**SUBJECT: INFORMATION ITEM: REPORT ON CENTERS, 2003-2004**

In accordance with Board and Executive policy, I am pleased to transmit a report on the status of centers, institutes, and similar organizational units within the University. As the University has become more entrepreneurial and active in seeking and securing grants, the interest in establishing centers that focus resources and research efforts to meet special needs or deal with current issues has increased. These centers often serve as focal points to emphasize a strategic thrust of a college, school, or department.

This is the fourth annual report shared with the Board. Part One of this report provides a summary of centers established, discontinued, and reviewed during the current academic year. Part Two provides an inventory of centers. Excluding organized research institutes and administrative service and distance learning centers, the University system houses more than a hundred centers with a research, instruction, and/or public service purpose. Almost 79% of all centers are a part of UH Mānoa and 48% of these have primarily a research purpose. Forty-three percent of all centers at UH Mānoa have an instructional or multi-function purpose. The nine UH Hilo centers have primarily a public service purpose. The 13 centers at the UH Community Colleges and the one at UH West O'ahu have an instructional purpose.

The Chancellors and I would be pleased to respond to questions at the Board's convenience.

In accordance with Board of Regents Policy, Section 5-6 Establishment and Review of Centers (and Institutes) and Executive Policy E5.215, this annual report updates the Board on centers established, continuing, and discontinued during the 2003-2004 academic year (Part One) and provides an inventory of centers (Part Two).

Centers focus University expertise for research, instruction, or public service in a specific area. They are a means by which the University carries out its mission to serve the state and provide leadership nationally and internationally in selected areas. Organized research institutes, administrative service centers, and UH distance learning centers are not part of this report.

The BOR policy states that centers require BOR approval only when they: “(1) require significant current or future commitments of institutional funding, personnel, or physical resources, a substantive change in program mission, and/or involve major institutional liability; (2) involved Board or Presidential agreements with external governmental or private entities; and/or (3) involve an honorific name in the designation of the center.” All other centers may be approved by the President, who, in turn, has delegated authority to the Chancellors and allowed delegation to lower administrative levels. Chancellors are responsible for maintaining a master list of centers for their Unit.

For the academic year 2003-2004, the University of Hawai‘i housed 107 centers. Of the total, 29 centers (27%) were approved by the Board, while the rest were approved at various administrative levels or established to carry out the requirements of funded legislative mandates or to implement the conditions of grants and contracts. Sixty-three centers (59%) use no general funds, but are funded wholly from external sources or are self-supporting through fees for services. Only 10% (11 centers) are wholly funded from general funds, while the rest are not funded (8 centers) or use a combination of internal and external funds (25 centers).

Most of the centers are a part of the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa, 79%, or 84 centers; UH Hilo houses nine centers, the UH Community Colleges have a total of 13, and UH West O‘ahu has one. Details are provided in the inventory (Part Two). Together there are 41 research centers, 13 public service centers, and 53 instruction and multi-purpose centers.

During 2003-2004 two centers were terminated at UH Mānoa:

- **Marine Bioproducts Engineering Center** (MarBEC) in the School of Ocean and Earth Sciences and Technology (SOEST).
- **Academy of International Business** (AIB) – Executive Secretariat (CBA).

In addition, five of the centers were newly established at UH Mānoa and two centers underwent review. Details are shown in Part One.
