Chair Waters and Members of the Committee:

The purpose of HB 2040 is to create the Senator Hiram L. Fong scholarship program to be administered by the University of Hawai'i. The program is to provide financial support for students enrolled at any campus of the University of Hawai'i. The amount to be awarded to a student shall be determined by the Board of Regents. The Bill provides that \$200,000 for fiscal year 2006-2007 is to be appropriated from the general revenues of the State and transferred into the Senator Hiram L. Fong scholarship program.

The University supports the intent of this bill provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact priorities as indicated in our Board of Regents approved Executive Supplemental Budget. The University requests that the bill be amended to reflect that appropriated funds be deposited in the University's Student Scholarship and Support Special Fund.
