

CHAPTER 11

MISCELLANEOUS

Section 11-1 Community Fund Drives

With respect to participation in fund drives for support of community health and welfare agencies, the President shall have the authority to determine the community fund drives in which the University will participate. (May 12, 1966; am: Apr. 20, 2006)

Section 11-2 Outside Speakers on Campus.

“Balance” in political and other public lectures on campus by persons not connected with the University shall be maintained. (May 21, 1964)

Section 11-3 Sale or Consumption of Liquor on Campus.

The President shall have the authority to determine and establish policies on the sale or consumption of liquor for each of the campuses in the University of Hawai'i system and that the sale or consumption of liquor at the campuses will not be permitted until the Executive Officer establishes such policies. (Mar. 8, 1973)

Section 11-4 Naming of Campus Improvements and Academic Programs.

- a. The authority for the naming of buildings, facilities, roads and academic programs on the campuses of the University of Hawai'i shall reside with the Board of Regents.
- b. Buildings, other facilities, roads and programs will not be named for living individuals and ordinarily not before five years following the person's death, except as specifically provided by law, or when approved by the Board in special and well-justified cases. (am: Oct. 20, 2005)
- c. Persons for whom facilities, or programs may be named must have been actively connected with the University, or must have established from Hawai'i a position of national or international reputation in public service, preferably in higher education.
- d. Classrooms, laboratory buildings and academic programs normally shall be named for distinguished faculty members, administrators, Regents, other public servants and others who have been directly involved with the University for a substantial period of time or who have made a significant contribution to its academic and cultural life. Description and functional titles may be given if so desired by the particular campus faculty, students and staff, as provided herein.

- e. Dormitories, residences, and roads, unless provided for otherwise in the case of private donations or property, shall customarily be designated with appropriate Hawaiian words.
- f. Other existing and contemplated miscellaneous structures and areas of campus, when names are necessary, may be given descriptive or functional titles.
- g. Each Chancellor shall develop and announce procedures to be utilized in developing recommendations to be sent to the Board of Regents when other than a functional name is to be recommended for a building, facility, or academic programs.
- h. In appropriate circumstances, rooms or other quarters in a building may be named to honor major donors to the University of Hawai'i, or to the University of Hawai'i Foundation, in support of the University or its programs and activities. (Oct. 11, 1962; Oct. 29, 1970; July 14, 1972; May 13, 1976; Oct. 20, 1978; Nov. 9, 1979; am: Oct. 18, 2002) Cross Reference: Section 5-1a (4).

Section 11-5 Selling and Soliciting.

Selling of goods and/or services and soliciting on the campuses or in the buildings of the University of Hawai'i shall be prohibited without the permission of the Board of Regents. The President shall be authorized to represent the Board in granting permission when desirable. Proper and fair bidding procedures, when appropriate, shall be followed in granting selling permission at the University. (July 12, 1933; am: Oct. 18, 2002)

Section 11-6 Public Health and Safety.

Matters of health and safety that affect the general public also affect the University community. In turn, successful achievement of the University's teaching, research and service missions requires an environment that is conducive to the general safety and well being of students and employees. Therefore, the President is authorized to establish administrative policies and procedures that address matters affecting the health and safety of the University community including, but not limited to, infectious communicable diseases. Measures taken should stress a positive, preventive approach and be consistent with the University's mission and role as an institution of higher education. (June 19, 1987)

Section 11-7 Other Awards and Recognitions.

Awards, recognition, and honors given in an official capacity from or on behalf of the University or its subunits must be established by the Board. The President is

authorized to develop guidelines on the criteria and process in granting such awards once established by the Board. (ad: Oct. 18, 2002)
