Testimony of MRC Greenwood, President, University of Hawai'i System

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Chair Nishimoto and members of the House Committee on Higher Education: Thank you for your continuing support of the University of Hawai'i and for this opportunity to present to you the biennium budget request approved by the University's Board of Regents last fall. I will also address the Executive budget. Joining me today are the chancellors from each of our 10 campuses, along with several other members of my leadership team.

I will begin by discussing how the current economic and fiscal conditions are affecting the University's operations. The economic downturn resulted in a reduction in the University's general fund appropriations of \$98 million in FY 2009-10. In FY 2010-11, that reduction was increased to \$108 million, representing a 23% decrease in the University's general fund budget from FY 2008-09. That level of reduction in funding is one of the largest in the nation among public universities.

With an all-time high enrollment exceeding 60,000 students in Fall 2010, as compared to approximately 50,000 students in Fall 2007, we are serving many more students with far fewer general funds. We have managed this by various means throughout our campuses. These include executive, faculty and staff wage cuts (with no loss of instructional days), enrollment management, fewer classes at certain campuses, larger class sizes, deferred hiring and hiring of lecturers to fill instructional positions, campus closures during winter and spring breaks, deferral of spending, and the use of tuitions and other non-general funds. In addition, the \$22 million annually of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) fiscal stabilization funds for education provided by the legislature has been instrumental in filling some of the reduction. However, this funding ends in FY 2010-11 and its replacement is critical. Currently the executive budget proposal only includes restoration of \$15.4 million of the \$22 million. Therefore part of our request approved by the Board of Regents is for the remaining \$6.6 million.

At the University we were able to attain the same effect as the state's furloughs through reductions in salaries with equivalent administrative leave on non-instructional days. Accordingly, the executive budget, in addition to the \$15.4 million for partial restoration of ARRA funds, includes \$25,719,982 for the University to restore its equivalent of state furloughs. While these are the only two general fund additions included in the executive budget for the University by the previous gubernatorial administration, we were allowed to submit additional requests to the new administration. These are presented in Table 7 of the budget briefing materials we have submitted in accordance with your instructions. These items reflect the additional requests approved by the University Board of Regents.

In order to more fully explain the background and support for our budget request and the process through which it was developed, we have provided as an attachment to this testimony, our "2011 -2013 Biennium Budget" PowerPoint document, which summarizes our presentation to the Board of Regents in support of the budget request. This document was provided to the previous administration and, as required by statute, at the same time to the legislature. While I would be glad to go through that document in detail, I will summarize and entertain questions.

In brief, while the University has sustained over \$200 million in general fund budget reductions in the current biennium, we believe that it is, nonetheless, not good enough to simply request restoration of general fund reductions. Rather, we have grounded our budget proposal upon previously developed strategic outcomes, particularly the three initiatives I presented last February in my address to a joint session of the legislature. These initiatives are: 1) Hawai'i Graduation Initiative which calls for increasing undergraduate, graduate and professional degrees and certificates awarded by 25% by FY 2015; 2) Initiative on Workforce Development and Technology Advancement; and 3) Project Renovate to Innovate.

A key aspect of the budget request is that a substantial portion of the new monies will be dependent upon the achievement of measurable strategic outcomes. In developing the methodology for such an outcome based funding allocation approach, we were guided by the work of the task force established by the legislature under Act 188, Session Laws of Hawai'i 2008 to make recommendations on a budgetary system with a funding formula for the distribution of fiscal resources to the University of Hawai'i campuses. The approach recommended by the task force was used for developing the outcome based funding and the enrollment funding portion of the University's budget request. Performance incentives are a key strategy to ensure that our campuses are rewarded for achieving the goals we committed to in the Hawai'i Graduation Initiative. The details of the methodology are explained and illustrated in the PowerPoint document.


The second part of the Board of Regents approved budget request is for the Initiative on Workforce Development and Technology Advancement. These are specific requests for funding, called Program Change Requests (PCRs), which are directly related to and expected to result in advancement of the initiative. These PCR requests are presented in the PowerPoint document and correspond to items in Table 7 of the materials for this budget briefing. Additional details for each PCR are provided in "Form A"s which were provided previously to the administration and the legislature. In addition, UH will be implementing a new approach to technology exchange, entrepreneurial training and building new fields of excellence in areas where promising opportunities exist.

As your public higher education system, UH has developed strong strategic directions grounded in the long term interests of the state of Hawai'i. We see progress toward the objectives in these two initiatives – increasing the number of educated citizens, meeting workforce shortages, contributing to research and innovation – as being critical to the future of Hawai'i. Our decisions to allocate or reallocate resources are, and will continue to be, guided by our strategic outcomes and what is important to the state of Hawai'i. But right now, in this economy, what Hawai'i needs is more jobs.

The third part of our budget request, a large portion of which is for "Project Renovate to Innovate", is our CIP budget request. A major portion of these funds are for health and safety, deferred maintenance and capital renewal. Accordingly, not only will these projects put our construction industry related workers back to work and aid the economic recovery, but these investments in our research facilities will help us compete for highly accomplished researchers, more research dollars, and increase our overhead recovery revenues on the grants that we obtain. The executive CIP budget, from the prior administration, presented in Table 18, reflects only \$35 million in each year of the biennium, primarily for health and safety projects, and a small portion of our capital renewal and deferred maintenance requests. Our Board of Regents approved request totals approximately \$719 million for sorely needed repairs and maintenance, major renovations, Project Renovate to Innovate, and shovel ready projects. The details are presented in Table 19 as well as our PowerPoint document.

A summary of all of our Board of Regents approved budget requests is presented on the last slide of our PowerPoint document. I and my leadership team will be glad to address any questions you may have regarding any of our budget requests, but first let me close by saying that we understand the fiscal realities within which the administration and legislature are operating. While decisions on priorities for funding are never simple, I believe that in these economic times, higher education is critical to the future, and that investing in UH has immediate returns. I believe that there is no better investment for short term gains and long term benefits for the citizens of Hawai'i. Investing in the UH is truly investing in the future of our state.


- The environmental context for budget building

Environmental Context



State General Fund Appropriations

- FY 2010
 - State appropriation reduced by \$46 million
 - Governor restricted additional \$52 million
 - 21% decrease to our general funds
- FY 2011
 - Executive Budget -- \$100 million reduction
 - Legislature appropriated an additional \$8 million reduction
 - More than a 23% decrease in General Funds compared to FY 2009




Internal Context

- All-time high in enrollment with 58,000 students, projected to exceed 60,000 in Fall 2010
- Executive, faculty & staff wage cuts (no loss of instructional days)
- Reduction in lecturers and other temporary staff
- Reduction in classes and support services
- Campuses closed during breaks



Other Factors

- American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Funds end
- Salaries of UHPA members reinstated; other salaries yet to be determined
- Currently in fifth year of a six year schedule of tuition increases; last year of scheduled increases will be the first year of the biennium; subsequent tuition yet to be determined



Council on Revenues Projections

- September 8, 2010 meeting:
 - Revised downward its forecast for State General Fund tax revenue growth for FY 2010-11 from a 6.2% increase to a 2.0 increase
- Projections for the first and second year of the biennium:
 - FY 2011-12: 10.0% increase
 - FY 2012-13: 6.0% increase
- Governor may further restrict funds depending upon subsequent Council on Revenues projections




Program, Policy, and Management Objectives, and Institutional Priorities

- Based on 2009 outcomes





Mahalo for the opportunity to update you on UH Mānoa's efforts to create educated citizens, generate research advances and serve our community. Like the rest of Hawai'i, we are still feeling the impact of the global recession, but our campus community – students, faculty, staff – are pulling together to get through these tough times and moving forward in a number of ways.

