UHH	AJ 103	Criminal Investigations I	3	Complete ENG 100 (T/H)	This is an introductory course in criminal investigations. The nature of investigations, fingerprint classification, the role of the laboratory, and specific offense investigation will be explored. The class will also discuss interview and interrogation and search and seizure techniques. Pre: Placement in ENG 100. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 103	Criminal Investigations I	3	ENG 102 Prerequisite ENG 100 Prerequisite	This is an introductory course in criminal investigations. The nature of investigations, fingerprint classification, the role of the laboratory, and specific offense investigation will be explored. The class will also discuss interview and interrogation and search and seizure techniques.
HON	AJ 103	Criminal Investigation	3	AJ 101 Completed or Concurrent	This course covers the basic principles of criminal investigation including: the human aspects of dealing with the public, case preparation, the collection and preservation of physical evidence, crime scene search, fingerprinting, casts, photographs and laboratory assistance. (3 hrs. lect. per week)

UHH	AJ 104	CSI: Violent Crime Forensics	3	AJ 103	Advanced course work in forensic science (Legal Scientific Investigation), with its contributions to both Crime Scene Investigations and Laboratory Analysis. Specific field and laboratory investigative techniques in violent crimes and other major felonies will be explored. Pre: AJ 103. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 104	Criminalistics	3	AJ 103, Minimum Grade of D	Advance course work in forensic science (Legal Scientific Investigation), with its contributions to both Crime Scene Investigation and Laboratory Analysis. Specific field and laboratory investigative techniques in violent crimes and other major felonies will be explored.
MAU	AJ 104	Criminalistics	3	AJ 103, Minimum Grade of D	Emphasizes identification and reproduction of physical evidence. Studies specialized scientific methods and their relationship to court procedures.

Current correctional institutions such as prisons, detention facilities, and community-based programs and their management and effectiveness will be examined. (3 hrs. lect. per week)

Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.

UHH	AJ 180	Intro to Homeland Security	3	AJ 101	An examination of the history of terrorism, focusing on the terrorists, who they are, and how they operate. Responses to domestic and international terrorism will be discussed along with analyzing future trends. Pre: AJ 101. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 180	Intro to Homeland Security	3	AJ 101, Minimum Grade of D	An examination of the history of terrorism, focusing on the terrorists, who they are and how they operate. Responses to domestic and international terrorism will be discussed along with analyzing future trends.
HON	AJ 180	Introduction to Terrorism	3	AJ 101 Completed or Concurrent	This course provides a history of terrorism, focusing on the terrorists, their motivations and ideologies, and how they operate and execute terrorist attacks. The course examines the current responses to domestic and international terrorism along with analyzing future trends within the global war on terrorism. The course will discuss the theoretical perspectives of terrorism within criminology, criminal justice, sociology, and psychology. The course will present the use of the Internet, improvised explosives, and religious extremism found within modern terrorism. (3 hrs. lect per week)
HON	AJ 200	Procedures in HI Justice Sys	3	AJ 101 Completed or Concurrent	This course provides an examination of the basic Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Amendment procedural principles that govern the interaction of the police and suspects in the investigation of crime. Beginning with the initial encounter, the course will examine the constitutional guidelines developed to regulate police behavior in the areas of investigatory stops, searches and seizures, arrests, interrogations, Miranda, and electronic surveillance. The effects of failing to follow these judicially mandated guidelines will also be explored. (3 hrs. lect. per week)
MAU	AJ 200	Hawaii Justice System	3	ENG 22 w/ C or place ENG 100	Reviews criminal justice systems in the United States, with special emphasis on Hawai'i. Analyzes law enforcement and the judicial and corrections procedures from time of arrest until final disposition of the case. Studies federal and state laws and consitutional principles through legal research.

UHH	AJ 208	Criminology	3	Complete ENG 100 (T/H)	This course explores crime and the body of knowledge regarding it as a social phenomenon. An emphasis is placed on the analysis of crime, crime causation, crime variables, impact on society, and societal reactions to crime. Pre: placement in ENG 100. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 208	Criminology	3	ENG 102 / ENG 100 Prerequisite	This course explores crime and the body of knowledge regarding it as a social phenomenon. An emphasis is placed on the analysis of crime, crime causation, crime variables, impact on society, and societal reactions to crime.

