Eric Paul Shaffer is author of five poetry books, including *Lāhaina Noon: Nā Mele O Maui*, *Living At The Monastery*, *Working In The Kitchen*, *Portable Planet*, and *RattleSnake Rider*. He is also the author of three poetry chapbooks, and his poetry has appeared in 11 anthologies in the United States and Europe. More than 350 of his poems appear in more than 200 local, national, and international reviews, including the USA's *Slate*, *North American Review*, *The Sun Magazine*, *Ploughshares*, *RATTLE*, and *Threepenny Review*. Among his several awards are the Lorin Tarr Gill Poetry Competition, First Place, HPU's James M. Vaughan Award for Poetry, the Ka Palapala Po'okela Book Award, and the Elliot Cades Award for Literature (Established Writer in Hawai'i). He has published a novel and two fiction chapbooks, and is Assistant Professor in Literature and Composition at Honolulu Community College.
