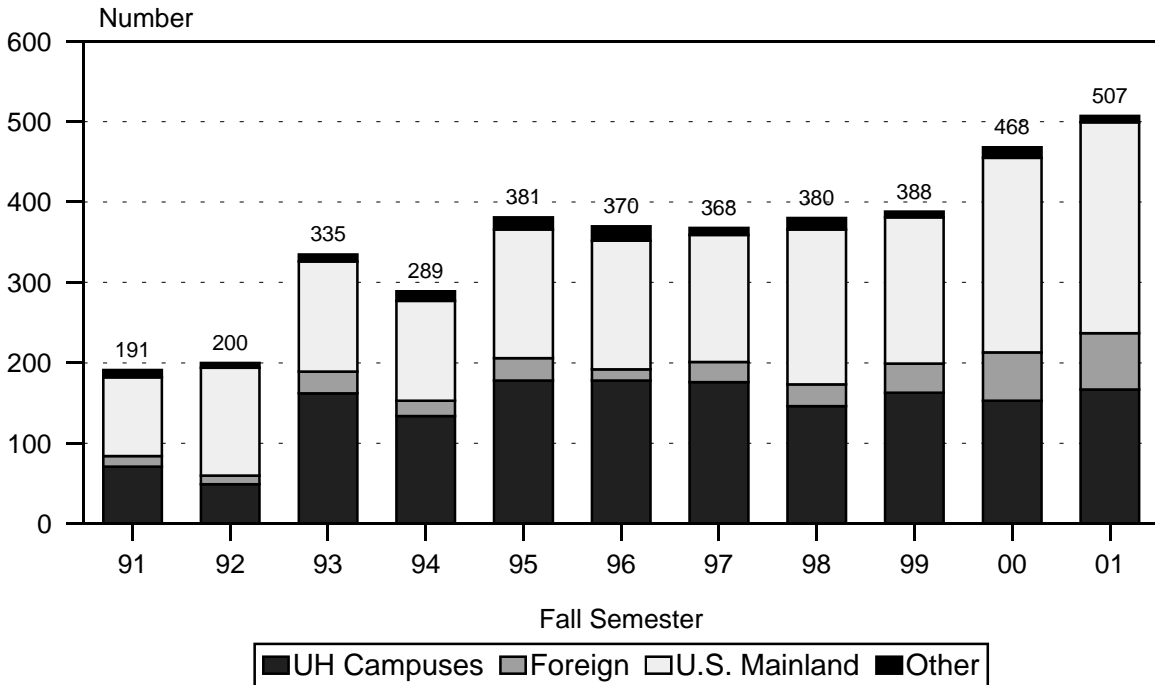

**Classified Undergraduate Transfers**

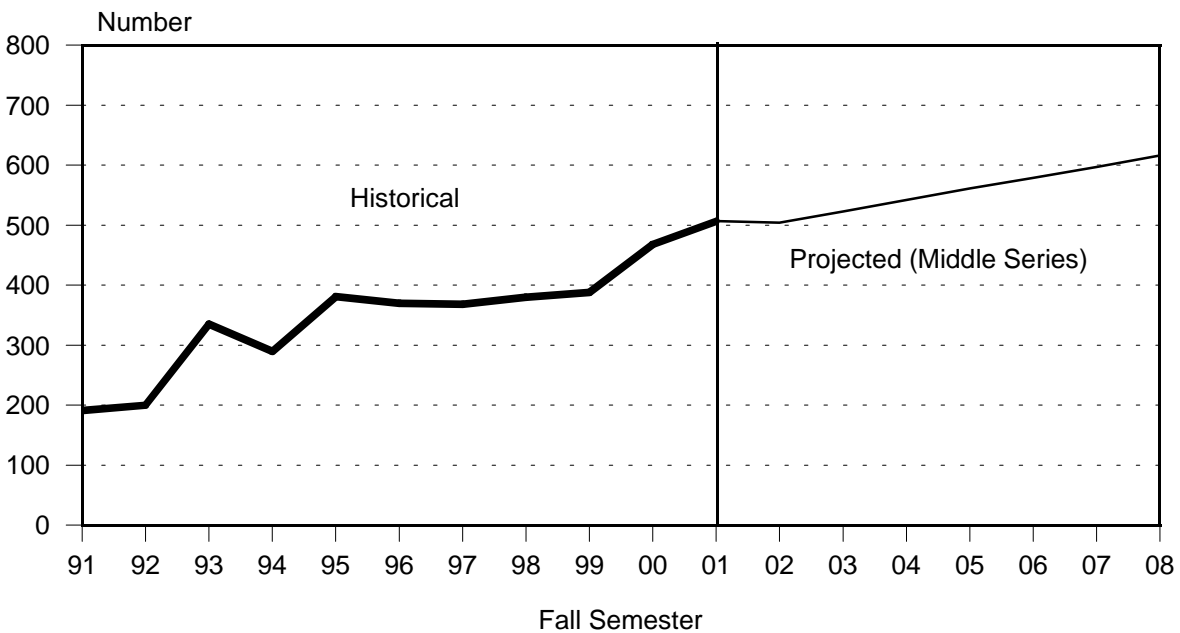
