UH Mānoa Graduation Rates by High School Attended

First- and second-year retention rates of UH Mānoa students who attended Hawai'i public high schools are slightly higher than those of their private school counterparts, and significantly higher than students who attended mainland high schools. Students who attended foreign high schools have a slightly higher 1st year retention rate, but a lower 2nd year retention rate.

Four-year graduation rates of students who attended public high schools are lower than those of other cohort students. However, more than half continue to their 5th year. As a result, their success rate (graduation rate + continuation rate) is higher than those of their counterparts, with the exception of students who attended foreign high schools.

Graduation rates of students who attended public high schools continue to improve in their 5th and 6th year. Students who attended public high schools in Hawai'i have higher 5- and 6-year graduation rates than those of students who attended private or mainland high schools. Only those who attended foreign high schools have higher graduation rates. When looking at success rates, students who attended Hawai'i public high schools have the highest 5- and 6- year success rates.

6-year Graduation Rate Comparison with Peer, Benchmark, CSRDE Groups

In the MAPS report, UH Mānoa rates are compared to those of its peer and benchmark institutions, as well as with higher education institutions who are members of the Consortium for Student Retention and Data Exchange (CSRDE).

When comparing six-year graduation rates of UH Mānoa students who attended public high schools in Hawai'i to those of the comparison groups, UH Mānoa has lower graduation rates than its peer and benchmark group and a slightly higher rate than those of the CSRDE group.
