

7. LABOR STANDARDS & PROTECTIONS

Labor and employment requirements to address as part of the deployment proposal:

- 1. Past record of compliance/violations with federal labor and employment laws
- 2. Plans to ensure compliance with federal labor and employment laws
- 3. Agreement by the subgrantee to adhere to commitments such as:
 - Wages and benefits
 - Using a skilled and credentialed workforce
 - Union neutrality
 - Local hire
 - Proper worker classification

9. MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (MBES) / WOMEN'S BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (WBES) / LABOR SURPLUS AREA FIRMS INCLUSION

When possible using minority, women-owned, labor surplus area businesses are recruited, used, and retained.

- RFP language that will encourage diverse participation from these businesses.
- Build relationships with minority, women-owned, labor surplus area businesses.
- Track how many awards are towards these businesses



10. COST AND BARRIER REDUCTION

- Promote the use of existing broadband infrastructure.
- Act 193 exemption of permitting for broadband related projects or 60-day automatic permit approval
- Promote the use of reliable alternative broadband technologies in cases of extreme high cost areas

The Initial Proposal is an output of the NTIA Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program. It is the "first draft" of the Final Proposal for BEAD grant funding, and, among other things, explains how Hawai'i ensures every resident has access to a reliable, affordable, and high-speed broadband connection.

Volume 1

Volume 1 of the Initial Proposal details how Hawai'i will execute the BEAD Challenge Process. Notably, this volume also defines community anchor institutions, outlines all Federal funding the State anticipates for broadband related projects, and features the list of unserved and underserved locations considered under the BEAD program.
