Summary of Data from the Student Survey on Sexual and Relationship Violence  
Honolulu CC, Spring 2006

15 lecture classes (with  $\geq 25$  students each) surveyed  
241 responses usable for analysis  
121 female responses  
120 male responses

MALE RESPONSES

Partner Violence

12 male respondents reported experiencing partner violence since starting school at Honolulu CC.

Of these males:

1 reported it happening on campus	1 said it happened 2 times
6 told no one	1 said it happened 5 or more times
1 reported it to police	10 were not sure how many times
0 reported it to campus security	
1 reported it to Honolulu CC staff/faculty	

Survey Definition: Partner violence is when your boy/girlfriend, husband/wife, date, lover and/or special friend are abusive to you. This can include verbal abuse (like name calling or put downs), physical abuse (like hitting, slapping or pushing) and/or emotional/mental abuse (like threatening you or your family, controls who you see/talk to, controls the money, and/or drives carelessly with you in the car).

Stalking

6 male respondents reported being stalked since starting school at Honolulu CC. Of these males:

0 reported it happening on campus	1 said it happened one time
0 told no one	1 said it happened 4 times
0 reported it to police	1 said it happened 5 or more times
0 reported it to campus security	1 was not sure how many times
0 reported it to Honolulu CC staff/faculty	

Survey Definition: Stalking is when someone you know or do not know repeatedly follows you, watches you, calls, writes, e-mails or communicates with you in ways that are unwanted, seem obsessive and/or makes you feel afraid or concerned for your safety.

Rape

1 male respondent reported being raped since starting school at Honolulu CC. For this male:

0 reported it happening on campus	1 was not sure how many times
0 reported it to police	
0 reported it to campus security	
0 reported it to Honolulu CC staff/faculty	

Survey Definition: Rape is when someone forces you to have oral, anal or vaginal sex. It includes putting a penis in your mouth, vagina or anus and/or putting a finger or object (like a bottle) in your vagina or anus - against your will. It also includes someone putting their mouth on your vagina, penis or anus and/or someone forcing you to put your mouth on their penis, vagina or anus - against your will.

Sexual Assault

2 male respondents reported being sexually assaulted since starting school at Honolulu CC.

Of these males:

0 reported it happening on campus	2 were not sure how many times
1 told no one	
0 reported it to police	
0 reported it to campus security	

0 reported it to Honolulu CC staff/faculty

Survey Definition: Sexual assault is unwanted touching of a sexual nature like forced kissing, touching of private parts, grabbing, fondling and/or rubbing up against you in a sexual way, even if it is over your clothes.
