Capital Improvements Program Budget Request

The Governor's Recommended Executive Capital Improvements Program (CIP) Budget for Supplemental Year 2006-2007 includes two projects for the University of Hawai'i totaling \$251.553 million. The Governor's Recommended Budget includes \$43.000 million in general obligation bonds for a Systemwide project for Capital Renewal and Deferred Maintenance, and \$208.553 million in special funds and general obligation bonds for the development of the University of Hawai'i–West O'ahu in Kapolei. The following is a breakdown of the request and means of finance:

This project includes reroofing, mechanical and electrical systems, renovations, resurfacing, repainting, and other improvements and project costs to upgrade facilities at all University campuses. Facilities provide the centerpiece around which all other educational activities exist at higher education institutions. The total replacement value of all University of Hawaii facilities is estimated at \$1.6 billion. Therefore, it is imperative to reinvest in the University's physical plant to ensure that the physical infrastructure facilitates the mission of the institution.
