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# ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I AT HILO FALL 2005 TO FALL 2011

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## INTRODUCTION

This report presents information on historical and projected headcount enrollment at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. The projections are statistical extrapolations of current trends in enrollment. They do not set enrollment targets and, in general, do not take into consideration planned or potential changes in University policies or procedures. They should be considered as an extension into the future of current enrollment trends, and may be used as a foundation for further work in planning and budgeting.

The enrollment projections are based upon unduplicated headcounts of students enrolled in credit courses. Included are classified students in the College of Agriculture, the College of Business and Economics, the College of Arts and Sciences and Ka Haka Ula 'O Ke'elikolani. Unclassified students, including special students (adult special, concurrent students, and early admits), are also included for all years, both historical and projected.

Historical data are included in the figures and tables to facilitate comparison and analysis. They were extracted from student enrollment, academic crossover and course registration data files. Information on Hawai'i public high school seniors by school district was provided by the Department of Education for the State of Hawai'i. Information on Hawai'i public and private high school graduates was obtained from the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE). Both sources have been recently updated.

## METHODOLOGY

Enrollment data are broken down into three broad groups of students: classified undergraduate, classified graduate and unclassified. Classified undergraduate enrollment is further sub-divided by registration status: first-time freshmen, transfer, returning and continuing. Classified graduate enrollment is further sub-divided by degree objective: Certificate in Education and Masters degree programs. This projection report offers three projection series - high, middle and low. The values in the separate series were produced by varying the input values used in the model from among the range of available values. Otherwise, the same general methodology is used for all three series.

**First-time freshmen** enrollment is divided into five categories based upon geographic location and sector of high school of origin. Each category is forecast separately: direct entrants from Hawai'i public high schools, direct entrants from Hawai'i private high schools, freshmen from the U.S. mainland, freshmen from foreign countries (including U.S. territorial possessions) and other first-time freshmen. Direct entrants are students from Hawai'i high schools who enter UH Hilo in the fall semester immediately following graduation from high school. This group represents the traditional core group of first-time freshmen.

The enrollment projections of **direct public entrants** are based upon the forecast of Hawai'i public high school seniors provided by the Hawai'i Department of Education (see Appendix A). Historical ratios of direct public entrants to public high school senior enrollment are calculated by school district. Enrollment for each year is projected by applying an average of this ratio (by district) to the annual DOE senior enrollment forecast (ending in June of each year).

The enrollment projections of **direct private entrants** are based upon the forecast of Hawai'i private high school graduates for the State of Hawai'i provided by WICHE (see Appendix B). Historical ratios of direct private entrants to total Hawai'i private high school graduates are calculated. Enrollment for each year is projected by applying an average of this ratio to the annual WICHE forecast of Hawai'i private high school graduates.

First-Time freshmen from the **U.S. mainland** have grown from 75 in Fall 1998 to 146 in Fall 2004, an increase of 95%. This increase may be attributed to active recruiting efforts. The forecasts for mainland first-time freshmen are based upon internal trends, as measured over various time intervals. First-Time freshmen from **foreign countries and U.S. territorial possessions** have been set to constants.

**Other first-time freshmen** include those who completed high school via the General Education Development (GED) examination, those who graduated from Hawai'i high schools prior to the 2003-04 academic year and records with invalid data on high school. The numbers are small in absolute terms and are set to constants.

**Classified undergraduate transfer** enrollment is divided into five areas based upon the geographic origin of the previous college attended. Each category is forecast separately: other campuses in the University of Hawai'i system, Hawai'i private colleges, U.S. mainland institutions, foreign countries and U.S. territorial possessions and other transfers. Transfers from other UH institutions have risen and fallen over the last ten years and show no distinct trends. Transfers from Hawai'i private colleges, as well as those from foreign countries and U.S. possessions and other transfers, have been few in number. Therefore, the forecasts for these transfer categories have been set to constants for all three projection series.

Transfers from the U.S. mainland have grown substantially in recent years: from 193 in Fall 1998 to 333 in Fall 2004, an increase of 73%. As with first-time freshmen, these increases reflect enrollment management policies. Transfers from the mainland are forecast using trends measured over various time intervals, with more recent trends used for the higher projection series. The breakdown by educational level for all three series is based upon the two-year average distribution of enrollment across education levels.

