Vulnerable Populations Served By Federally-Funded Health Centers (Page 1)

- Based on NACHC analysis using Bureau of Primary Health Care, HRSA, DHHS, 2003 Uniform Data System. Uses "percent of known" for health center patients by poverty level and race/ethnicity. Vermont health centers reported 68% of patients had unknown poverty level, and a few other states reported over 30%. Analysis also uses the following data sources:
