1. A curriculum vitae or professional resume [with the applicant's date and place of birth and a complete list of publications].
2. A detailed proposal [no more than 3–5 pages] outlining the research that will be undertaken while in residence at the Center. The proposal should include a statement of the objectives of the research, a description of the methodology, and a bibliography. Specifically, it should also include a description of the relevant academic and scholarly value of the proposal as a Korean studies discipline, a realistic plan of how the project will be carried out, and justification for research at the University of Hawai'i–Center for Korean Studies.
3. A certified statement of financial support from the applicant's place of employment or financial institution. The statement must show support of a minimum US\$2,000/month and an additional US\$500/month for each dependent for each month of your stay.
4. For Doctoral students, two letters of recommendation from scholars with expertise in the area of the applicant's intended research.

Notes:

- If invited as a Visiting Scholar to the Center for Korean Studies, travel outside of Hawaii is allowed for academic and/or personal matters; however, the Center will only allow travel outside of Hawaii for no more than 2 months within your appointment period.
