#### SUBJECT: PRELIMINARY OPENING FALL 2005 ENROLLMENTS—ALL CREDIT PROGRAMS

It is a pleasure to share with you the 2005 opening fall enrollments at all campuses of the University of Hawai'i system. These preliminary opening credit enrollment figures show that the University system enrollment of 50,309 remains fairly comparable (-493, or -1.0%) to last fall. The UH system has experienced enrollment increases annually since fall 2001 before leveling off in fall 2005.

These enrollment figures are ready for distribution. Draft press comments are enclosed for use as appropriate.

## FALL 2005 OPENING ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

University of Hawai'i enrollments have remained fairly stable the past several years. Preliminary opening credit enrollment figures indicate that 50,309 students have registered for classes on all campuses of the University of Hawai'i. This number reflects 493, or 1.0 percent fewer student enrollments than at a comparable date in 2004. The two-year campuses experienced modest decreases in enrollment, while enrollments at the four-year campuses experienced slight increases from last year.

Separately, more than 25,000 registrations in non-credit programs are expected throughout the UH system.

## **Highlights:**

- UH system enrollment has leveled off after experiencing increases from fall 2001.
- UH Mānoa's enrollment stands at 20,619, 156 or 0.8% more students than at a comparable date in fall 2004.
- UH Hilo's opening fall enrollment increased to 3,431, with a gain of 66 students, or 2.0%.
- UH West O'ahu's opening credit enrollment increased to 869, with a gain of 22 (2.6%) compared to a year ago.
- UH Community College enrollment stands at 25,390, a decrease of 2.8%. All seven campuses reported decreases ranging from 0.4%–4.5%.
- The largest numerical increases/decreases were fairly modest, with Mānoa experiencing the largest increase (+156) and Leeward experiencing the largest decrease (-262).
- Likewise, the largest percentage increases/decreases were fairly modest, with West O'ahu experiencing the largest increase (+2.6%) and Honolulu experiencing the largest decrease (-4.5%).