**Classified undergraduate returning** enrollment has been separated from continuing student enrollment. Returning student enrollment has grown at roughly the same rate as the overall campus enrollment, and has been forecast using a constant plus a growth rate.

**Classified undergraduate continuing** students are forecast using continuation rates. In general, a continuation rate is the ratio of continuing enrollment at a given education level to the previous fall semester's total enrollment at the next lower level. In this report, freshmen are projected using the previous year's first-time freshmen, sophomores using the previous year's total freshmen, juniors using the previous year's total sophomores, and seniors using the previous year's total juniors. Average continuation rates are applied to the actual or projected total enrollment by education level to forecast continuing enrollment at the next higher level for each succeeding year.

**Classified graduate** enrollment increased from 44 in Fall 1998 to 106 in Fall 2004, primarily reflecting the addition of new masters level programs. Additional masters degree programs have been approved and enrollments are expected to increase modestly over the forecast period. To account for these new programs, classified graduate enrollment has been forecast using constants plus a fixed annual numerical increase.

**Unclassified** student enrollment has varied in recent years, from a high of 356 in Fall 1999 to a low of 173 in Fall 2002. No reliable correlation has been found between the number of unclassified students and another more predictable measure. The level of unclassified enrollment may change due to variety of factors, including changes in admissions practices. For simplicity, the unclassified headcounts have been set to constants for all three series. With the migration to a new student registration system in Fall 2003, unclassified graduates are no longer identifiable. Therefore, the unclassified counts shown in the projected series are for the undergraduate level only.

In addition to the high, middle and low series enrollment projections shown in Table 1, additional tables provide detail. **The data in all subsequent tables are based upon the middle projection series presented in Table 1.**

Table 2 presents seven years of historical data and detailed forecasts by education level and registration status. Table 3 provides headcount enrollment by college / division. Student Semester Hours (SSH) offered are given in Table 4, while full-time equivalent (FTE) course enrollments are shown in Table 5. Tables 3, 4 and 5 utilize Fall 2004 data plus the projected enrollments for 2005 to 2011 as input, then forecast the counts by college / division using the Fall 2004 distribution ratios across subunits. Headcount enrollment by attendance status is shown in Table 6. This table divides enrollment between full-time and part-time based upon the two-year average proportions. Appendix A shows historical and DOE projected enrollments of Hawai'i public high school seniors by geographic district. This table was last revised in April 2004. Appendix B gives WICHE forecasts of Hawai'i public and private high school graduates through academic year 2017-18. This table was released by WICHE in December of 2003.

## ANALYSIS AND DISCUSSION

- C The Hawai'i Department of Education has forecast slight growth in public high school seniors through 2010-11 (see Appendix A). However, on the Big Island, public high school seniors are expected to decline over this period. Similarly, private high school graduates are expected to be fairly stable through 2010-11 (see Appendix B). Given these forecasts, direct public and private entrants into UH Hilo may be expected to remain stable to slightly declining through the projection period.
- C First-Time freshmen and classified undergraduate transfer enrollment from the U.S. mainland have increased substantially since Fall 1997 (Table 2 and Figures 5 & 7). Together, these enrollment categories constitute the primary source of enrollment growth for the campus. However, further increases may be constrained by a number of factors, including faculty resources, adequate support services and available housing. In addition, University of Hawai'i policy (BOR Policy 5-11) currently caps non-resident enrollment at 30% of total campus enrollment. In Fall 2004, enrollment of non-resident non-exempted and Western Undergraduate Exchange students measured 29.6% of the total student population at UH Hilo.
- C A masters program in Hawaiian Language and Literature was established at UH Hilo in Fall 1997, while a masters in Education was introduced in Fall 2000. An MA degree program in China-U.S. relations was approved by the UH Board of Regents in January of 2002, an MA degree in Counseling Psychology in May 2002 and an MS in Tropical Conservation Biology & Environmental Science in October 2003. The addition of these programs should boost the classified graduate headcounts moderately over the forecast period.

## SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION

Enrollment at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo declined very slightly in Fall 2004, after six years of strong growth (Table 2 & Figure 1). Given this slight decline, the enrollment growth for the campus has been revised downward for this projection series. **Enrollment is forecast to increase in Fall 2005 by 1.2% to reach 3,327 students.**

Enrollment at UH Hilo has grown since Fall 1997 at an average annual rate of 3.2%. The middle series forecast provides for continued growth through 2011 at an average annual rate of 1.7%. This estimate may seem somewhat conservative, given the recent growth trend. However, resource constraints (especially housing) may limit further increases in the immediate future. As these resource needs are met, enrollment may again increase toward the enrollment goal of 5,000 students, as set forth in the campus strategic plan. Additional student housing is anticipated to become available as early as Spring 2007.

