



## Physical Education Index via CSA

### How to Search for Articles

To find articles on a topic:

1. On the **Science & Technology Database** web page, [www.hawaii.edu/sciref/databases](http://www.hawaii.edu/sciref/databases), click **Physical Education Index**, and then click **Physical Education Index** again on the Electronic Resources page.  
**NOTE:** If you are off campus, you need to log into your UH account
2. In the **Search Box**, enter the terms for the topic, author name, or publication name, etc.  
If you have more search terms to add:
  - Select an operator (**and**, **or**) from the drop down menu
  - Enter the additional term(s) in the search box
3. Use the drop down menus to change the search fields if necessary. You can search by Author, Title, Keyword, Publication, etc or can leave it at the default, Anywhere.
4. Click **Search**

## Search Tools

### Boolean Operators

<b>and</b>	Narrows the search. Retrieves records with <u>every</u> term entered in the search. <b>(soccer AND hawaii)</b> will find <u>both</u> words
<b>or</b>	Expands the search. Retrieves records with <u>any</u> term entered in the search. <b>(soccer OR football)</b> will find <u>either</u> word

### Searching Symbols

<b>*</b>	Add the truncation symbol (an asterisk) to a root word to find variant words. <b>bicycl*</b> finds <b>bicycle, bicycles, bicycling...</b>
<b>?</b>	Substitute ? for a letter to find variant words. <b>wom?n</b> finds <b>woman, women</b>
<b>“ ”</b>	To find a specific phrase, use quotation marks around the terms. <b>“anaerobic training”</b> finds the exact phrase
