SB 776 SD1 – RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION

Chair Tokuda, Vice Chair Dela Cruz, and members of the Senate Committee on Ways and Means:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of SB 776 SD1, which restructures the Hawai'i Invasive Species Council as the Hawai'i Invasive Species Authority, administratively attached to the department of agriculture, to coordinate implementation of the Hawai'i interagency biosecurity plan and to improve coordination of the State's invasive species prevention, early detection, rapid response, control, enforcement, and outreach programs; and appropriates funds to implement the authority and relevant interagency invasive species projects.

The University of Hawai'i is a member of the interagency Hawai'i Invasive Species Council, and will remain a member under the restructuring proposed in SB 776 SD1. We support this restructuring and attachment to the Department of Agriculture, and believe that it will strengthen efforts to prevent and control invasive pests, plants, and plant diseases in Hawai'i.