The high series forecast allows for more rapid growth, by 4.0% in Fall 2005 to 3,421, and growth through Fall 2011 at an average annual rate of 2.8%. The low series provides for a low growth scenario, with enrollment remaining near current levels.

Historical and Projected Headcount Enrollment

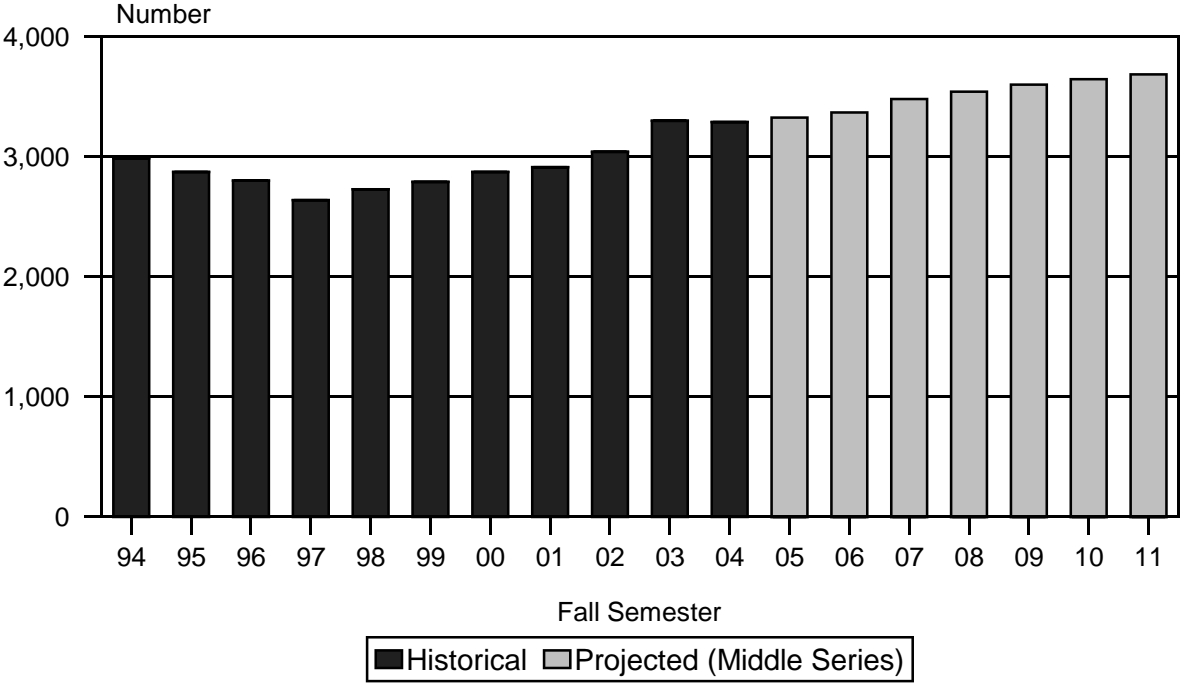
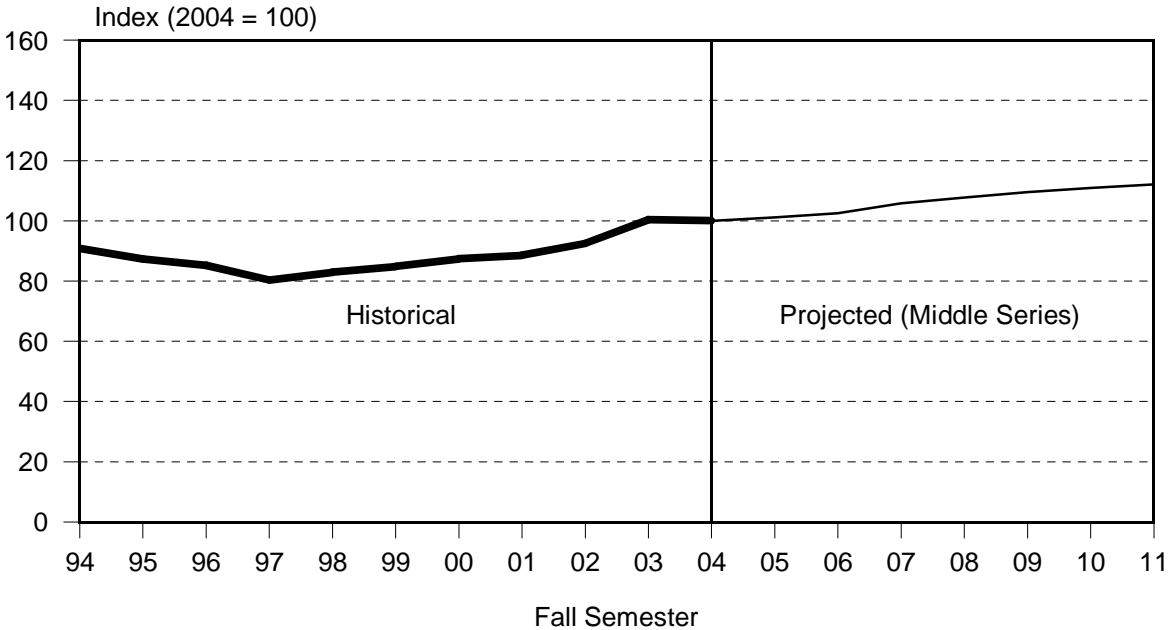

