Course Description:

This is a continuing course in Chamorro. The course will focus on fundamentals of Chamorro language with emphasis on comprehension and language development. Listening, speaking, reading and writing will be emphasized in that order.

Prerequisite:

To enroll in Chamorro 202 you must have successfully completed Chamorro 101, 102, and 201 with a grade of “C” or better; or meet equivalent skills in Chamorro.

Class Activities, Assignments and Evaluations:

1. Class covers Leksion 7-10 in Topping’s Spoken Chamorro.
2. Dialogues, skits and oral presentations will be interpreted with test activities to build and demonstrate correct use of Chamorro language.
3. Weekly drills and exercises to build vocabulary and comfort level of conversational speaking.
4. Pop quizzes, midterms, and final exams.
