Exams: There will be two in-class exams. The dates are January 24 and February 7. In addition, there will be a three-day comprehensive final exam on February 26, 27, and 28. Failure to take any exam will result in a zero.

Quizzes: There will be at least ten in-class quizzes. Quizzes will be, in general, unannounced. The top 5 quiz scores for each student will be counted twice in computing the quiz grade.

Make-ups: Make-ups are given only in the case of illness or personal tragedy. Proof is required. In order to take a make-up, the student must contact the instructor on the day he is absent.
