DIRECTED RESEARCH 699 PROPOSAL

EALL, CHN, JPN, KOR 699 are intended for graduate students in East Asian Languages and Literatures who want to do individual research in an area for which no regular course exists; these are not language-training courses. Because a Directed Research course is a service course which the faculty member takes on above his normal teaching load, it can be offered only when the request is warranted and staff available.

To ensure that Directed Research courses are well-planned and their goals understood by all parties concerned, each student requesting such instruction is asked to fill out this form and secure the consent of an instructor. Such requests place an additional burden on faculty members, and they have the right to decline.

In the space below (and on additional sheets as necessary), please state clearly:

- (1) the subject or topic of your research and why you have selected it, including the relevance of the proposal to existing courses, your degree program, and your career goals;
- (2) a brief description of the materials and methodology to be used;
- (3) the nature and amount of assistance to be received from the instructor.

If you are planning only to read a text that relates to your research, you should sign up for 499, Directed Reading, instead of 699.