High, Middle and Low Projection Series

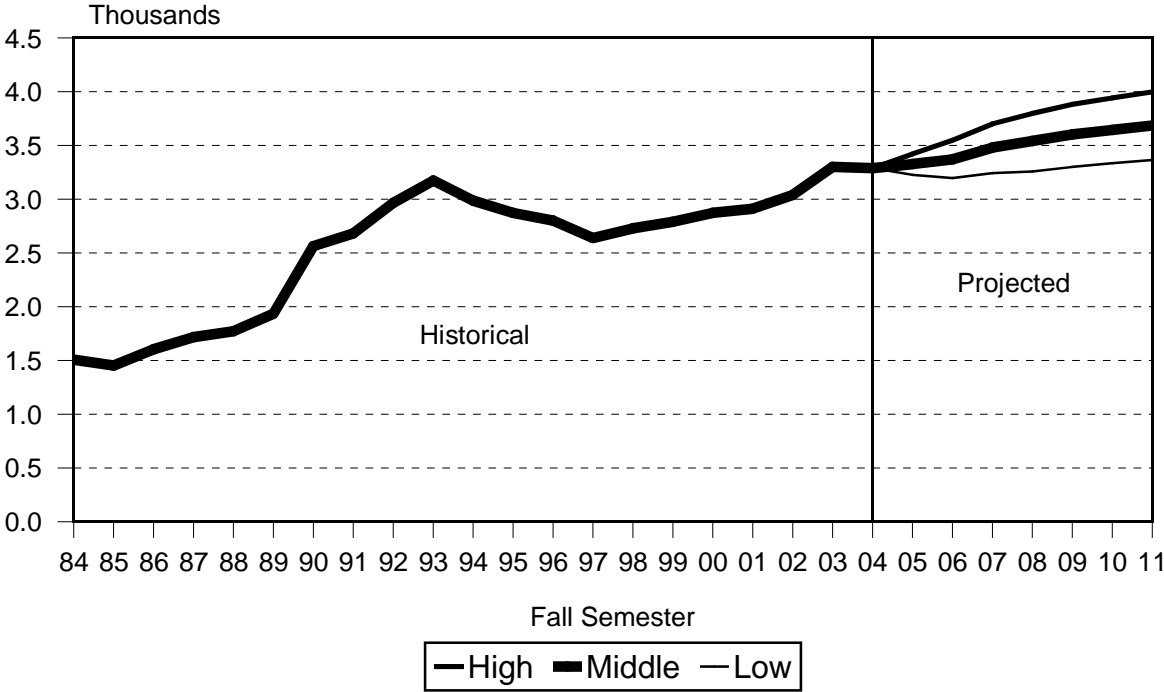
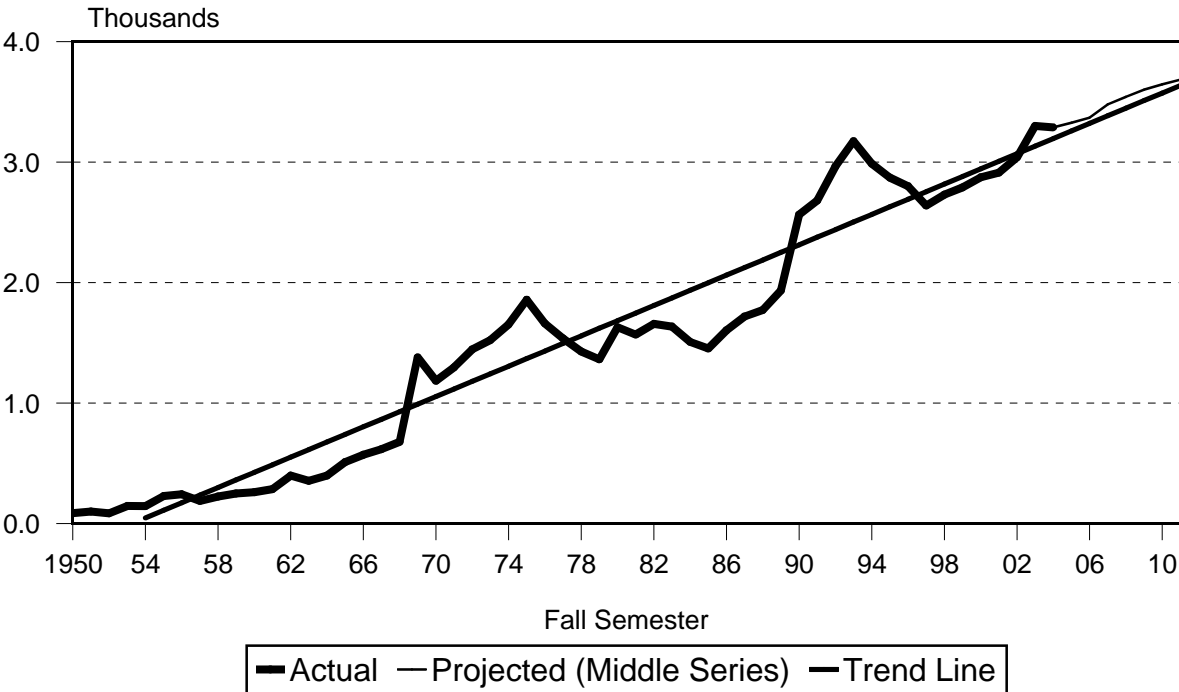

