



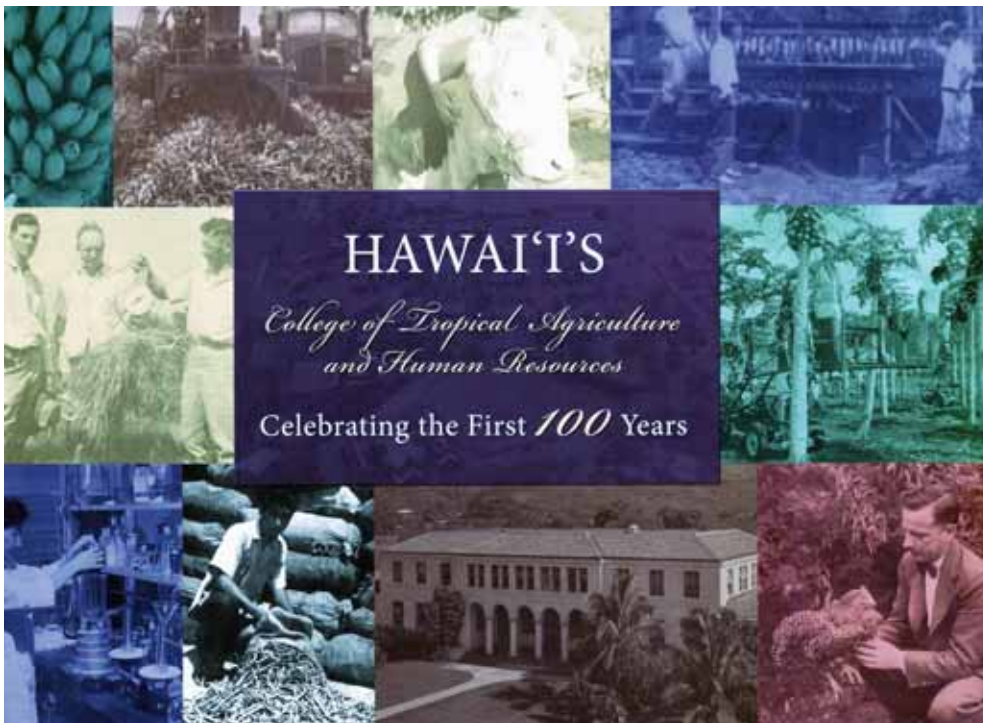

# CTAHR: 100 Years and/of Growing

The College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources, the founding college of the University of Hawai'i, was 100 years old on March 23, 2007, the 100th anniversary of the signing of the act that established the College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts of the Territory of Hawaii. Since the first five students in Willis T. Pope's college preparatory class met in February 1908, the college has graduated over 10,000 students. To commemorate CTAHR's first century, and inaugurate its second, editors Barry Brennan and James Hollyer—with 78 of their current and former colleagues—have written and assembled over ninety articles and hundreds of photographs in a volume chronicling a hundred years of dedicated service to the University's land grant mission of bringing research, education, and extension service to Hawai'i's people.