It introduces the organization and function of the police juvenile unit, community diversion practices and organization of the Family court. Pre: placement in ENG 100. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 210	Juvenile Justice	3	ENG 102 Prerequisite ENG 100 Prerequisite	This course focuses on principles and procedures of arrest, detention, petition, summons, records, and adjudication of the juvenile offender. It introduces the organization and function of the police juvenile unit, community diversion practices and organization of the Family Court.
HON	AJ 210	Juvenile Justice	3	AJ 101 Completed or Concurrent	This course provides the administration of justice student with a basic and practical understanding of the legal principles involved in juvenile delinquency problems. Analysis of legislative and judicial responses to juvenile behavioral problems provide realistic and meaningful insights into the functioning of the juvenile justice processes. (3 hrs. lect. per week)
MAU	AJ 210	Juvenile Justice	3	AJ 101 w/ D ENG 22 w/ C or place ENG 100	Studies principles and procedures of arrest, detention, petition, summons, records and adjudication of juvenile offenders. Introduces organization and function of the police juvenile unit, community diversion practices, and organization of the Family Court. Reviews Hawai'i statutes and United States Supreme Court decisions affecting juvenile rights of due process. Considers societal context of juvenile problems, delinquency prevention, and treatment.
UHH	AJ 220	Constitutional Law	3	AJ 101	The U.S. Constitution is examined as a basis of arrest, search, seizure, interrogation, use of force and civil rights. U.S. Supreme Court cases and Hawai'i Court cases are examined to illustrate the court's interpretive process. Pre: AJ 101. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 220	Constitutional Law	3	AJ 101, Minimum Grade of D	The U.S. Constitution is examined as a basis of arrest, search, seizure, interrogation, use of force and civil rights. U.S. Supreme Court cases and Hawai'i Court cases are examined to illustrate the court's interpretive process.
HON	AJ 220	Constitutional Law	3	AJ 101 Completed or Concurrent	This course provides an overview of the development of the doctrines of federalism, separation of powers, and checks and balances theories as well as judicial review. Specific topics include sources of federal legislative power, commerce, taxing, spending, presidential and military powers, power of states to regulate and tax interstate commerce, preemption, the due process clause of the Fourteenth Amendment, equal protection, and First Amendment rights. Selected Supreme Court cases interpreting the U.S. Constitution are also examined. (3 hrs. lect. per week)
UHH	AJ 221	Criminal Law	3		Studies history and philosophy of criminal law. Examines United States Constitution, especially the Bill of Rights. Considers nature of law, legal institutions, criminal court procedures, and offenses against persons and property. Includes case briefs. Pre: AJ 101. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.