Our progress even in the face of challenges gives us reason to be optimistic, primarily because the Mānoa Experience is becoming more impressive and more widely known because of changes across the campus. Thanks to strong partnerships with the Legislature, donors and other community supporters, as well as collaborative relationships within UH Mānoa and with other UH campuses, UH Mānoa is leveraging that support and making significant strides towards our goal of enhancing UH Mānoa as a destination of choice, a global leading research university and a respectful, inclusive community.

Addressing workforce needs. Our budget request focuses on increasing opportunities for careers in engineering, medicine, social work and nursing – all involving UH collaborations and increased Native Hawaiian representation. For example, to advance “Renovate to Innovate,” last week we launched construction of the Translational Health Science Simulation Center, to enable UH Mānoa’s School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene to support the Statewide Consortium of nursing programs’ innovative approach to education that will improve access to bachelor’s degrees and shorten the time to graduation. This will enable students at Kaua'i Community College and UH Maui College to complete their fourth year of nursing study via distance technology.

Improving access and student success. We increased need-based scholarship support for students from tuition by \$1.7M this year and are also ensuring that eligible students apply for and secure Pell grants. Last year we enrolled almost 2,600 Native Hawaiian students and our freshman class is 14% Native Hawaiian. Specific programs contributing to that success include the School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene and the College of Engineering - each with over 100 Native Hawaiian and Pacific Island students. The College Opportunities Program for underserved groups continues to contribute to student success with increasing retention rates every year.

Focusing on teaching facilities with R&M. Our physical campus is beginning to reflect the benefits of the priority we established three years ago with legislative support - that is to upgrade our facilities. We are grateful for the significant legislative investment in R&M, thereby enabling the campus to assume a leadership role in energy reduction, sustainability, and job creation.

We have completed repairs on 37 leaky roofs, replaced mechanical systems and expanded energy conservation, which has made us a Hawai'i leader in energy savings. In the last 5 years, Mānoa has reduced its energy usage by 20% and is on track to meet the goal of reducing campus energy use by 50% by 2015. We're also working on modernizing our teaching facilities and equipment. Sustainability is an integral part of our projects. For example, we'll undertake major renovations to Kuykendall Hall this summer in collaboration with Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory with the aim of striving for a zero-carbon footprint building.

Mahalo for your support, which is critically important to our continued progress. By working together and investing resources in UH Mānoa, your university is providing tremendous benefits for all citizens of Hawai'i and the future of our State.

University of Hawai'i at Hilo
Chancellor Don Straney – January 2011

UH Hilo has distinguished itself by combining teaching, service and scholarship to improve the wellbeing and status of citizens on Hawai'i Island and across the state. We are the university with the primary responsibility for serving our island; our reach continues to grow beyond East Hawai'i to centers in other areas of our island. Our smaller classes are taught by full-time faculty who bring their research to student learning. On-campus labs are complemented by the island's vibrant "living laboratory" – making UH Hilo an ideal place to study astronomy, volcanology, marine science, indigenous language revitalization, and other fields. The College of Pharmacy and School of Nursing provide shared leadership to improve access to and quality of health care for our rural communities. We oversee the statewide Small Business Development Center and the Office of Mauna Kea Management, both of which are crucial to the State's economy and future. Lastly, we contribute to quality of life and a "university town" through our performing arts, athletic events, and cultural enrichment offerings.

UH Hilo's cumulative budget reduction now totals \$8.5 million, which is 24% of our FY 2008-09 general fund allocation. Yet, UH Hilo continues to specialize in serving students who are economically disadvantaged, first generation in college, and/or from underrepresented minority groups, including 22% who are Native Hawaiians. Half of our students are from Hawai'i Island (with a growing number from the other islands) and 70% are Hawai'i residents. We have coped with the cuts by reducing non-instructional programs for students, increasing extramural awards to \$27 million (from an average of about \$4 million/year in the 1990s), generating \$15 million in private gifts via the UH Centennial campaign, eliminating temporary positions, freezing civil service positions, and implementing collective bargaining salary reductions. More specifically:

- Our **Long Range Budget Planning Committee** has encouraged innovative budget efficiencies ranging from updating light fixtures to reducing energy consumption and consolidating service agreements. For example, we recently equipped a residence hall cafeteria to also serve as a large-capacity classroom during certain hours of the day. Similarly, we merged all of our various academic support services into one center and consolidated existing medical and counseling services into one unit to reduce overhead.
- Our **Enrollment Management Implementation Team** led efforts to offer fewer classes to more students in Falls of 2009 and 2010, with a higher seat fill-rate. We also generated more student semester hours. EMIT monitors and manages recruitment, admissions and registration efforts to generate incremental, manageable enrollment increases so that we can balance the University budget with tuition revenue.
- **Hiring of faculty positions were deferred** in such high demand fields as biology, chemistry, psychology, communications, and English; search processes to fill vacant positions in student affairs, administrative affairs and university relations were also delayed.
- **We protected certain priorities** to ensure health/safety and minimize institutional liability/risk. These included medical services, counseling services, campus security, classroom instruction, and essential repairs/maintenance. However, this meant that other departments received larger cuts proportionally.
- We are **generating new revenue streams** through entrepreneurial efforts, particularly at the 'Imiloa Astronomy Center, in the Office of Intercollegiate Athletics, and elsewhere across campus. Similarly, to fulfill capital construction project needs, we are pursuing private-public partnerships (in the case of new student residential facilities) and using revenue bonds (in the case of temporary buildings).

For every \$1.00 in state investment, UH Hilo generates an additional \$3.06 in direct expenditures. We infuse \$240 million per year into the local economy and provide 3,900 direct and indirect jobs.¹ Your continued support and investment will allow UH Hilo to continue serving our community in vital, meaningful and critical ways. Thank you for the opportunity to provide this testimony.

**University of Hawai'i – West O'ahu
Chancellor Gene Awakuni – January 2011**

As a developing campus, the economic downturn and resultant funding reduction significantly impacts UH West O'ahu's ability to roll-out the development of educational programs to accommodate the growth in student enrollment. With the completion of UH West O'ahu's Phase I campus in Kapolei and planned classes to begin at the new facilities in the Fall of 2012, this demand is expected to further tax educational and operating services of the campus.

