Meeting Notes

March 12, 2008 (10AM-3PM): Yap Conference Room, Hamilton Library, UH Manoa

- **Minutes** from the February 2008 meeting were approved.
- The new **Halawai** system will be used for the April meeting teleconferencing. We should all try using it before then. It works best with Firefox.
- The UHLILC **Laulima** account is almost all set up (thanks to KEVIN). All committee members are able to share authoring and should upload relevant materials and add to the content of the site.
- ELLEN graciously offered to be chair of the UHLILC committee for 2008-2009 and MARGOT volunteered to be note-taker.
- MARGOT outlined the upcoming 2 hour information literacy workshop to be presented for the UHWO campus Faculty Senate in April. KEVIN and RANDY will be the other two presenters. RANDY will speak on information literacy and KEVIN will introduce LILO. MARGOT will lead a discussion with participants on problems faced in the classroom and best practices involving information literacy.
- MARGOT also asked for any work done on the assessment rubrics for LILO so that she can share that with faculty members at the workshop.
- TURNING POINT clickers were discussed as a possible technology for information literacy. Vicky Lebbin (UH Manoa) is using them for their ENG 100 info lit presentation.
- SCREENCASTS discussion (MARGOT and TARA) is tabled until the next meeting.
- The next in-person meeting will be held on Friday, May 16, at the Edwin H. Mookini Library at UH-Hilo. THORA, LARI-ANNE and CHUCK MALENFANT (Head of Public Services at UH-Hilo) will host the meeting. The focus of the meeting will be “Using Media Technology for Library Instruction” and everyone will be invited to share their expertise and experiences (including Camtasia, Captivate, Flash, Screencasting, etc.). RUTH-MARIE QUIRK will also be invited, since she has a lot of experience in this area.
- RANDY will follow-up on Yale Science LILO.

- DIANE suggested that UHLILC consider being involved in LIS 665 (User Education) next semester. Committee members can also consider offering an internship.
- A lengthy discussion about future enhancements for LILO followed. What direction do we want to go with LILO in order to serve a broader base of students and faculty? Suggestions included:
 - More audio and visual content
 - Reorganizing LILO so that users can find the parts they need easier
 - Allowing users to make choices in order to follow their own research structure
 - Reorganizing LILO by the type of research paper or project
 - Including more student collaboration (in videos and presentation)
 - Blogging, allowing visible user feedback
 - (more???)
- The group conceded that Assessment is still important and rubrics are useful. Work on these should be continued. Rubrics should be developed that can be used by faculty and students to measure competence in the major ACRL IL standards.
