



3 years (associate's degree)






- Knowledge explosion (doubling every 10 years)

Unemployment rate in 2003




Median weekly earnings in 2003



NOTES: Unemployment and earnings for workers 25 and older, by educational attainment; earnings for full-time wage and salary workers




GEAR UP Scholars demonstrate effectiveness of early intervention & scholarship incentives

Key Program Components:


- Early Awareness
