Introduction / Overview

- This presentation updates information previously presented to the Board of Regents on the Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF) to UH as part of federal coronavirus response funding. This is the ninth and final report made to the Board (first report in November 2020).
- This update includes all expenditures reported in conformance with federal reporting guidance through June 30, 2023. These reports are also available online (https://www.hawaii.edu/offices/government-relations/cares-act-grant-funds/).



Three COVID response packages that are providing funding to UH:

- CARES Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act
 - Signed into law on March 27, 2020
- 2. CRRSAA Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act
 - Signed into law on December 27, 2020
- 3. ARPA American Rescue Plan Act
 - Signed into law on March 11, 2021

The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) is the formula-funded support in all three packages; these are sometimes referred to as HEERF I, II and III.



Three Tranches of HEERF

- HEERF exists in each of the three coronavirus response packages, and within HEERF are three tranches, or groups of funds.
- CARES established the three tranches, but CRRSAA and ARPA added to and extended the deadlines for each tranche rather than create new tranches.

Tranche 1 (Student Grants) is to "...provide emergency financial aid grants to students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care."

Tranche 2 (Institutional Portion) may be used to "...cover any costs associated with significant changes to the delivery of instruction due to the coronavirus, so long as such costs do not include payment to contractors for the provision of preenrollment recruitment activities; endowments; or capital outlays associated with facilities related to athletics, sectarian instructions, or religious worship."

Tranche 3 (Minority-Serving Institutions) may be used to "...defray expenses (including lost revenue, reimbursement for expenses already incurred, technology costs associated with a transition to distance education, faculty and staff training, payroll) incurred by institutions of higher education and for grants to students for any component of the student's cost of attendance including food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care."

- Of the total \$244.7 million awarded to UH, \$238.5 million has been expended or given as student grants as of June 30, 2023, with a remaining balance of \$6.2 million. This balance represents 2.5% of the total amount awarded to UH.
- Although the grant expired as of June 30, 2023, federal guidelines allow 120 days to liquidate (disburse) all financial obligations. UH anticipates very little funds to remain after those 120 days. As of August 25, 2023, the unofficial remaining balance is \$3.3 million (1.33%).



Federal Expenditure Reports

- Expenditure reports are provided to the federal government on a quarterly basis for all Tranches.
- There are 21 different expenditure categories to report for each tranche of funds from each of the campuses.
- The following slides present the data provided to the federal government from the latest report (as of June 30, 2023).
- Any defined categories that did not have expenditures by any campus have been removed from the list for brevity.

- HEERF grants expired June 30, 2023, with the standard 120-day closeout period.
- HEERF funds were used to address COVID-19 related costs and revenue shortfalls, including the need for enhanced student support.
- Although some funds remain after the termination of the grant, UH expects to disburse virtually all of these funds within final 120 days. Currently only 1.33% of those funds remain (as of August 25th).
- This is the final planned report to the BOR related to these funds.
