Testimony from the UHM Faculty Senate Executive Committee

Aloha,

Attached is a memo outlining the UHMFS concerns on getting a re-org proposal through the proper review/consultation process this semester. As far as we have been informed, based on the President's statement from the January BOR meeting, the SEC is still working under the assumption that the administration intends to see this implemented in July. If this is no longer the case, we ask the President to inform the UH Manoa Faculty Senate Executive Committee as soon as possible.

The current timeline does not appear to provide adequate time for Faculty Senate review, and so we conclude that this reorganization proposal cannot be implemented in July. We informed the President and Provost that the Faculty Senate would need to have the full completed proposal by February in order to review it. We have as yet not received such a proposal, and even proposed town halls have not yet been scheduled.

We are concerned that this reorganization is destabilizing, that faculty and staff are choosing to leave for other jobs or to retire over related concerns, and that there will be negative outcomes from the reorganization. Our concerns underscore the need for an adequate review period by MFS.

The April date you indicated to the BOR for the Snate review does not provide enough time for review and feedback for your targeted July 1, 2020 implementation. We have been expecting to see a reorganization propo al since September of 2019, and to date have seen nothing.

Michael Bruno promi ed that MFS would "not see anything seriou "sat the May meeting, due to the likelihood of extensive di cus ion and debate. If we are to consider a re clution at our April meeting, CAB need a minimum of 8 weeks to review, consider input from other committee , and form a re clution. Therefore, we reiterate that if we do not have a <u>final reorganization proposal</u> before February 14, 2020, it will not be po sible to conclude faculty con ultation before your intended implementation date of July 1, 2020.
