Course Description: Math 115 covers elementary probability and statistics including standard deviation, calculations and inferences about means and proportions, normal distributions and linear correlations.

Objectives

- Describe and interpret various descriptive statistics such as mean, median, mode, range, standard deviation and quartiles
- Draw and interpret various graphs such as frequency histograms, bar graphs, and boxplots
- Solve problems involving the probability of events
- Calculate probabilities involving normal random variables and categorical data
- Determine and interpret (for large samples) confidence interval estimates of population means and proportions
- Conduct hypothesis tests using z and chi-square about means and proportions of populations
- For a set of paired data, produce a scatter plot, find the regression line, and find and interpret the correlation coefficient

Homework Policy

Each homework set will consist of only a few problems worth a total of 4 points. This homework is to be done neatly in pencil. In order to get full credit for the homework, all steps to complete each homework problem must be clearly shown on the paper that is to be handed in. "Suggested" problems are intended as extra practice and are solely for the benefit of the student.

Attendance Policy

Homework submission will act as a record of attendance. Homework is to be turned in at the beginning of each class. If a student is late for class (the student arrives after homework is originally collected), the homework will be considered late. Each student is allowed two tardies without penalty, i.e. – two late homework submissions are allowed without any penalty. If a student is tardy more than twice, any submitted homework will receive no credit.

Unless, I have previously been notified and approved an absence, <u>absences will</u> <u>only be excused in **verified** cases of extreme or unusual circumstances (medical conditions, death in the family, etc.). In order to make up any assignments from an excused absence, I must be notified that it is an excused absence within 48 hours of the missed class. All make up assignments must be completed and turned in within one week of the excused absence unless otherwise agreed upon. Any unexcused absence will result in no credit for any and all assignments of the day.</u>

Academic Dishonesty (Student Conduct Code)

The University of Hawai'i system has strict standards for academic integrity. In cases of suspected or admitted academic dishonesty, the instructor involved shall attempt to discuss the matter with the student. The instructor may bring the matter to the attention of the department chairperson for consultation. The instructor may require the student to redo the assignment, give a failing or reduced grade for the course, and/or refer the student to the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs or designee through the Department Chair for possible college action under the Student Conduct Code. The Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs or designee shall pursue such cases to determine appropriate disciplinary actions if, after a preliminary investigation, it is his/her determination that probable cause exists to establish that an act of academic dishonesty took place.

Math/Science Dept. Policy: Withdrawals (W Grade) and Incomplete (I Grade)

• Withdrawals (W Grade) – After the "last day of withdrawals" March 21, 2013, the instructor will sign withdrawals only in cases of extreme or unusual circumstances. Grade related excuses are unacceptable. Examples of extreme or unusual circumstances are: (1) a certified medical reason, (2) a death in the immediate family. Students who no longer attend class and who DO NOT OFFICIALLY WITHDRAW from the course will receive an "F" grade.

• **Incomplete** (**I Grade**) – Students must present the "Request for Incomplete" form <u>prior to the last day of instruction</u>. "I" grades will be given only to students who are achieving passing grades and are very close to completing the course. In addition, the student must have a very good reason for not being able to complete all the work on time. Examples of good reasons are the same as those listed under the withdrawal policy above.