UH West O'ahu (UHWO) sustained one of the highest enrollment growths in the system. Student enrollment has jumped 29%, from 1,140 students in 2008, to 1,471 students in 2010. This student growth in turn generates the need for additional program and course development, requiring additional faculty, classroom space and support costs. Internally, we are pursuing the following means to alternatively address these requirements:

- Hiring
 - Filling retired faculty positions with lecturers to meet instructional requirements
 - Increasing course loads of faculty and lecturers to teach more courses and course sections
- Alternatives to Delivering Campus Priorities
 - Doubling up on office space and utilizing conference rooms/faculty lounge as classrooms
 - Increasing on-line (in class and online offerings - 39% of UHWO sections are offered on-line; 50% of Business class sections, the largest major on campus are offered online)
 - Cancelling low enrolled elective courses that do not impact specific degree requirements
 - Cross-registering in general education courses (i.e. Introductory English, History) with Leeward Community College
- Controlled Discretionary Spending
 - Regular monitoring of discretionary spending by all program units

The financial downturn and the required budget reductions hinder the growth momentum of the campus. The need to defer hiring of instructional positions and additional general fund reductions impact our ability to move forward with the establishment of our secondary education and social work baccalaureate programs.

UHWO has been relatively small for quite some time, but it has emerged as a high quality, comprehensive university. We remain committed to providing an accessible, relatively low cost education especially to students in the Leeward and Central O'ahu areas to make their dream of obtaining a college education achievable.

With your support over the past years we are moving forward with the construction and development of our new campus in Kapolei. Recognizing that the new campus will generate additional requirements in areas such as instructional resources, academic advising and, on-campus services over and above a campus allocation scenario, the University Administration has provided UHWO the opportunity to seek additional funding to support its increased growth requirements through one of the President's initiatives.

University of Hawai'i Community Colleges
Vice President John Morton – January 2011

As the State's economy shows signs of improvement, the Community Colleges continue to play a vital role in strengthening the economy by improving the competitiveness of existing industries through workforce enhancement, by diversifying the economic base through initiatives that support new and emerging industries, and by creating opportunities for individuals to improve their employment through education. Community Colleges provide first generation college students, educationally and economically disadvantaged individuals, and under-represented minorities a gateway for upward mobility to skilled jobs and/or baccalaureate education.

The urgent need to support economic recovery efforts has generated a period of extraordinary growth at the Community Colleges. The Fall 2010 credit headcount enrollment for the Community Colleges was 34,203 students an increase of 20.2% over Fall 2008 and a 35.4% increase over Fall 2006. We have relied heavily on the \$6.9 million in Educational Stabilization funds provided by the Legislature to serve these additional students. Continuation of this funding, slated to expire at the end of FY 2011, is essential for the Community Colleges to maintain the classes and support for the expanded enrollment.

The Community Colleges also acknowledge that it is not enough to simply enroll more students, it is essential that we graduate more students. To support the University's Hawai'i Graduation Initiative, the Community Colleges also plan to improve student success in transfer and graduation. Building on our "Achieving the Dream" initiative, we will seek to improve student readiness through developmental education, student retention, strategic planning, and financial aid for students. We are willing to be held accountable for and funded only on our success and support the proposed outcomes based funding model.

Community Colleges are also active players in redefining the Hawai'i workforce. We have been and will continue to be leaders in green job creation, technical education for emerging fields like biotechnology, modern agriculture, digital media, while at the same time providing education for traditional jobs in trade and technical fields, health, and culinary and hospitality education.

The Community Colleges have aggressively embarked on a program focused on energy efficiency and renewable energy projects on all of our campuses. To demonstrate our commitment to this goal we have self-financed these projects through performance contracts and renewable energy projects. The Community Colleges also remain committed to addressing repair, renewal and replacement needs. Repairs and maintenance funds are critically needed each year to properly maintain a safe and healthy learning environment.

The Community College system remains steadfast in its commitment to "being a part of the solution" during these very challenging economic times.

Honolulu Community College
Chancellor Michael Rota – January 2011

Honolulu Community College (HCC) is a comprehensive community college that features a rigorous liberal arts program and a wide array of professional, career, and technical programs designed to meet the State's need for a specialized workforce. Hawai'i's aging workforce, particularly in fields related to HCC's mix of programs, and the business community's increased dependence on specialized technologies, means that Hawai'i's future economic success is becoming increasingly dependent on the success of HCC to educate and train individuals to enter the workforce and to renew the skills of the incumbent workforce.

The College, established in 1920 as the Territorial Trade School, is now experiencing the largest credit enrollment (4,725) in the last decade, an increase of nearly 13% from fall 2005. Focused on the success of all students, especially Native Hawaiians, and the fundamental industries we serve, the College has effectively managed the increased enrollment because of the availability of targeted enrollment growth funds, administered by the Office of the Vice President for Community Colleges as well as federal ARRA funds that partially off-set the reduction in State appropriated funds. These funds have provided the necessary support to meet our increased enrollment by adding 133 course sections in high student demand areas since FY07. The federal ARRA funds to the College totaled \$1,123,463 in FY10, and \$1,081,644 in FY11; this funding ends June 30, 2011. If this level of funding is not restored, we will not be able to offer the level of classes required to meet our current enrollment.

As is the case with all Hawai'i's community colleges, HCC is focused on dealing with the underprepared student population, the majority of new entrants at the College. As one of the highest priorities on campus, initiatives such as acquiring additional financial aid for students, designing and implementing more effective developmental curricula, and providing focused student service programs are in the implementation stages.

During the FY2011-13 Biennium, HCC is seeking additional support to strengthen and upgrade two programs, MELE and Diesel. In response to a unique workforce development opportunity, the College established the Music Entertainment Learning Experience (MELE) program in partnership with Belmont University in Nashville, Tennessee. The program was started with a mix of federal grant funds, federal ARRA funds, and has been supplemented by private donations from individuals associated with the Hawaii music industry; however, the federal funding ends June 30, 2011. The official launch of the program started in fall 2008 with 64 student registrations and has grown to 127 student registrations in fall 2010. As part of the BOR Budget, we are requesting 2.0 positions and \$161,736 in FY12 and 3.0 positions and \$317,080 in FY13 to continue the operation of this highly successful and important new program. The Diesel program is in need of additional support staff and specialized supplies and equipment to meet the industry required NATEF certification. As part of the BOR Budget we are requesting 1.0 position and \$69,392 in FY12, and 1.0 position and \$89,392 in FY13.

