Part I: A Practical Guide for Faculty & Instructors will provide an overview of some major components of course development and demonstrate how curriculum guides the course design process. Focusing on three questions, i.e. who, what, and how, this session will guide participants in prioritizing students' learning, selecting course content in accordance with learning outcomes, and customizing teaching methods and assignments for learner needs. Curriculum Studies Professor Patricia Halagao will take the participants through steps of course planning and offer a roadmap for designing a new course.

Participants will:

- Workshop a working syllabus draft

- Brainstorm a culminating assignment related to achieving a general set of skills and/or applying achieved skills to real life situations.