First-Time Freshmen from the U.S. Mainland

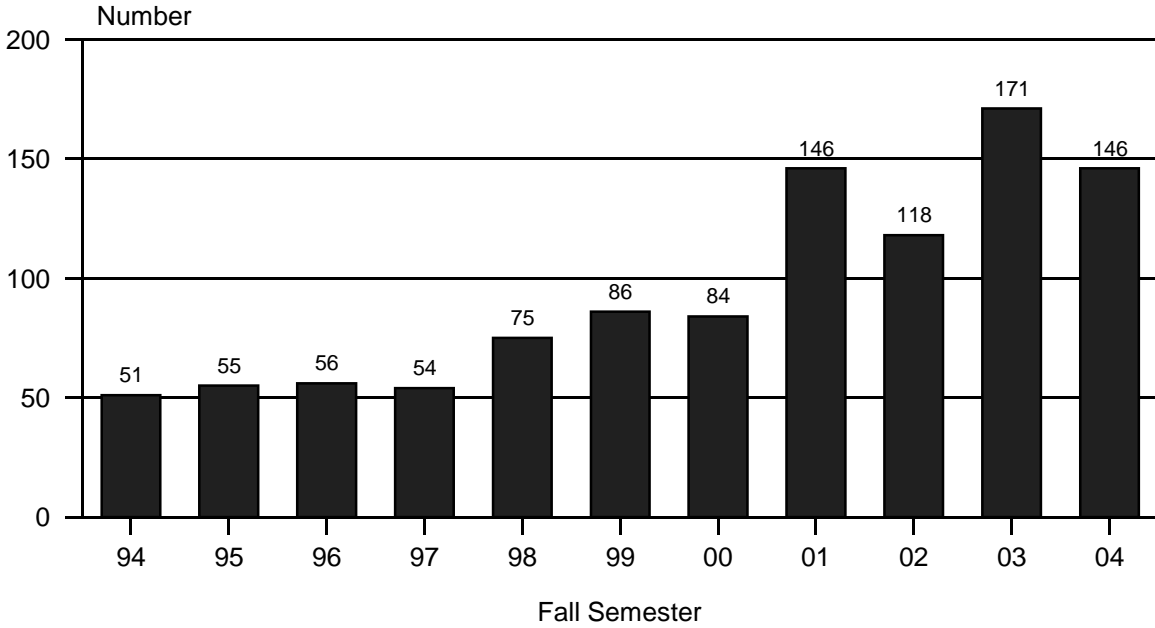
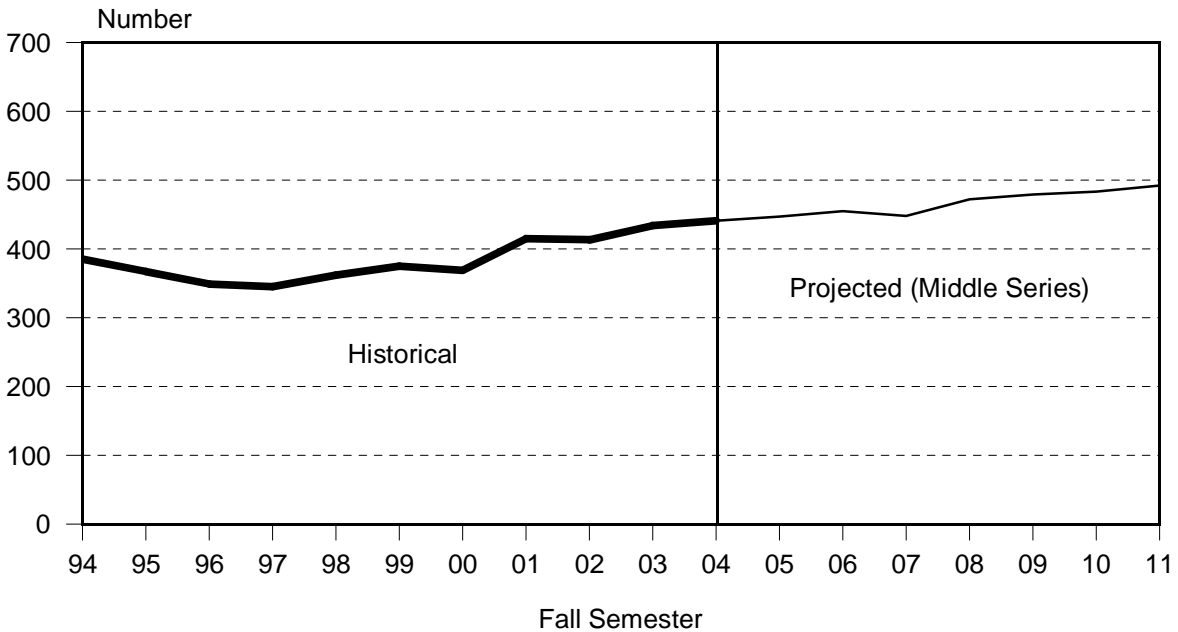