The instructional core of the College has been located on the same site since 1920, a site that last built a major facility in 1979. The College is near completion of a new Facilities Master Plan, is in the final stages of design for a new Advanced Technology Training Center (ATTC), and is about to embark on a major renovation to a 65,000 square foot six story classroom/library building that is expected to last three years. As the technology training center of the Pacific, the College will utilize the future ATTC to further develop specialized skills training for the workforce. The Center will also provide up to date science facilities to promote more STEM related areas of study. Supporting STEM related fields of study and the coordination of academic planning across the University of Hawai'i system is imperative for our workforce to remain competitive and cutting edge. The BOR CIP request includes funding of \$36,393,000 for construction in the second year of the Biennium.

Kapi'olani Community College
Chancellor Leon Richards

Kapi'olani Community College's Fall 2010 credit headcount was 9,446 students, a 23% increase over the 7,656 students enrolled in the Fall 2007. Over the same three-year period, the enrollment of Native Hawaiian students has out-paced the general population: an increase of 31%, from 1,176 to 1,552. To meet the overall surge in enrollment, we have added additional sections of classes, extended our schedule of course offerings to the late afternoon, and increased the number of online and hybrid courses offered. We anticipate this past fall's increase to follow through to a record spring 2011 enrollment of 9,206 students.

We believe that Kapi'olani is well positioned to continue to be a campus in high demand for students entering higher education for several reasons. We are committed to increasing our online course offerings to 30% of the total by 2015. With this commitment comes the need to develop faculty expertise in integrating technology for engaged student learning, which the College has done through a Title III-funded Laulima Online Training Academy. The professional development has begun to pay dividends: in Spring 2010, the success rate in online classes was slightly higher than in traditional classes (0.29%). Clearly, the College needs to do more to support online course delivery; hence, one of our program change requests (PCR) is to establish a Center for Distance Education Learning and Teaching Assistance (DELTA).

While online instruction is a major emphasis, we are also committed to supporting faculty in integrating emerging technologies into other realms of instruction and support to promote successful student learning. The College has developed a model that integrates institutional effectiveness measures (focused on student achievement) with high impact educational practices. The implementation of the model is attested in the redesign of our approach to professional development, from episodic, stand-alone workshops to sustained faculty engagement in communities of practice, with support from Title III. Title III and Carl Perkins funds have been used to support faculty in the Vanguard project, dedicated to improving success in gatekeeper courses, i.e. those with high enrollment and low success. The College is seeking funding to support these efforts in its second PCR, Transforming Kapi'olani's Curricular and Professional Development Programs by Applying Emerging Technologies.

We continue to focus our endeavors on student engagement and success, especially for Native Hawaiians, through innovations such as (1) academic academies, where English and math courses are situated in courses that introduce students to majors; (2) accelerated English courses, where developmental and college-level courses are completed in a single semester, only one of the innovations developed as a result of the College's selection to participate in the Global Skills for College Completion project funded by the Gates Foundation; (3) offering developmental math instruction through an emporium model; (4) scholarships, opportunities for undergraduate research, and peer mentoring in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) courses through funding from the National Science Foundation. We have integrated the accelerated approach into the STEM program in our third PCR, the Hawai'i Accelerated Graduation Initiative in STEM. In addition, we have increased access to baccalaureate programs through degree pathways in partnership with the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (Ka'ie'ie, May 2007), University of Hawai'i – West O'ahu (Mananawai, December 2007) and University of Hawai'i Hilo (Ho'oimi, May 2006, revised January 2010).

The increase in tuition revenue together with the ARRA funding and supplemental funding from the enrollment growth appropriation help to offset the reduction in general funds. Without the ARRA support and enrollment growth supplementation, the college will be hard pressed to meet the demand for services related to the increase in enrollment.

In September, the University of Hawai'i Board of Regents approved in principle, Kapi'olani Community College's long range development plan (LRDP). The approved LRDP was the culmination of over a year's work, with substantive input from campus and community stakeholders. The college will now begin the process of obtaining the requisite permits to implement the plan. The college welcomes the opportunity to further discuss the plan and share our vision with you at your request.

Leeward Community College
Chancellor Manny Cabral – January 2011

In its 42-year history, LeeCC, including its Wai'anae campus, has grown to be the 3rd largest of the 10-campus UH system with a record Fall 2010 student enrollment of nearly 8,000 students. LeeCC has been able to address the continuing surge in enrollment through creative scheduling, maximizing facilities use, the expansion of our distance education programs and hybrid-course delivery and the support of the legislature with enrollment growth funding.

In addressing the UH President's Hawai'i Graduation Initiative, LeeCC has thrown its support to innovative faculty and staff. For example, the college formed a new Student Success Committee as a result of the International First Year Experience held on Maui supported by ARRA funds this past summer 2010. In addition, the college was one of 38 two-year institutions nationwide selected by the National Center for Academic Transformation to participate in *Changing the Equation*, a newly funded program of \$2.3 million supported by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. This grant has allowed LeeCC to completely redesign its remedial/developmental math offerings.

As of Fall 2010, LeeCC has the largest number of undergraduate students of Hawaiian ancestry with 2,075 students among the ten UH campuses or nearly 25% of its current student population. In support of native Hawaiian student success, LeeCC has its Ke Ala 'Ike Native Hawaiian Excellence Program and Ho'oulu Native Hawaiian Career and Technical Program. The college continues to expand valuable community partnerships with Native Hawaiian serving organizations such as MA'O Organic Farms, Mālama Learning Center, Queen Liliu'okalani Children's Center, Nā Pua Noe'au, the office of Hawaiian Affairs and ALU LIKE, INC., to name a few.

The second largest student ethnic group at LeeCC of about 1,718 students is Filipino, comprising approximately 22% of the student population. The "Sulong-Aral" program supported by new federal funding addresses increasing Filipino student achievement, particularly as it relates to successful completion rates at LeeCC and transfer rates to the UH four-year campuses.

Our Teacher Education (AAT) program continues to flourish. The enrollment has grown more than sixteen-fold from 24 students in the fall of 2006 to over 400 students in the Fall of 2010. Construction funding for the "shovel-ready" 22,000 square foot Teacher Education Building is the College's and the UHCC system's number one priority for major CIP projects.

LeeCC is in a 3-phase facilities implementation plan for its Wai'anae Education Center campus: Investigation, Acquisition and Renovation. If all goes as planned, the College hopes to have a ribbon cutting ceremony for a newly renovated facility by Fall 2012.

The impact of the rail system on our campus (the first UH Campus to have a transit stop) cannot be overestimated. Construction is expected to start on the rail project in 2011, which will include a dedicated LeeCC Rail Station. Vehicular and pedestrian access to the College continues to be problematic as the need for the Second Access Road and roadway improvements to Ala 'Ike are of critical importance for the health and safety of the campus community.

Infrastructure funding will be a critical need for LeeCC upon the departure of the UHWO from Pearl City to Kapolei, expected to be completed by Fall 2012. LeeCC will require additional funding support to address the janitorial, maintenance, and utility cost needs associated with the UHWO facilities.

