The Ehime Prefectural International Center is offering two internships for approximately twelve weeks over the summer (May to August) of 2008. The students will be working at EPIC and other municipal international centers in Ehime prefecture.

Benefits: round-trip transportation (Honolulu-Ehime), housing allowance, modest stipend, medical and life insurance coverage.

Eligibility Requirements:

- 1) Functional proficiency in Japanese
- 2) Applicant must be a currently-enrolled undergraduate or graduate student at one of the UH campuses. An undergraduate student must be at least at the sophomore class standing by the time the internship starts.
- 3) American citizen
- 4) Excellent academic record
- 5) Knowledge of Hawaiian culture

Summary of Work Responsibilities:

- 1) Assist EPIC staff in answering general inquiries both from the people of Ehime and foreigners.
- 2) Plan, coordinate, and execute cross-cultural seminars that include topics on Hawaiian and American cultures.
- 3) Update and manage website and publications for EPIC.
- 4) Assist the summer intensive English language course at EPIC (2 weeks)
- 5) Work hours and holidays: Tuesdays to Fridays from 9 am to 5 pm. Work on Mondays and Saturdays is alternated every two weeks.

The selected candidate will have to provide further documentation to secure the VISA.
