Course Description: Elementary Accounting I is a fast pace introductory course designed to provide students with a basic knowledge of financial accounting theories. Students will learn how to record, report and analyze financial information through the understanding of the various methods used to valuate, recognize and document financial transactions. Through this course your will also learn what role Accounting plays in a general business environment and how to use such information to better manage a business. It is recommended that you should take the both ACC201 and ACC202 in the same college or university.

Student Learning Outcome:

Upon completing this course, students should be able to:

- Acquire a general understanding of Accounting and the many different types of related occupations.
- Demonstrate an understanding of various basic accounting transactions formats.
- Read and understand financial statements including income statements and balance sheet.
- Perform basic accounting functions and analysis including journal entries, bank reconciliation and the compilation of financial statements.
- Interpret financial data and record such transactions in a journal entry format.
- Organize and summarize financial transactions into meaningful information for the external users.
- Analyze the financial strength of a company via financial ratios.

Required Textbook:

Both ACC201 and ACC202 will be using: <u>Horngren - Financial and Managerial Accounting</u>, 3/e, published by Pearson. There are three purchase options:

- 1. Hardcopy textbook with MyAccounting Lab access can be purchased at the HCC bookstore. Use the access code inside the textbook, and follow the directions on the "How to register on My Accounting Lab" document on Laulima to register. You will need to first register as a student and then enroll in this course ID in order to see this course. All homework and quiz assignments are already set up and so you can see all of them as soon as you are enroll properly. The online access is good for 1 year so you will be using the same access for both 201 &202.
- 2. For a discounted price, you can purchase the etext with MyAccounting Lab access. The online access is good for 1 year so you can use it for both 201 and 202. Follow the

directions on the "How to register on My Accounting Lab" worksheet on Laulima. Once you get to the website, you will be asked whether you have an access code. Since you don't have an access code, you will purchase one online. When you enter the course ID, it will take you to the correct book to purchase. Choose "Purchase with eText".

3. If you already have the textbook. You can just purchase the online access. Follow the directions on the "How to register on My Accounting Lab" worksheet on Laulima. Once you get to the website, you will be asked whether you have an access code. Since you don't have an access code, you will purchase one online. Homework Assignments:

Accounting knowledge is fostered through repetitive exercises. Each chapter is built upon the previous one. Therefore it is very important that you complete all your homework assignments in a chronological order. All homework assignments must be

submitted on the final deadline set on MyAccountingLab. The completed homework will be counted towards your homework grade. These are not graded but you must complete ALL problems in each assignment in order to receive full credit for each chapter. Late assignments will not be accepted. Please don't feel pressure to get everything correct in the homework, as there is no time limit and there are unlimited tries. The idea is to have you practice and understand the chapter materials through practicing the homework problems as many times as you need.

Quizzes:

There is a quiz for each chapter. In order to complete each quiz, you must complete the chapter's homework as well as the quiz from the previous chapter. Quiz is graded and will be added to the overall grade. Quizzes have no time limit but you will only get two tries.

Proctored Examination:

It is the university policy that students must take one proctored examination at a testing center of your choice. You MUST let me know where you will be taking the final exam by the first week of class, so I can make arrangements with the proper personnel at that particular testing center. This will be a <u>timed</u> exam consist of problems that are based on homework assignments. Additional information will be available on Laulima by midsemester.
