II. Member Reports (round-robin)

A. Windward

1. Tara will be attending Writing Across the Curriculum
2. ENG 22 library component
  - a. Contacted by campus instructional developer who is looking at pre-100 level classes
  - b. ENG 22 library component would be a scaled back version of ENG 100 program
3. Plans to look at ways to scaffold information literacy at different levels
  - a. Interview instructors from different departments/levels to learn about their research assignments, expectations for their students, and where students are getting stuck in the research process
  - b. Email surveys may also be sent
  - c. Discussion of Narrowing Strategy assignment

1. Today was the last day of classes. Roberta co-taught Scholarly Research methods this semester.
2. The law school found it had a higher level of participation administering the paper surveys instead of using ecafe.

1. New Hawaiian Pacific Resources Librarian, Keahiahi Long
2. Leah is a member of the Writing Intensive Focus Board and is interested in data mining course syllabi for patterns
  - a. Study showed 58% of students who passed ENG 100 went on to take a WI class
  - b. Discussion on how to access syllabi; some campuses (e.g. Windward) have most of their course syllabi available online
3. Finals Countdown
  - a. The library has extended hours

- b. The library offers space for faculty to do review sessions; mental health workshops, etc.
    - c. Student government is in charge of various activities
- E. UH Hilo/Hawaii Community College
  - 1. Lari-Anne attended the UH Hilo/Hawaii Community College sponsored Reading Across the Disciplines workshop where she was able to connect with faculty from different departments and promote information literacy sessions
  - 2. UH Hilo will be assessing information literacy next year.
    - a. The campus assessment support committee will be testing the updated information literacy rubric this summer by assessing papers from various English classes ranging from 200-400 level before presenting it to the UH Hilo faculty congress
    - b. The campus will assess artefacts Spring 2016

  - 1. Last instruction of the semester with class that had multiple sessions
    - a. Instructor invites librarian at beginning of the semester and follows up with session later in the semester
    - b. The students in the class have access to laptops/notebooks to use during class
  - 2. Assessment Committee
    - a. History classes participated in the pre- and post-tests this semester
  - 3. Library closing for renovations this summer
    - a. Preparing students by promoting ebrary and other online resources
    - b. ISL usage may be up
- G. Kapiolani
  - 1. Joyce attended ACRL conference
  - 2. 3D printer will be launched in Fall
  - 3. Received a UH SEED grant to promote speakers and they also screened Kumu Hina
- H. JABSOM
  - 1. Residency Director asked Angela to do a boot camp on clinical questions for fourth year students next week in preparation for their residencies
  - 2. Instruction will begin again in July
- I. Honolulu
  - 1. Sarah will be attending ALA annual this summer
  - 2. Library collaborated with other departments/faculty to host workshops this semester
    - a. Workshops on the following topics: "Traditions in Romantic Love," a 3-person panel discussion focussed on the Pacific, Asia and Europe that had 80 attendees; Comic Books; and Reading Poetry
    - b. The library also co-sponsored the Wo Lecture with Manulani Meyer that was held in the cafeteria. She spoke on the difference between knowing, knowledge, and understanding. The workshop had around 65 attendees.

3. Library received an Achieving the Dream grant for 26 new computers that will be installed in the summer

1. Manoa Writing Program Working Group will present their recommendation on the future of the Manoa Writing Program to UHM administration. The Manoa Writing Program assists faculty with writing intensive classes, not to be confused with the Writing Center which assists students.
  2. Center for Teaching Excellence and the General Education Office are offering a workshop titled *Closing the Loop: Practical Applications for Core Competencies Assessment* on May 6.
  3. Jennifer Beamer was hired as Librarian II in the Business, Humanities, and Social Sciences Department.
- K. UH Manoa LIS
1. LIS is celebrating its 50th anniversary
    - a. Launching an annual lecture on September 13, 2015. The first speaker is Dean Emeritus Miles Jackson who will speak on libraries around the Pacific
    - b. LIS will ramp up its social media presence, including a YouTube channel
  2. Rae taught LIS 686 Information Literacy this semester. The syllabus is available on the LIS website
