Testimony in Opposition (Majority)

1. Impact on access and enrollments
2. Use of the increased revenues
3. Amount of the information technology fee
4. Cost of living differential
5. Cost-saving measures

Testimony in Support/Neutral (Minority)

1. Understand the need to increase, but
“too much too fast”
2. Want increased services and quality
3. UH a bargain compared to mainland
4. Pride in “paying my share”

Issues for Consideration

- Rate of proposed increase
- Amount of proposed IT fee
- Relevance of cost of living differential
- Cost share of non-resident tuition
- Non-need based aid
- State appropriations for biennium