Windward Community College
Chancellor Douglas Dykstra - January 2011

Five years of unprecedeted enrollment growth has produced 53% growth with 2625 students. The Enrollment Growth Funding initiative is critical to this growth because without it Windward would never have been able to afford the adjunct faculty to teach the additional entry level course offerings. Enrollment figures are also accommodated by support for the *Hawai‘i Graduation Initiative* to promote persistence to graduation. The college employs learning communities in gatekeeper courses; supplemental instructional services for courses with high attrition rates; and two-day Frosh Camp orientation for incoming students along with a 118% increase in the number of financial aid recipients in the past four years. Data reflect the success of the foregoing measures with 23% higher rates of persistence by students who attend Frosh Camp, a 36% higher rate of successful course completion by students who attend supplemental instruction, and 3.4% above target for the number of Windward graduates.

The college is now able to bring significant faculty support to its Developmental Education offerings due to the recent discontinuation of a non-credit program that had experienced seven years of serious enrollment declines. Veteran faculty members from that program have been re-assigned to staff separate Developmental Math and Developmental English Writing Labs to support a 150% increase in Developmental course offerings since the base year of 2007.

The college strongly supports the *Achieving the Dream* system wide initiative to promote enrollment, persistence and graduation of Native Hawaiian (NH) students. To date the college is 39% above the enrollment target; 108% above target for Pell Grant dollars; 52% above target for transfers to UH baccalaureate campuses; and 14% above target for NH graduates.

The college requests \$2.7 million CIP to renovate Na‘auao building which houses a tutoring center as well as faculty offices. The Alaka‘i building CIP (\$4.1 million) provides interior design improvements to a building that houses administrative, student support, and institutional research offices along with four classrooms. Finally, the year-two La‘akea and No‘eau CIP renovations (\$4.382 million altogether) will provide faculty office and classroom space.

The college requests two *Program Change Requests* (PCR) including one to fund a Veterinarian faculty for an **Associate of Science Degree in Veterinary Technology**. This field is one of the five fastest growing occupations in the country (e.g., 29,000 openings expected nationally by 2016) and it shows promise to be offered by this college state-wide using distance delivery techniques. Additionally, the college requests funding for a Plant Molecular faculty and a Laboratory Technician to expand existing Academic Subject Certificates into **Certificate of Achievement programs in Plant Biotechnology and Ethno-pharmacognosy**. The college has a track record of success in placing students into jobs and sending them to national/international conferences in these fields. The proposed curricular upgrades are intended to better tailor this course of study to the needs of an industry that includes 2296 farms, 250 plant nurseries and 45 biotech companies locally.

Hawai'i Community College
Interim Chancellor Noreen Yamane – January 2011

Weathering through these rough economic times, Hawai'i Community College has experienced an unprecedented growth of 16.5% (Fall 2010), the highest in the University System to provide educational opportunities for students to pursue academic achievement, provide training to develop a skilled workforce, and support economic development. In the past ten years, HawCC enrollment grew from 2090 to 3815 students dramatically increasing the need for additional space and updated facilities in both East and West Hawai'i. Currently, the enrollment for Spring 2011 is 3137, up by 12% over Spring 2010. To support this level of growth and to play a key role in building Hawai'i's educational and economic future, HawCC has relied on ARRA educational stabilization funds for our course offerings in remedial/ developmental education and in our certificates and degree programs.

HawCC is committed to the President's Graduation Initiative by improving access to every segment of our community. We have streamlined the financial aid process, as well as increase support services to students completing the FAFSA and financial aid advising. As a result, the Financial Aid Office was able to significantly increase the number and amount of Pell awards, and drastically reduce the default rate. We offer the Compass Placement Test to high school students on their home campus through our Compass Mobile Unit. We utilize distance learning technologies to offer classes via ITV (Interactive TV), Video conferencing, and web based instruction to students in rural communities. To provide high quality instruction, HawCC has received funding from the Rural Development Program (RDP) to upgrade its video conferencing capability to high definition in West Hawai'i, Waimea and Honokaa. As the use of technology becomes even more critical in the College's ability to service a large geographical area, the College is requesting three positions in Computer and Media Support Services to enhance distance education venues for CTE Programs.

To enhance the pipeline to higher education, HawCC has proposed ***Lehua Lei O Hilo***, an automatic admissions process. Lehua Lei O Hilo is a collaborative effort between the State DOE and UH-HawCC to encourage our high school students and our community to see college as an automatic "next-step." By streamlining the process and eliminating the need to submit an application, we hope to clear the way between high school and college.

With twenty five certificate and degree programs, the College is committed to providing a skilled workforce to meet industry demands. HawCC's newest programs are the Digital Media Arts Program and the Fire Science Program. Through support from RDP, the College has begun the development of a Certificate Program in Refrigeration and Air Conditioning (RAC) and will be able to provide the community with training in energy conservation and sustainability.

The College has over 40% native/part-hawaiian students and has demonstrated its commitment to increase the success rate of this population through initiatives like Achieving the Dream and Title III funding.

The College has made a strong commitment to a Kauhale model in which each person contributes measurably to the success of our College's mission and outcomes. Kauhale unites all components of Hawai'i Community College into an "academic village without walls" in the spirit of *E 'Imi Pono* (seeking excellence). We appreciate the support of our Legislature to help our learners and our communities achieve their goals to become productive citizens in our global economy.

UH Maui College
Chancellor Clyde Sakamoto – January 2011

In response to Maui County's high unemployment rates, socio-economic challenges, history of appropriately prepared and trained nonresidents appointed to the more highly compensated positions, being the lowest general-funded higher education county on a per capita basis, and Lumina Foundation's 2010 report indicating Maui County with the lowest percentage of two or four-year degree graduates of any county in the state, UH Maui College continues to focus its resources on workforce training and programs that will support sustainable wage careers in emerging and high demand sectors.

In 2010, UH Maui College (formerly Maui Community College) transferred its accreditation from the WASC Junior (Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges) to the WASC Senior (Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities) Commission to comply with both Commissions' requirements. This transfer, along with the name change, allows the college to continue its open admissions to lower division technical and general education associate degrees while permitting the expansion of four-year degrees to meet needs and opportunities in Maui County. UHMC is planning its third bachelor's degree in sustainable sciences management.

UHMC has experienced unprecedented enrollment growth. Since Fall 2008, the Fall 2010 enrollment of 4,367 represents a 33% growth. The Spring 2011 enrollment currently exceeds Spring 2010 by another 8% with registrations still occurring. As a result, the ARRA restoration is essential to continue support for enrollment growth.

As part of the UHCC System-wide Achieving the Dream initiative, UHMC continues to emphasize Native Hawaiian student success by enhancing peer and new online tutoring, completing a new Hawaiian Student Success facility, and mandating student participation in the First and Second Year Experience programs to help students move from developmental to college level courses, then to career exploration and employment. With a ten percent increase in student persistence from last Spring '10 to Fall '10, UHMC expects Native Hawaiian and other student retention, persistence and graduation rates to meet UH System Graduation Initiative Goals.

