Functions of the Graduate Chair Council:

The functions of the Graduate Chair Council are to advise the Dean of the College in coordinating and executing graduate education and instructional research in the College. This includes:

- Representing all graduate faculty and their departments the programs in the College of Education.
- Recommending to the Dean of the College of Education the programs of study for the M.Ed., MET, and Ph.D. programs.
- Advising the Dean of the College of Education on the composition of the graduate faculty and the graduate faculty of Education.
- Sponsor colloquia on research and other graduate program issues.