Classified Undergraduate Transfers from the U.S. Mainland

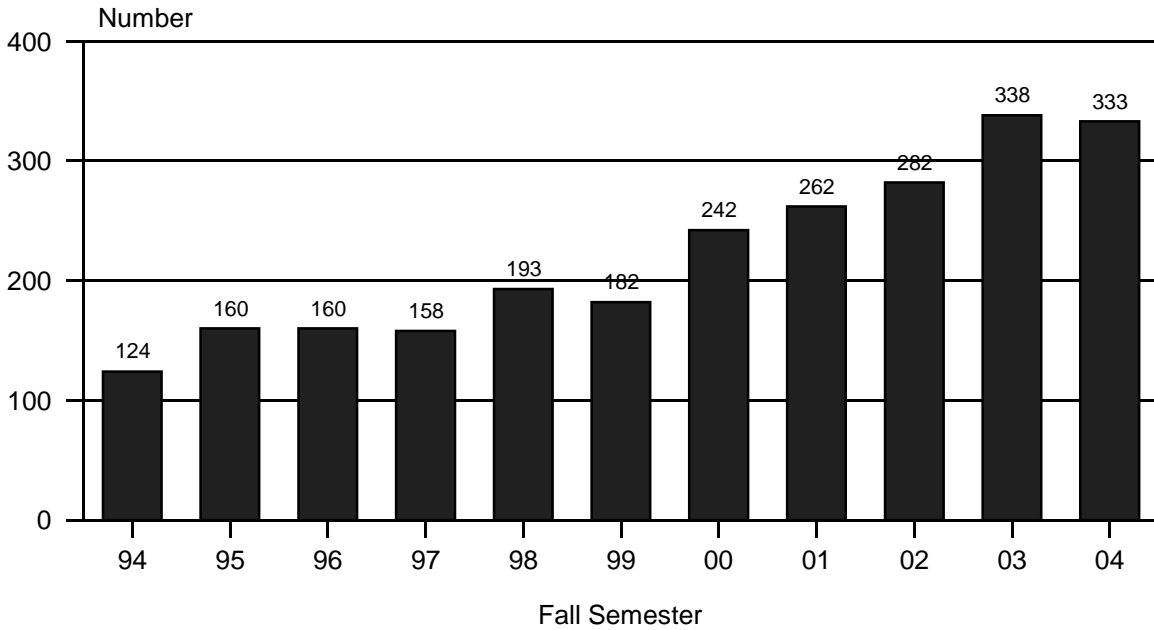
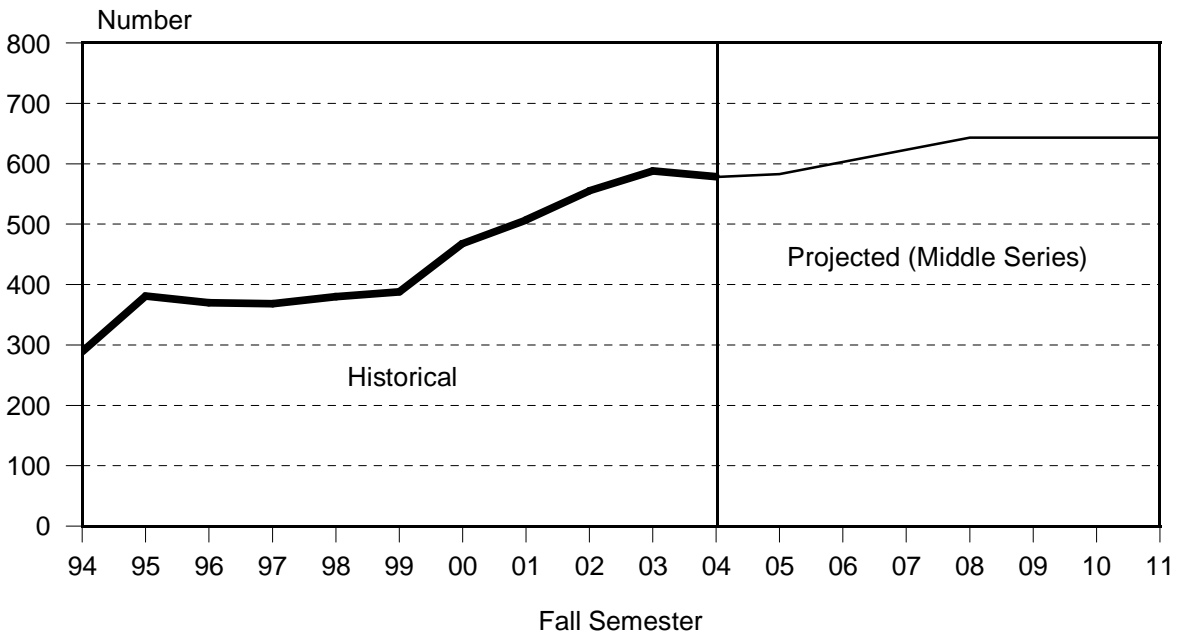