To continue to meet its tri-isle student demand and expansion, UHMC has aggressively pursued extramural support to expand its Allied Health and STEM programs along with adding professional staff to redesign face-to-face courses into hybrid or totally on-line learning environments. Since this funding will end, the college requests State support to continue its critical workforce development programs and services.

With the legislature's assistance, the college continues to upgrade its physical plant and additional construction funds are requested to renovate the old Science building to repurpose the out-dated facility to support the expanding Allied Health program.

As the only institution in the County of Maui representing the University of Hawai'i System, UH Maui College seeks support to accommodate the increasing higher learning demands and strengthen the economic health of our tri-isle region.

Kaua'i Community College
Chancellor Helen Cox – January 2011

Enrollment at Kaua'i Community College has grown an average of 11% each fall since 2008. This great news presents challenges as the College provides classes and support services for more students with reduced budgets. \$271,227 of ARRA funding has helped to offset budget cuts; however, when these funds expire it will be difficult to accommodate the higher enrollments appropriately.

The College strongly supports the Hawai'i Graduation Initiative. To achieve its graduation outcomes, the College has increased financial aid outreach to students and parents; begun mandatory advising for new, probationary and basic skills students; added peer tutors in math, science and English; adopted an Early Alert System for struggling students, and created a College Success Center to help underprepared students. Native Hawaiians accounted for 28.9% of fall 2010 enrollment, and the percentage of eligible Native Hawaiian students who receive Pell Grants climbed from 73 to 81% in the last year. Tutored Native Hawaiian students had an 83% success rate in gatekeeper courses compared to those non-tutored at 54%.

To increase access and success, the College partnered with K-12 and the National Tropical Botanical Garden on a Science Teacher Enrichment Program to develop STEM curriculum, and began the Wai'ale'ale Program providing financial assistance and wrap-around services to financially constrained students. These and other interventions, as well as dedicated faculty and staff, led to a growth in overall enrollment, Native Hawaiian enrollment, degrees and certificates of achievement awarded, and the number of transfers to UH 4-year institutions.

Kaua'i Community College has requested additional funds from the legislature in three areas: Facilities Engineering Technology (FENG), Plant Bioscience Technology, and Automotive Technology. To meet the demands for jobs in green building and alternative energy systems, Kauai CC's growing FENG program needs an additional faculty member, professional development and equipment. The Kauai County Jobs Report predicts strong jobs growth in this area, and Kauai's new energy standards will require retraining of the current workforce.

The addition of a fulltime faculty member will enable the Plant Bioscience Technology Program to prepare students for jobs in horticulture, agriculture, pest management, propagation/micro-propagation techniques and crop improvement. Employers as diverse as Pioneer, Syngenta, the County of Kaua'i, National Tropical Botanical Garden and Hawai'i Bioenergy expect to hire.

The College's Automotive Technology Program is working towards the National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) certification in order to improve, expand and modernize. The program has doubled in enrollment since 2008 but has insufficient budget for equipment replacement and support staff to properly operate at NATEF standards.

Kaua'i Community College provides access and success for students, prepares the workforce for today and tomorrow and assists the County to create an economically, socially and environmentally sustainable future. I sincerely thank the Legislature for your support in helping us lead effectively and wisely.

Mission Statement

Hawai'i Revised Statutes 304A-102 states:

The purposes of the university are to give thorough instruction and conduct research in, and disseminate knowledge of, agriculture, mechanic arts, mathematical, physical, natural, economic, political, and social sciences, languages, literature, history, philosophy, and such other branches of advanced learning as the board of regents from time to time may prescribe and to give such military instruction as the board of regents may prescribe and that the federal government requires.

Functioning as a system, the purposes of the University of Hawai'i are to:

- Provide all qualified people in Hawai'i with equal opportunity for high quality college and university education and training.
- Provide a variety of entry points into a comprehensive set of postsecondary educational offerings, allowing flexibility for students to move within the system to meet individual educational and professional goals.
- Advance missions that promote distinctive pathways to excellence, differentially emphasizing instruction, research, and service while fostering a cohesive response to state needs and participation in the global community.

As the only public higher education institution in Hawai'i, the UH System bears a special responsibility to prepare a highly educated citizenry. In addition, the System supports the creation of quality jobs and the preparation of an educated workforce to fill them. Building on a strong liberal arts foundation, the UH System prepares the full array of workers from technicians, physicians, and scientists to artists, teachers, and marketing specialists—who are needed in a technologically advanced and culturally diverse island state.







Impact of Furlough and Reduction in Force

As indicated previously, the University's general fund appropriations were reduced by approximately \$98 million in FY10 and \$108 million in FY11. Rather than furloughs, as implemented by the rest of the state, UH negotiated pay reductions coupled with paid leave during non-instructional periods (Thanksgiving, Christmas and Spring breaks). This allowed UH to achieve a similar financial effect to furloughs, without reducing instructional days. As reflected previously, in addition to salary reductions, ARRA funding and the elimination of faculty payroll lags also helped to deal with the general fund reductions. However, a significant amount of the reduction remains, which is being addressed by each campus as follows.

University of Hawai'i at Mānoa – UOH 100 and UOH 881

UH Mānoa last semester enrolled 20,337 students – a diverse group representing 50 states and about 100 nations, and the largest concentration of students on any campus in Hawai'i.

UH Manoa's total budget cut was \$69.4M in FY 11 (a 28% reduction in general funds). Of this amount, \$14.7M was addressed by Federal Stabilization Funds and \$14.2M in temporary employee salary reductions. To address the remaining \$40.5M in budgetary reductions for our campus, UH Mānoa focused on developing a prioritization process which would support our core academic and research mission. We initiated improved infrastructure and efficiencies to strategically use our limited resources more effectively and redirected approximately \$10M in new tuition revenues to meet the remaining budget shortfall.

Maintaining priorities. In order to retain focus on achieving our performance outcomes, we imposed smaller cuts for our core teaching units in Arts & Sciences while eliminating under-enrolled certificate programs and majors. In addition, we protected funding for a limited number of campus priorities (our newly created School of Hawaiian Knowledge, repairs & maintenance, and Campus Security).

Implementing cost-saving efficiencies. The campus restricted the filling of positions, reduced the number of lecturers by over 300 hundred positions; reduced other temporary staff, as well as increased class size. We cancelled several hundred lightly enrolled classes, and moved existing faculty to more key gateway courses. We have identified and continue to monitor high-demand courses and continue to shift teaching personnel to meet changing demands. In addition, campus units have reviewed their mission and vision statements and outlined objectives with assessment to ensure ongoing and continual feedback on operations.

