Pamela Matson has been a pioneer in the field of Environmental Science. She was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 1992 and to the

National Academy of Sciences in 1994. In 1995, Dr. Matson was selected as a MacArthur Fellow, and in 1997 was elected a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. She is the Richard and Rhoda Goldman Professor in the Department of Geological and Environmental Sciences, and the Naramore Dean of the School of Earth Sciences at Stanford University. She currently serves as Past-President of the Ecological Society of America.
