CREDIT PROGRAMS

I am pleased to announce that the Spring 2010 opening enrollment for the University of Hawai'i system reached an all-time record of 55,761—the highest spring enrollment in the institution's history. The previous opening enrollment high for spring was in 2009 at 50,952. The 2010 preliminary opening credit enrollment figures increased by 4,809 students (9.4%) compared to Spring 2009 and by 7,515 (15.6%) compared to Spring 2008.

These enrollment figures are ready for distribution. Draft highlights for a press release are enclosed for use as appropriate.

SPRING 2010 OPENING ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

University of Hawai'i spring enrollments increased at all ten campuses. Preliminary opening credit enrollment figures indicate that 55,761 students have registered for classes on all campuses of the University of Hawai'i. This number reflects 4,809, or 9.4 percent more student enrollments than at a comparable date in Spring 2009.

Separately, more than 27,000 registrations in non-credit programs are expected throughout the UH system.

Highlights:

- UH system enrollment has increased for a third straight year after experiencing two years of decreases in 2006 and 2007.
- UH Mānoa posted a slight increase in Spring 2010. The other nine campuses experienced a wide range of increases from 5.1% to 24.3%.
- UH Mānoa's enrollment stands at 19,286, with 518 or 2.8% more students than at a comparable date in Spring 2009.
- UH Hilo's opening spring enrollment increased to 3,864, with a gain of 187 students or 5.1%, relative to a year ago.
- UH West O'ahu's enrollment stands at 1,278, an increase of 132 (11.5%) over the previous year.
- UH Community College enrollment increased to 31,333, up by 3,972 (14.5%) from Spring 2009.
- The largest numerical increases were at Kapi'olani CC (+880), Maui CC (+769), and Leeward CC (+752).
- The largest percentage increases were at Windward CC (+24.3%), Maui CC (+23.2%), and Kaua'i CC (+21.6%).