Additional administrative savings were achieved by consolidating the Academy for Creative Media into the College of Arts & Humanities, Industrial Relations Center into Library Services, Population Studies into the Office of Public Health, enrollment management into

the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Students, the Conference Center into Auxiliary Enterprises, and the Office of Environmental Health and Safety under the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research and Graduate Education. The campus Duplicating Services office was eliminated. Separate mid-year commencement ceremonies for undergraduate and advanced degree recipients were combined into a single ceremony. Accomplishing Energy savings. We continue to aggressively expand our energy conservation efforts. Mānoa has reduced its energy usage by 20% and is on track to meet the goal of reducing campus energy use by 50% by 2015. Investment in major infrastructure improvements, such as updating the campus chilled water loop system and replacing old, inefficient chillers with highly efficient state-of-the-art magnetic bearing systems has resulted in substantial energy savings. It is also important to note that the entire campus supported our Mānoa Green Days initiative under which we successfully closed 20 of our campus buildings during the winter holidays - saving over 177,000 kilowatt hours of electricity: <http://www.manoa.hawaii.edu/facilities/mgd>

Academic initiatives. We are strengthening our partnership with UH community colleges to encourage their students to transition to a four-year campus through improved articulation and recruitment efforts. We've also implemented new initiatives on reverse transfer (enabling students to receive associate degrees while attending UH Mānoa) and automatic admission (granting admission to students with UH associate degrees).

With existing resources, we established offices for Mānoa Assessment and Institutional Research – they provide valuable statistics to help us understand the strengths and weaknesses of our efforts to promote student learning and attract more students, and research information on our peer institutions.

Educating students. UH Mānoa has maintained student enrollment at the 20,000-plus level, in part due to improved student recruitment efforts and implementing easier on-line applications. Marketing has increased through television commercials developed and produced by our own ACM alumni and featuring UHM faculty, staff, and students: <http://manoa.hawaii.edu/about/multimedia/>

We seek to improve educational access and success of underrepresented populations – Native Hawaiian, Filipino and Pacific Islander – through increased financial aid, outreach programs such as the College Opportunities Program - <http://www.hawaii.edu/cop/>, and other initiatives.

We advance workforce development in critically needed areas through a number of ways: for example, the College of Engineering encourages STEM studies in its outreach to public schools - <http://www.eng.hawaii.edu/prospective-students/college-events/events-for-middle-and-high-school-students/>;

the School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene leads the State Consortium on Nursing - <http://www.nursing.hawaii.edu/>; and the John A. Burns School of Medicine encourages economically disadvantaged students through its Imi Hoola program - <http://jabsom.hawaii.edu/JABSOM/departments/intro.php?departmentid=64>

Optimizing facility use. Tapping campus expertise in architecture, engineering, environmental management and other areas, the Design Advisory Panel and the Campus Facilities Planning Board were formed to provide input and advice to ensure optimal use of campus space in line with the University's Long Range Development Plan. A process has been established for new buildings and major renovations to be reviewed and approved by the Campus Facilities Planning Board to ensure proper energy efficiencies and sustainable features are maximized. This will help to ensure that operational costs are manageable.

Under the direction of our Campus Planning Office and Center for Smart Building and Community Design, our graduate students launched a building information management platform which provides real time information on operations, occupancies, costs, and energy usage of campus facilities. This database will also provide us valuable quantitative information in the development of our indirect cost recovery proposal.

Leading sustainability. We launched our campus sustainability website, Malama Honua - <http://manoa.hawaii.edu/chancellor/sustainability/index.html> and established regular meetings of the UH Mānoa Sustainability Corps. These two programs work as central repositories of best-practice information and provide the campus community with opportunities for engagement around issues of campus and environmental sustainability. Having a central site and forum for on-going dialogue has improved sustainability efforts by forging mutual endeavors between campus and community groups, increasing efficiency and results.

Serving as an economic engine. UH Mānoa's research enterprise has brought in more than \$227M for the first six months of this fiscal year. Despite difficult economic times, both at the Federal and State levels, this is an increase of about 4% over last year at this time and contributes directly towards advancing the state's economy through innovation, technologies, and job creation.

UH Mānoa is a major generator of educated citizens, new knowledge, and a work force resource for the state – every state dollar invested in UH Mānoa creates \$5.34 in expenditures: http://www.manoa.hawaii.edu/about/facts/files/UHM_impact_2007.pdf

University of Hawai'i at Hilo – UOH 210 and UOH 220

UH Hilo's total budget cut was \$7.8M for FY11. Of this amount, \$300K was addressed by Federal Stabilization funds and \$2M in temporary employee salary reductions. The remaining \$5.5M in reductions was addressed by deferring the filling of both instructional

and non-instructional positions, reducing funding allocations (except for health and safety areas) and utilizing increased tuition revenues.

UH Hilo has taken many steps to ameliorate the negative impact of the furlough reductions on our students and academic programs. Despite these steps, there has been an impact on our operations. In general, our academic programs continue to offer students courses they need to fulfill degree requirements, however, some of the course offerings are being offered less frequently, and this will not be sustainable in the long run without increasing time to degree for our students. Support services which are critical to student academic success also have been curtailed. Academic programs in the sciences are especially a concern, where sharply rising student demand has increased costs for laboratory instructors and supplies.

To strive to provide high quality education to an increasing number of students, UH Hilo has taken the following actions:

- Our Long Range Budget Planning Committee has encouraged innovative budget efficiencies ranging from updating light fixtures to reducing energy consumption and consolidating service agreements. For example, we recently equipped a residence hall cafeteria to also serve as a large-capacity classroom during certain hours of the day. Similarly, we merged all of our various academic support services into one center and consolidated existing medical and counseling services into one unit to reduce overhead.
- Our Enrollment Management Implementation Team (EMIT) led efforts to offer fewer classes to more students in Falls of 2009 and 2010, with a higher seat fill-rate. We also generated more student semester hours. EMIT monitors and manages recruitment, admissions and registration efforts to generate incremental, manageable enrollment increases so that we can balance the University budget with tuition revenue.
- Many position vacancies, both instructional and non-instructional, have not been filled across the campus.
- Priorities of expenditures have taken place within units in order to best achieve departmental goals.

Impacts to UH Hilo and our students are described below:

- Enrollment and the number of students applying for financial aid, on-campus student housing and admission has increased. However, the additional tuition generated from increased enrollment has been used to offset some of the reductions imposed on the campus. UH Hilo is unable to offer the array and # of classes that students need to keep up with this growth and unable to fill positions that are crucial in responding to the needs of our current and potential students.
- The number of student registrations is higher by 13%, creating increased demands on our dwindling student services unit to respond to the need.
- Because of our enrollment jump, most recently in the College of Pharmacy unit, the total number of courses has increased; however, our undergraduate course offerings

have decreased due to budget reductions and lack of resources to offer all needed courses despite increased student demand.

