#### Frequently Asked Questions

#### 1. Am I required to attend an orientation session?

To register for UHMC fall 2011 classes, attendance is required for all incoming Maui County 2011 High School graduates. You will not be able to register for your classes unless you attend the NSO. Don't miss this opportunity to learn all you can before that important first day of classes. NSO is provided for you to be successful in college.

#### 2. What will orientation be like?

NSO provides the tools you will need to understand your responsibilities as a first time college student. The NSO program provides a variety of learning experiences to help you prepare for the fall 2011 semester. There will be both large and small group discussions and activities. You will also meet peers, staff, instructors, and counselors and have many opportunities to ask questions.

#### 3. Must I stay for the entire session?

Yes. Students need to attend the entire NSO session in order to register for classes.

	omplete health clearance requirements by submitting the following to the Hamiltonian Hamil		
	<ol> <li>Tuberculosis (TB) clearance—TB clearance must be dated within 1 year of the first day of semester and clearly state that the skin test or chest x-ray was negative. TB test or chest x-rays must be done in the continental U.S., Alaska, or Hawai'i. Tests or x-rays done anywhere else will not be acceptable. Please refer to UHMC Health Form.</li> </ol>		
	2. Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) immunization—Proof of two doses of the Measles vaccine, at least one which must be Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR) vaccine. Vaccines should be one month apart, given on or after January 1, 1968; and on/or after the student's first birthday; or proof of positive Measles Mumps Rubella (MMR) IgG blood test report if student had diseases. Please refer to UH Maui College Health Form.
