She grew up in a multi-ethnic neighborhood in the Bronx (New York) and completed her last two years of high school in Central Florida. With an interest in social justice and cultural diversity, Dr. Hazzard served as a full- time volunteer for three years after graduating from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio; she worked with indigenous youth in Alaska and the Marshalls Islands.

As a graduate of the University of Hawai`i at Manoa's Master's in English as a Second Language program, Dr. Hazzard's interest in social justice expanded to education and teaching English in global contexts. She has had the opportunity to work with students and faculty from underrepresented groups in education, including those from small island developing states for whom English is a second language. Dr. Hazzard's work with culturally and linguistically diverse students and faculty includes Hawaii, the U.S. mainland, the Marshall Islands, and Antigua and Barbuda. Her 25 years of educational experience includes 20 years in the Pacific and encompasses teaching, advising, academic support, and residence life, in addition to faculty development and assessment coaching. She has worked in elementary education, secondary education, higher education, and medical education. Dr. Hazzard's scholarship interests include examining pedagogical and institutional factors which promote student success, particularly for diverse

students from underrepresented and under-resourced backgrounds.

Dr. Hazzard believes that student success requires a holistic approach to education, informed by dynamic institutional relationships, where students' academic procedural knowledge complements their content learning. She promotes developing students' sense of agency and advocacy to prepare students to be change agents in their communities and future professions.