HAW	AJ 221	Criminal Law	3	AJ 101, Minimum Grade of D	Studies history and philosophy of criminal law. Examines United States Constitution, especially the Bill of Rights. Considers nature of law, legal institutions, criminal court procedures, and offenses against persons and property. Includes case briefs.
HON	AJ 221	Criminal Law	3	AJ 101 Completed or Concurrent	This course examines society's control of unwanted behavior through law. The particular focus is on the general principles of substantive criminal law. Topics include principles of criminal liability - actus reus, mens rea, causation, uncompleted crimes, and criminal defenses. General elements of crimes are covered including crimes against persons, habitation, property, and public order and morals. Applicable provisions of the Hawai'i Penal Code will also be discussed. (3 hrs. lect. per week)
MAU	AJ 221	Criminal Law	3	ENG 22 w/ C or place ENG 100	Studies history and philosophy of criminal law. Examines United States Constitution, especially the Bill of Rights. Considers nature of law, legal institutions, criminal court procedures, offenses against persons and property. Includes case briefs.
HON	AJ 224	Rules of Evidence	3	AJ 101 Completed or Concurrent	This course is a thorough study of evidence rules with specific emphasis on the application of these rules in preparing and presenting evidence. This includes a discussion of the history and approach to the study of evidence, proof by evidence and substitutes. General admissibility tests, evidence by witness testimony, documents and real evidence are examined. (3 hrs. lect. per week)
MAU	AJ 224	Rules of Evidence	3	-	Considers origin, development, philosophy, kinds and degrees of evidence. Surveys pertinent federal constitutional amendments, landmark Supreme Court decisions affecting the admissibility of evidence, and changes in Federal and Hawai'i case law. Case briefs.
HAW	AJ 230	Prevention Specialist	3	ENG 102 Prerequisite ENG 100 Prerequisite	Cross-listed with HSer 230 and Subs 230 Recommended: AJ 210 or HSer 110 or HSer/Subs 245 This course provides education and training for students interested in pursuing careers as community-based Prevention Specialists, and for in-service administration of justice, human services and substance abuse counseling professionals seeking to upgrade their knowledge and skills in community-based prevention programs for youth and families. Students who successfully complete AJ/HSer/Subs 230 with a "C" or better grade are eligible to receive 45 hours of prevention studies education from the State of Hawai'i Department of Health - Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division towards Prevention Specialist Certification.
HON	AJ 230	Prin of Police Supervision	3	AJ Completed or Concurrent	This course will cover such essentials as the function of the supervisor in organization and management, elements of leadership, the training function, instructional process, personnel evaluation systems, and personnel complaint investigation and techniques. (3 hrs. lect. per week)
MAU	AJ 230	Princ Police Supervision	3	ENG 22 w/ C or place ENG 100	Analyzes supervisor's function and principles of organization and personnel management. Stresses communication, training, disciplines, psychology of supervision, essentials of leadership, promotion methods, and selection of supervisors.
UHH	AJ 233	Police Organization & Mgmt	3	Complete ENG 100 (T/H)	This course studies the principles of organization and administration of policing. Overviews of operations and activities of various divisions, bureaus, training and selection procedures, planning, and research are discussed. Pre: placement in ENG 100. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 233	Police Organization & Mgt	3	ENG 102 Prerequisite ENG 100 Prerequisite	This course studies the principles of organization and administration of policing. UHH	AJ 234	Police and Community Relations	3	Complete ENG 100 (T/H)	This course acquaints the student with the role of police in government and the critical importance of effective community relations. The dynamics of race relations and other current social problems that directly relate to the law enforcement community are explored. Pre: placement in ENG 100. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.

The course will focus on such areas as the history and philosophy of corrections, the role of the correctional officer, legal aspects of corrections, communication and writing skills, as well as basic security procedures. Pre: AJ 101 and AJ 150. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 250	Corrections Procedures	3	AJ 101, Minimum Grade of D and AJ 150, Minimum Grade of D	This course will provide students with the basic training skills necessary to enhance their opportunities to secure a job in the high demand field of corrections. The course will focus on such areas as the history and philosophy of corrections, the role of the correctional officer, legal aspects of corrections, communication and writing skills, as well as basic security procedures.

UHH	AJ 280	Current Issues	3	C or better ENG/ESL 100 (T/H) AJ 101	Examination of recent textual materials, government reports, and problems within the criminal justice system and how it affects change within American society and the world. Includes preparation of a formal research essay. Pre: AJ 101 and ENG 100. Offered in conjunction with Hawai'i Community College.
HAW	AJ 280	Current Issues in AJ	3	AJ 101, Minimum Grade of D and ENG 100, Minimum Grade of D	Examination of recent textual materials, government reports, and problems within the criminal justice system and how it affects change within American society and the world. Includes preparation of a formal research essay.
HON	AJ 280	Issues in Admin of Justice	3	AJ 101 Completed or Concurrent	This course is an exploration of issues related to the study of the administration of justice. Students will define, select, research, and examine these issues, then discuss the various viewpoints thereby conducting a thorough probe of important and controversial issues facing the justice professions. (3 hrs. lect. per week)
