Course Information

Course Description: History 151 is the first half of a two-semester series of courses that cover human history from our earliest origins through the twentieth century. This course provides a survey of world history from our earliest ancestors to 1500 C.E. Emphasis will be placed on the development of complex societies in the Old World: Mesopotamia, the Mediterranean, India, China, and Europe. Religious, philosophical, technological, biological, cultural and ecological developments will be examined.

Expectations: Students who complete this course will

Distinguish the most important characteristics of the major complex societies in their geographic settings.

Demonstrate an understanding of how human factors such as religion, warfare, trade and technology affect world history.

Demonstrate an understanding of how non-human factors such as disease and geography affect world history.

Describe the tenets of major world religions and philosophies.

Analyze primary source documents.

Describe the extent, nature, and impact of cross-cultural interaction.

Exams and Grading: There will be three tests and a final examination. Students are also expected to read and participate in discussions about *The Ramayana*, translated by R. K. Narayan and *Oedipus the King* and *Antigone* by Sophocles. There will be an in-class quiz about each reading. Missed tests and quizzes must be made up within seven days. It is the student's responsibility to schedule a time to complete the work. Regular attendance is expected and can factor into your grade. Excessive absenteeism (more than 5 unexcused absences) may lower your grade.

The final grade will be calculated from 400 points, divided as follows:

3 Tests: 200 points total

2 Book Quizzes: 80 points total

1 Final Exam: 120 points
