**CREDIT PROGRAMS** 

It is a pleasure to share with you the 2005 opening spring enrollments at all campuses of the University of Hawai'i system. These preliminary opening credit enrollment figures show that the University system enrollment of 47,479 is 665 or 1.4% more than at a comparable date last spring. The UH system has experienced enrollment increases since spring 2002.

These enrollment figures are ready for distribution. Draft press comments are enclosed for use as appropriate.

#### **SPRING 2005 OPENING ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS**

University of Hawai'i enrollments are up at four of the ten campuses. Preliminary opening credit enrollment figures indicate that 47,479 students have registered for classes on all campuses of the University of Hawai'i. This number reflects 665, or 1.4 percent more student enrollments than at a comparable date in spring 2004.

It is expected that another 34,000 students will be enrolling in non-credit programs throughout the UH system, bringing the total enrollment to more than 81,000.

#### **Highlights:**

- UH system enrollment has increased since spring 2002.
- UH Mānoa's enrollment stands at 19,161, 713 or 3.9% more students than at a comparable date in spring 2004.
- UH Hilo's opening spring enrollment stands at 3,216, an increase of 99 students or 3.2%.
- UH-West O'ahu's opening credit enrollment stands at 805, decreasing by 20 (-2.4%) compared to a year ago.
- UH Community College enrollment stands at 24,297, down slightly by 0.5%. Only two of seven community college campuses, Hawai'i and Maui, reported increases of 7.9% and 2.7%, respectively. The remaining campuses reported decreases ranging from -0.6% to -3.7%.
- In total, four of ten University campuses experienced enrollment increases. The Mānoa campus posted the largest numerical gain with 713 students. Other campuses were Hawaii CC (171), Hilo (99), and Maui CC (74).
- Hawai'i CC experienced the greatest percentage gain in enrollment (7.9%).
- Leeward CC experienced the greatest decrease in enrollment (-214, -3.7%).
- There are over 41,000 undergraduate and 6,000 graduate students attending UH in spring 2005.