- Average class size has increased for undergraduate classes.
- The fill rate (an efficiency measure based on seats filled in a classroom) has increased to 82% which shows we are being highly efficient in how we schedule and offer classes that we do offer. It would be challenging to increase fill rates any higher.
- The availability of advising appointments for students has been reduced resulting in an increase in wait time for our students for advising appointments. Advisor workloads have also increased.
- Delays in processing of business transactions.
- Significant increase in financial aid requests from students (up by 33%) increasing financial aid process wait time.
- Increase in wait time to process maintenance work orders. Decrease in amount of office and classroom cleaning because of staff shortages and decreases in maintenance and operations services to the campus.
- Increase in the # and types of complaints regarding janitorial, maintenance, and grounds operations due to short staffing and less customer service being able to be provided.
- We are delaying and/or eliminating the purchases of replacement equipment, supplies and services. Annual maintenance of instructional equipment (microscopes, spectrometers, chromatograph, etc) has been suspended.
- Many vehicles have not been replaced so students are unable to fully utilize the “natural laboratory” available on the Big Island.

UH Hilo is still a growing, developing campus. Our enrollment reached an all-time high of 4,079 in Fall 2010 – a 55% increase since Fall 1997. Increases in student population generate increased demand for amenities, activities, programs and services. At UH Hilo, with a large proportion of students who are economically disadvantaged, first generation in college, and/or from underrepresented minority groups, the need for these services is great. At a time when we should be adding functions and departments to complete our campus in academic, administrative and student affairs areas, we are instead cutting back, refraining from filling needed staff/faculty positions, or deferring services that would enhance student learning and the student experience but are not necessarily critical or essential to safety, health, institutional liability, etc. If the current economic downturn continues, the quality of our instructional and student support services will be impeded, our commitment to excellence will be more difficult to maintain, and our ability to meet our performance goals may be impacted.

University of Hawai'i – West Oahu – UOH 700

- Reduction/restriction in general funds has necessitated greater reliance on tuition and fees revenue to cover personnel and operating costs

- Increased commitment of tuition and fees revenue to cover operating costs restricts the campus' ability to roll out new academic programs and campus initiatives
 - Restricts ability to hire full-time faculty
 - Constrains course offerings
- Campus units have been required to restrict spending
 - Restricts ability to hire faculty and support staff
 - Impacts level of support services available to students, faculty
 - Reduces marketing allocation
 - Restricts ability to secure additional temporary facilities to service enrollment growth
 - Restricts purchase and replacement of classroom and support furnishing and equipment to service campus needs
 - Restricts travel for professional development which impacts faculty tenure and staff development
- Hiring
 - Filling retired faculty position with lecturers to meet instructional requirements
 - Increasing course loads of faculty and lecturers to teach more courses and course sections
- Alternatives to Delivering Campus Priorities
 - Doubling up on office space and utilizing conference rooms/faculty lounge as classrooms
 - Increasing on-line (in-class and online offerings)
 - Cancelling low enrolled elective courses that do not impact specific degree requirements
 - Cross-registering students with Leeward Community College in general education courses

University of Hawai'i Community Colleges – UOH 800

As indicated previously, the pay reductions implemented by the University only partially offset the total budget reductions. At the community colleges, ARRA educational stabilization funding has been critical in coping with unprecedented enrollment growth (35.4% over Fall 2006). However, salary reductions and ARRA funding did not cover the reduction in general fund appropriations. In meeting the remaining mandated general fund budget reductions, strategic planning and established strategic outcomes continued to guide the execution of the budget. This process sought to protect strategic areas of concern such as Native Hawaiian student success, remedial/developmental education, and various workforce shortage areas identified in the strategic outcomes. A painstaking and meticulous prioritization process allowed Community College campuses to sustain course offerings while providing continued support of outcome driven initiatives such as the Hawaii Graduation Initiative.

To meet the remaining budget reduction, the following cost-saving efficiencies were implemented:

1. Reduced funding allocations for programs such as the Construction Academy.
2. Filling of vacant positions were limited to mission critical areas.
 - a) Civil service positions could not be filled due to the Governor's freeze.
 - b) Deferred the filling of non-instructional positions.
 - c) Kept certain faculty positions vacant and hired lecturers to address record enrollment increases.
3. Targeted reductions in areas that would not directly impact achievement of strategic plan goals and key outcome measures.
4. Partially offset reductions using increased tuition revenues due to enrollment growth.

University of Hawai'i Systemwide Programs – UOH 900

The Systemwide programs support all 10 campuses in areas of Academic Planning, Academic Policy, Financial Management Services, Internal Audit, Legal Affairs, Risk Management, Capital Improvement Projects, and Information Technology Services. Support is provided to the campuses in these areas in instances of litigation, audits, facilities management, new capital projects, facilitating faculty across campuses in academics, Board of Regents meetings, technology support and infrastructure, and fiscal matters. The impact to program ID UOH900 of the reduction in general fund appropriations has been significant. In order to meet the Systemwide support units' reduced budget, the System has had to reduce the operating budget for each program area, freeze vacant positions and delay hiring of other positions to realize salary savings, and utilize other sources of funds to supplement the general fund shortage. The reduction has also impacted support for the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education which enables Hawai'i students to enroll in selected professional programs in other member states when such programs are not available in Hawai'i. The reductions impact the level of service we are able to provide other University departments and campuses and the public, and ultimately impact students.

Capital Improvements Program Budget Request

The Governor’s Recommended Executive Capital Improvements Program (CIP) Budget for Fiscal Biennium 2011-2013 includes three projects for the University of Hawai‘i totaling \$70.000 million in State general obligation bonds. This CIP budget was formulated by the previous State Administration, which provided \$35.000 million in each of the two fiscal years of the biennium. The \$70.000 million partially finances three Systemwide CIP projects.

The three projects included in the Governor’s Recommended Executive CIP Budget meet the goals and objectives of the University’s Strategic Plan by maintaining and improving campus structures to promote a nurturing learning and working environment. Table Rs for the three projects are attached (pages 2-4). Also provided for your information is a worksheet comparing the Board of Regents’ CIP Budget with the Governor’s Recommended Executive CIP Budget (pages 5). Additionally, details of the Board of Regents’ CIP Budget for Fiscal Biennium 2011-2013 is attached (pages 6-31). The Regents’ CIP Budget totals \$719.557 million for twenty-six high priority projects.

Proposed Lapse of CIP Projects

The Governor’s Executive CIP Budget includes the lapse of one project appropriated by Act 180, Session Laws of Hawai‘i 2010, Item G-102, for \$23.825 million for Maui College’s New Science Building. Act 180, Session Laws of Hawai‘i 2010, lapsed and reauthorized \$23.825 million from Act 158/2008 (Item G-127.02) due to bid protest; however, the protest was resolved prior to June 30, 2010, and the University encumbered the amount subject to lapse.

Having a separate project adjustment fund will enable the University to control surplus or unrequired general obligation bond funds for University of Hawai‘i projects.

Should this project be deferred, the result would be the continued reliance on the Governor's Project Adjustment Fund, which does not guarantee that unrequired funds from University projects would be used for University of Hawai‘i CIP projects.

d. Discuss what improvements will take place when project is completed (including benefits to be derived and/or deficiencies this project intends to correct)

This project will enable the transfer of unrequired balances to University projects that require additional funding.














