Exams: There will be two in-class exams. The dates are March 21, and April 16. In addition, there will be a comprehensive final exam on Tuesday, May 7, from 10:00 - 12:00 pm. If time permits, additional time for the final exam will be given on the last day of class (May 1). Failure to take any exam will result in a zero.

Quizzes: There will be at least ten in-class quizzes. Quizzes will be, in general, unannounced. The student's top five quiz scores will be counted twice.

Make-ups: Make-ups are given only in the case of illness or personal tragedy. Proof is required. In order to take a make-up, the student must contact the instructor on the day he is absent.

Homework: Homework will be collected weekly. Although points are not given for homework, 25 points will be deducted from the student's total points for each missing or incomplete assignment. Each student is allowed one late assignment with no penalty. 10 points will be deducted from the student's total points for each subsequent late assignment, provided it is turned in no more than two days late. The assignments are due at the beginning of class on the assigned dates.

Extra Credit: Each in-class exam will have one extra credit problem. In addition, there is an extra credit assignment due on the day of the final exam. Additional extra credit points will be given to each student with no missing or late assignments.
