



Process to Obtain Social Security Number (SSN), Hawaii Driver's License or State Identification Card

Social Security Number (SSN)	Hawaii Driver's License or State ID
<p>The Social Security Administration (SSA) will issue the SSN to international students who are eligible to work and who have an employment offer and legal presence verification from ISS. No fee applies. SSA recommends that F-1/J-1 students apply for a SSN after they have been in U.S. for 10 days and no earlier than 3 days after SEVIS record has been activated by ISS. Additionally, the SSA cannot process your application if your on-campus employment or Curricular Practical Training (CPT) begins more than 30 days from your application date; or the employment start date on your Employment Authorization Document (EAD) is a future date.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Completed and signed, On or Off-Campus Employment Verification letter(s) issued by employer and ISS (see item #1 above) OR I-20 form endorsed for CPT, OR EAD card issued by USCIS e. Completed SSN application: ssa.gov/online/ss-5.pdf <p>Upon application for a SS card, a receipt will be issued. Usually, the card will be mailed in approximately 10 business days. Contact the ISS for assistance if you have submitted your SSN application but do not receive your SSN within 4 weeks.</p>	<p>A Hawaii driver's license or State ID card can be issued to international students based on eligibility for the benefit AND documentation of identity and legal presence. Fees apply.
