It is a pleasure to share with you the 2004 opening fall enrollments at all campuses of the University of Hawai'i system. These preliminary opening credit enrollment figures show that the University system enrollment of 50,802 remains steady (+37, or $+0.1 \%$ ) at a level comparable to last fall. The UH system has experienced enrollment increases since fall 2001.

These enrollment figures are ready for distribution. Draft press comments are enclosed for use as appropriate.

## FALL 2004 OPENING ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

University of Hawai'i enrollments have remained steady. Preliminary opening credit enrollment figures indicate that 50,802 students have registered for classes on all campuses of the University of Hawai'i. This number reflects 37 , or 0.1 percent more student enrollments than at a comparable date in fall 2003. While the majority of twoyear campuses experienced decreases in enrollment, the reductions were offset by increases at the four-year campuses, with Mānoa posting the largest numeric gain.

It is expected that another 29,000 students will be enrolling in non-credit programs throughout the UH system, bringing the total enrollment to nearly 80,000.

## Highlights:

! UH system enrollment has increased since fall 2001.
! UH Mānoa's enrollment stands at $20,463,721$ or $3.7 \%$ more students than at a comparable date in fall 2003.
! UH Hilo's opening fall enrollment grew slightly to 3,365, with an increase of 25 students, or 0.7\%.
! UH West O‘ahu's opening credit enrollment increased to 847, with a gain of 26 (3.2\%) compared to a year ago.
! UH Community College enrollment stands at 26,127, a decrease of $2.7 \%$. Six campuses reported decreases ranging from $0.2 \%-9.1 \%$ (Maui and Kaua'i, respectively). Hawai'i reported the only increase at $4.1 \%$.
! The Mānoa campus posted the largest numerical gain with 721 students.
! The greatest percentage gains in enrollments were at the University campuses at Hawaíi (4.1\%), Mānoa (3.7\%), and West O‘ahu (3.2\%).
