Known internationally by its acronym, CIMMYT received the 1970 Nobel Peace Prize for its global contributions to the Green Revolution and attracted support from Microsoft founder Bill Gates for continued efforts to combat hunger and poverty through sustainable agricultural development.

Population growth, climate change, changing diets, rising prices, depletion of natural resources, and competition for water threaten food security; technology offers hope.
