## Program Requirements

- Attend three seminars during Spring 2007  
(February 10 and April 21, and one other team meeting date TBD by each team)
- Participate in a 2-day visit to your practicum site in Spring 2007  
(dates TBD by each team)
- Participate in a five-week practicum on a neighbor island (June 12 – July 13)  
and the August 18 presentations & celebration on the UH-Manoa campus
- Completion of a team community project, presentations and a formal paper
- Participate in evaluation activities such as surveys and reflective writing

## Program Benefits

- All students receive a stipend of \$1,200 during the practicum
- Housing is provided and all airfare costs are reimbursed
- Participation fulfills the requirements of BIOM593 and BIOM594
