This is YOUR conference and opportunity to showcase the many successful approaches that have been implemented to support Hawai'i's Career Pathway System. Proposals are being accepted to focus on the following themes:

PARTNERSHIP ACTIVITIES

How have you involved various partners in building Career Pathways? What are your academic connections, business and/or community initiatives, links with special populations groups? How have you connected to business/industry? Have you organized an activity that partners secondary and postsecondary instructors and/or students?

COUNSELING/CAREER EDUCATION

How have you modified counseling/career education activities to support Career Pathways? Share your model for placement testing, developing personal transition plans, providing extra support to special populations groups and the promotion of nontraditional career exploration.

TRANSITIONS

How are you facilitating the transition of students from middle school to high school, high school to college/work, community college to four-year college/work? How have you made students aware of dual credit and advanced placement possibilities available through the Career Pathway System? Share your successful practices.

INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES

How have you changed classroom activities/lesson plans to align with Career Pathways? What adaptations have supported program success for special population or nontraditional students? What have you done to integrate language arts, math, science, and pathways? Have you discovered a resource that assists in Pathway implementation? Share your strategies on using Career Pathway standards and assessments to improve student-learning outcomes.

DISCUSSION GROUPS

How have you solved a Career Pathways implementation problem? Help others solve issues such as matriculation of students from one level of education to the next or the workforce, changing bell schedules, senior projects, service learning projects, articulating curriculum, finding/using resources, marketing Career Pathways. These sessions involve less presentation and more facilitating of participants' ideas/strategies.

Your expertise and experience will be the highlight of the Career and Technical Education 2008 "The Power of Pathways" Conference. We invite you to submit your proposal to be a presenter or to facilitate a discussion group.

Neither honoraria nor expenses will be paid to presenters. Presenters must register for the conference and pay the regular conference registration fees of \$100 (2 days) or \$50 (1 day). Late fees are applicable. Registration materials will be distributed in September.

Each presenter will be responsible for individual handouts.
