CANCER CENTERS



 - Increase the number of funded researchers
 - Develop a clinical program



CRCH: Goals and Strategy

- Conduct research that is important to cancer patients in Hawaii, research that has a real impact in preventing and treating cancer in Hawaii.
- Make Hawaii the place where cancer investigators from the U.S. mainland, Asia, Australia and the Pacific Islands meet to establish scientific collaborations to fight cancer *together*.
- Renew our NCI grant and strengthen the consortium to eliminate the need for Hawaii cancer patients to travel to mainland for treatment.