Classified Undergraduate Returning Enrollment

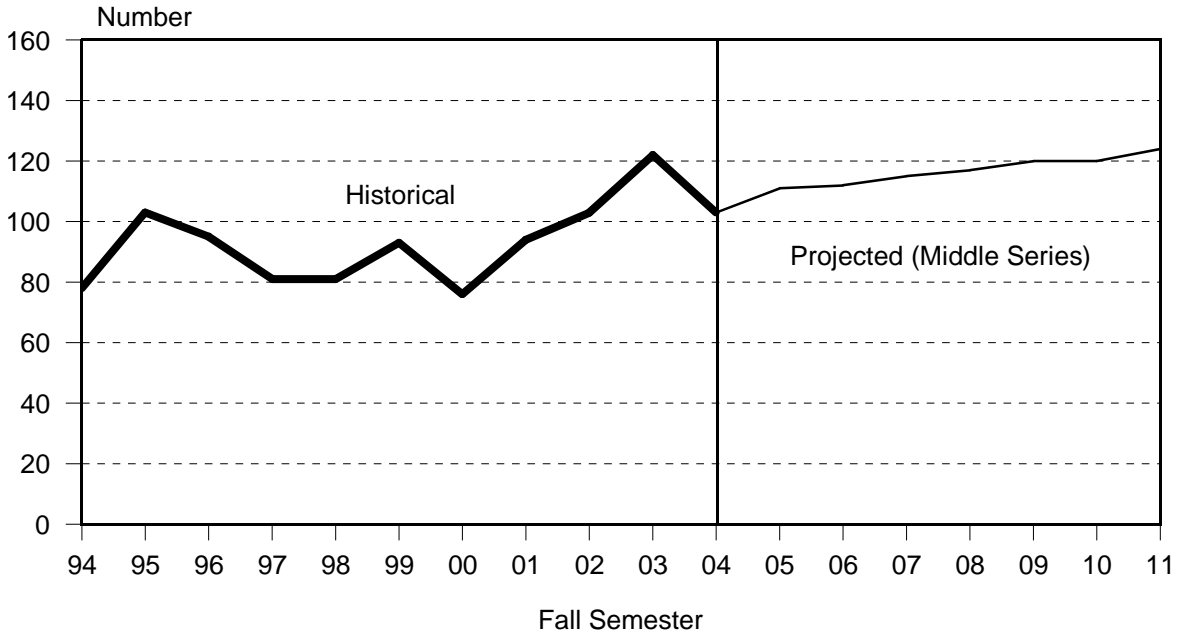

Classified Undergraduate Continuing

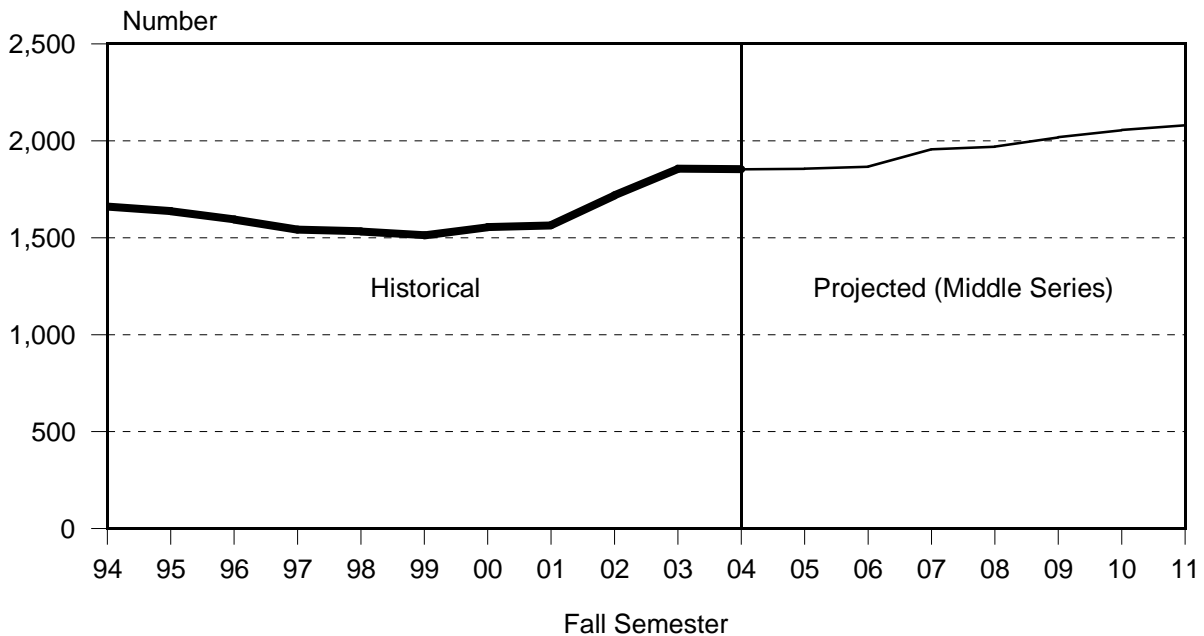
