▶ Access to the Databases

EBSCOhost databases are accessible via the web both on and off campus (with UHM login).

1. Go to the UH Manoa Library's homepage at: <http://library.manoa.hawaii.edu/>.
2. Select **E-Resources & Databases**.
3. Type **EBSCOhost** into the search box and press the search button.
4. Select the **EBSCOhost** links until you are connected and can view the full list of EBSCOhost databases.
Note: Wireless and users outside of the library building will be taken to an authorization page where you may log in with your UH ID.

▶ Select a Database

EBSCOhost allows you to search one or more databases simultaneously. To include a desired database, mark the appropriate box to the left of the listed database(s). Press **Continue** when ready to proceed.

▶ Searching

EBSCOhost defaults to the **Advanced Search** interface. Advanced searching, allows for more complex search statements.

Basic Search – provides a single search box allowing you to create a search using a variety of methods: *Standard Search* (allows you to combine terms using AND , OR , and NOT), *All Words* (results include all words entered), *Any Words* (results are displayed in a relevancy ranking), and *Exact Phrase*.

Advanced Search – provides three search boxes for separate search statements which can be combined using Boolean operators (AND , OR , and NOT) selected from pull-down menus.

▶ Searching, continued






Refine your searches when necessary by using the following techniques:

To search for	Use	Example	Results
exact phrase	“ ”	“culture shock”	<i>culture shock</i>
variant endings of a word	*	educat*	<i>educated, education, educators, ...</i>
words replacing a single letter	?	wom?n	<i>woman, women</i>
all words	AND	honey AND bees	<i>honey and bees</i> required in every record
any of the words	OR	honey OR bees	<i>honey or bees</i> (or both) will be in every
one word but not another	NOT	honey NOT bees	<i>honey</i> but not <i>honey bees</i>
words near each other in any order	N#	cold N3 common	<i>cold</i> and <i>common</i> within 3 words of each other in any order
words within each other in the order in which you entered them	W#	tax W8 reform	<i>tax</i> and <i>reform</i> within 8 words of each other in that order

You can also limit your search to articles in full-text, to scholarly (peer-reviewed) journals, whether or not references are available, by date, in a specific publication, by publication type (periodical, newspaper, book, primary source), by document type (article, book review, speech, poetry, etc.), by length of document, etc. Note, not all features are available in all databases.
